Mr. Evers,

This letter responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated 21 February 2020, received by the Information Management Office (IMO) of the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) on 24 February 2020, in which you requested *"all unclassified email communications (email messages, email attachments, complete email chains, calendar invitations) sent by former Director of National Intelligence Dan Coats regarding (a) Ukraine, including but not limited to U.S. military assistance to Ukraine or any Ukrainian government officials such as President Zelensky, (b) the president's personal attorney Rudolph Giuliani, or (c) any matter related to former Vice President Joseph Biden, his son Hunter Biden, or Burisma."*

Your request was processed under the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. After a thorough search in our records and databases, we were unable to locate any records responsive to your request.

Your appeal must be postmarked or electronically transmitted within 90 days of the date of this letter.
