Dear Mr. Evers:

This is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), dated April 30, 2020, and received by this office on May 1, 2020. You are seeking:

1. All calendars or calendar entries for Rear Adm. John Polowczyk, including any calendars maintained on behalf of Rear Adm. Polowczyk, from February 15, 2020 to the date the search is conducted.
2. All email communications (including email messages, complete email chains, email attachments, calendar invitations) sent by the government officials specified below containing any of the following key terms:

- a. Rear Adm. John Polowczyk, and anyone serving as his Chief of Staff or Deputy in his role on the FEMA Supply Chain Task Force.
- b. Anyone serving as Chief of Staff or Deputy to Rear Adm. Polowczyk, on FEMA's Supply Chain Taskforce.

Part 5 § 5.5(e)(2). Your envelope and letter should be marked "FOIA Appeal." Copies of the FOIA and DHS FOIA regulations are available at www.dhs.gov/foia.

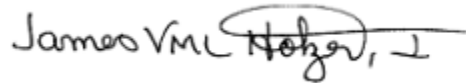
To further assist you with your request, DHS recommends you submit your FOIA request to the Department of Defense (DOD) for the records being sought.

Additionally, you have a right to right to seek dispute resolution services from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) which mediates disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a non-exclusive alternative to litigation. If you are requesting access to your own records (which is considered a Privacy Act request), you should know that OGIS does not have the authority to handle requests made under the Privacy Act of 1974.
