Good Afternoon NEMA State Directors –

Yesterday, the White House released their budget request for FY21. A summary of the key points related to DHS and FEMA are attached. This will be going out shortly to all NEMA members, but I wanted to ensure you had a printable version as well.

There is a lot in this budget that will be cause for discussion in the coming months, but it's important to remember the old adage that "The President proposes, and Congress disposes." Even when only one political party is involved, it is very rare for a final Appropriations bill to mirror the request, so we will be actively engaging with Congress and stakeholders throughout the coming process to ensure our priorities are heard. To that end, we will be providing a great deal of information over the coming months, especially in preparation for the Mid-Year Forum, to arm you with everything you need to engage with your Congressional delegation.

As you review this memo, please feel free to let me or Lauren know if you require additional detail on justifications or proposals. The administration budget for FEMA alone is hundreds of pages long and spread-out over multiple documents, so providing direct links is nearly impossible. We are happy to conduct any of that research for you.

Subject: California PG&E Power Outages

Many have heard of the efforts of PG&E to mitigate the potential of power lines sparking any wild fires in California. The VHA Watch has been tracking the developments and we have stood up the EMCC here in Martinsburg. OEM is working closely with V21/V22 and will provide a report once we have all the best information. Here are the actions up to this point:

Current status:

- Power shut down in the designated areas are due to begin on 10/9/19 for NOCAL
- There may also be some shut downs for the SOCAL area beginning 10/10/19
- There are estimates that over 30,000 medical facilities will be impacted
- The EMCC has identified those VA facilities in NOCAL and SOCAL that PG&E has indicated will be impacted and we have provided that list to V21 and V22 Area Emergency Managers
- We are coordinating with KCER to ensure we are prepared to address any ESRD issues that may occur with community centers and our contracted patients
- We will work with V21/V22 to address any unmet needs that we identify

5 **CURRENT SITUATION:**

- a California Pacific Gas & Electric on Monday, 7 October 2019 announced a potential power shutoff this week for a large area of Northern California that could affect over 5 million customers in parts of 29 of 58 counties this week to prevent power lines and equipment from sparking wildfires.
- b The counties currently listed but not limited to: Alameda, Alpine, Amador, Butte, Calaveras, Colusa, Contra Costa, El Dorado, Glenn, Lake, Mariposa, Mendocino, Napa, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, San Joaquin, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Shasta, Sierra, Solano, Sonoma, Stanislaus, Tehama, Tuolumne, Yolo, Yuba.
- c PG&E's website says: "The most likely electric lines to be considered for a public safety power outage will be those that pass through areas that have been designated at elevated or extreme risk for wildfire." Adjacent communities could also be affected, even if they aren't designated at those risk levels.
- d Outages could last several days. Customers may be without: TV's, cell phones, refrigeration, medical support equipment, air conditioning, lights, computers, ATMs. No local shelters in the listed counties have been established or

identified at this time.

- e PG&E's preemptive shutdowns including transmission lines, are in response to the company's taking cautious operational approach following last year's Camp Fire. The company agreed to pay \$11 billion to insurance companies for the devastation that resulted from the blaze in Paradise, CA, and other Northern California cities and counties in 2017 and 2018 after Cal Fire found PG&E equipment at fault.

Special note: PG&E cannot simply turn power back on when the weather improves. Crews must first conduct safety inspections on foot and via cars, trucks or helicopter to check for any damaged equipment, which could delay restoration.

