Dear Mr. Evers:

This is further to our letter dated 30 April 2020 and is also a final response concerning your 28 April 2020 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for:

1. **Records sufficient to identify number of accounts, owners of accounts, and number of searches for each account for any Clearview AI, Inc. product, including free trial accounts.**
2. **Any security, privacy, or performance audit, impact assessment, bias assessment, or other evaluation of any software or hardware contracted, purchased, trialed, or otherwise received from Clearview AI, Inc., for all CIA accounts.**
3. **Any guidance documents, training materials, policies, procedures, or instructions detailing data privacy policies for any software or hardware contracted, purchased, trialed, or otherwise received from Clearview AI, Inc.**
4. **Any guidance documents, training materials, policies, procedures, or instructions on how personnel should operate any software or hardware contracted, purchased, trialed, or otherwise received from Clearview AI, Inc.**
5. **Any guidance documents, training materials, policies, procedures, or instructions regarding the review and oversight from any software or hardware contracted, purchased, trialed, or otherwise received from Clearview AI, Inc.**
6. **Any contracts, requests for proposals, or solicitations between CIA and Clearview AI, Inc.**
7. **Any marketing or promotional materials received from Clearview AI, Inc., including informational materials exchanged during sales discussions or other conversations with Clearview AI, Inc.**

The timeframe requested was January 1, 2018 through the date of search.

We completed a thorough review of your request and determined that in accordance with Section 3.6(a) of Executive Order 13526, the CIA can neither confirm nor deny the existence or nonexistence of records responsive to your request. The fact of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself currently and properly classified and is intelligence sources and methods information protected from disclosure by Section 6 of the CIA Act of 1949, as amended, and

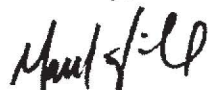
Section 102A(i)(1) of the National Security Act of 1947, as amended. Therefore, your request is denied pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1) and (b)(3). As the CIA Information and Privacy Coordinator, I am the CIA official responsible for this determination. You may appeal this response to the Agency Release Panel, in my care, within 90 days from the date of this letter. Please include the basis of your appeal.

Please be advised that you may seek dispute resolution services from the CIA's FOIA Public Liaison or from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) of the National Archives and Records Administration. OGIS offers mediation services to help resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies. Please note, contacting CIA's FOIA Public Liaison or OGIS does not affect your right to pursue an administrative appeal.
