Dear Ms. Rasheed,

This letter responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) dated and received in this office on May 1, 2020, and assigned tracking number 2020-350. Your request seeks communications “between (1) Brian Miller of the White House Counsel’s Office and (2) the following agency officials: i. Anyone serving in the capacity of chief counsel or legal advisor, or their deputies; ii. Anyone serving in the capacity of White House liaison or advisor, or their deputies; iii. Anyone serving as agency point of contact for matters related to the presidential impeachment inquiry or trial” from September 24, 2019 through February 5, 2020. Specifically, you seek “records to shed light on the circumstances surrounding ... President Trump’s dismissals of inspectors general.”

We apologize for the delay in responding to your FOIA request.