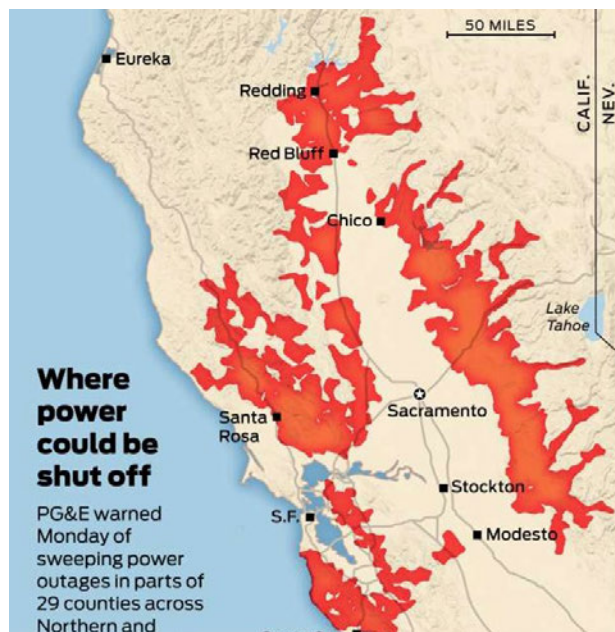

A concern for AZ is if SOCAL starts shutting down lines; most of the power exchange between AZ and CA goes through SOCAL and then northward to NOCAL/PG&E. Anytime power distribution is manipulated there is an increased chance of a grid perturbation and a power surge incident, which can cause power generators to trip offline to protect the generation equipment. PVGS recently installed additional 'surge reactors' in the SRP switchyard (located at PVGS) to absorb grid surge incidents which helps prevent a PVGS Unit trip and also provides better western grid stabilization. They act as a power 'shock absorber'. CA has surge reactors on their end of the grid also. Given that PV Unit 3 is down for an outage, some of the surge absorption may not be available making the grid a little more sensitive to a perturbation. Note: large-size generators provide the capacity to absorb grid disturbances/perturbations whereas smaller generators are incapable of doing so.

Governor and Senior Staff,

Thank you for all of your hard work and partnership regarding the All-of-America effort to respond to, prepare for, and mitigate the effects of COVID-19. I wanted to follow-up on a few things from Thursday's briefing between the President, Vice President, and Governors.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has activated the National Response Coordination Center (NRCC) 24/7, and they are engaging 50+ teams to deploy across the U.S. to activate their emergency operations centers and address the threat of COVID-19. FEMA regional directors have been actively working the phones.

- **Action Request:** Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has activated the National Response Coordination Center (NRCC) 24/7 and is now the lead agency to make formal Federal requests. Your State's strong leadership is needed to provide effective emergency management that is: (1) Locally-executed, (2) State-managed, and (3) Federally-supported.
 - Local leaders are the "boots on the ground" and are best suited to **quickly identify innovative solutions** for the majority of issues.
 - State officials are best situated to **help coordinate these solutions** both across the state and with the Federal government.
 - The Federal government helps scale best practices, coordinates key priorities, and provides regulatory flexibilities and key resources to **support these solutions**.
- **What This Means:** All requests to the Federal government **must be formally communicated** by your **State emergency manager** to your **FEMA Regional Administrator**. This is the same process as natural disasters (e.g., hurricane recovery, flood recovery, tornado recovery, etc.). Reminding your team that if they are not utilizing the connectivity between the state operations center and the FEMA team, they aren't doing right – the good news most folks are now utilizing this path and with your help, we can all ensure effective processes elevate key priorities and questions. In particular, please ensure good connectivity between your state public health director and your state emergency manager.
- **Contact Information:** Contact information for your FEMA Regional Administrator is attached – we imagine your emergency manager has them on speed dial.
- **Testing:** If you have not yet connected with the representatives from Roche, Thermo Fisher, and other private sector testing platforms, I would encourage you to do so as that is where the high-speed testing solution is moving forward.

Sound emergency management discipline will allow all of us to have unity of effort and have a real-time understanding of all the key resources in each community and across each State.

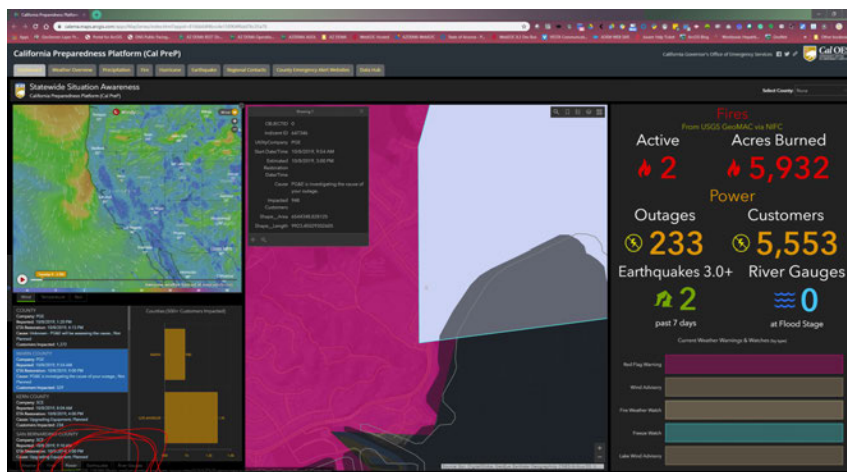

Special note: PG&E cannot simply turn power back on when the weather improves. Crews must first conduct safety inspections on foot and via cars, trucks or helicopter to check for any damaged equipment, which could delay restoration.
