Dear Mr. Evers:

This is in response to the portion of the above referenced Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request involving emails from 14 BOP Officials using 36 search terms.

This is the thirtieth and final rolling release of emails.

For this rolling release, we are releasing 70 pages of records, which were sent for consultations. Of these 70 pages, 4 pages are appropriate for release in full, and 66 pages are appropriate for release in part. Copies of releasable records are attached.

Please note BOP has now processed all emails in response to this request.

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, records were redacted under the following exemptions:

(b)(5): Permits withholding information under the deliberative process privilege, including the pre-decisional documents, or information that could be withheld under civil discovery, attorney-client, or attorney-work product privileges.

New Mexico has expanded its capability for COVID-19 testing from the NMDOH's Scientific Laboratory to now include additional laboratories. As of March 13, 5000 tests could be administered. Drive through testing was established in Lovelace with estimates of 750 testing kits.

established in Lovelace with estimates of 750 testing kits.

Drive-thru testing is being worked in several cities (includes: Dallas/Ft Worth, San Antonio, Austin, Houston, El Paso, Amarillo areas) across TX in order to increase access to testing and decrease wait time for results. Initially, testing will primarily be focused on medical workers, first responders, and persons over 60 who are symptomatic.

TX Governor directed the Texas Medical Board and the Texas Board of Nursing to fast-track temporary licensing of out-of-state physicians, physician assistants, certain retired physicians, nurses, and other license types to assist in Texas' response to COVID-19.

Louisiana Dept of Health is working with GOHSEP and other partners on possible sheltering options. They are monitoring current homeless housing situations.

Three drive-thru testing sites are open in Albuquerque and will remain open as long as testing kits are available. New Mexico is seeing shortages in blood supply. - Is there a quarantine period for all new intakes into a facility? If so, how long?
 - ERO has encouraged that new intake is cohorted for 14 days before entering general population.
 - Individuals with high epidemiologic risks (traveled from high-risk country within the last 14 days) are medically isolated before being cleared.
- After a detainee is symptomatic or has a positive test, are they isolated from the population?
 - Yes. Then the pod in which they were detained is cohorted separately for 14 days.
- Is the facility performing additional surface cleaning on high use surfaces, including those in the courtroom?
 - Yes. ERO has increased cleaning procedures throughout each facility. However, after a pod has been cohorted, there's an extensive GSA-approved cleaning that takes place afterwards.
