Re: Final Response for Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request No. 2020-OGC-03737-F

Dear Mr. Evers:

This is the Departmental FOIA Office's (DFO) final response to the above-referenced FOIA request. The request was submitted to the DFO and to the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS). The DFO is processing Item 1 of the request, which seeks:

Any final analysis, assessments, evaluations, or similar reports or documents prepared by your agency's staff that evaluate the effects of (a) narrowing the conditions under which the agency would waive, when requested by states, the able-bodied adult without dependents (ABAWD) time limits in certain areas, or (b) limiting carryover of ABAWD discretionary exemptions.

Your request was processed under the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552.

Searches for responsive Outlook and Skype records for the General Counsel and the Deputy Assistant General Counsel for the Office of the General Counsel's (OGC) International Affairs, Food Assistance & Farm and Rural Programs (FAIR) Division were conducted by the OGC's telecommunications provider, the Client Experience Center (CEC). The CEC provides comprehensive, fee-for-service information technology (IT) associated operations, security, and technical support services to USDA end users, as well as implements and manages enterprise IT solutions for users Department-wide. No responsive records were located as a result of the searches.

Upon further inquiry, the Deputy Assistant General Counsel for OGC-FAIR referred the DFO to an attorney-advisor within FAIR. Per the Deputy Assistant General Counsel for OGC-FAIR, if any records should exist, the FAIR attorney-advisor would be the proper custodian. The FAIR attorney-advisor performed a search. The search did not result in any responsive records. Subsequently, additional searches for the attorney-advisor's Outlook and Skype accounts were performed by the CEC. No responsive records were identified as a result of those searches.

You may appeal this response by email at USDAFOIA@usda.gov. Your appeal must be in writing, and it must be received electronically no later than 90 calendar days from the date of this letter. The OGC will not consider appeals received after the 90 calendar-day limit. Appeals

received after 5:00 p.m. EST will be considered received the next business day. The appeal should include the FOIA tracking number listed above, a copy of the original request, the DFO's response to your original request, and a statement explaining the basis of your appeal. For quickest possible handling, the subject line of your email should be marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." You should also reference FOIA No. 2020-OGC-03737-F.
