This letter is the initial agency decision to your July 28, 2020, request under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552, submitted to the Department of Veterans Affairs, FOIA Service requesting “All calendars and calendar entries for the agency officials listed below, including any calendars maintained on their behalf, reflecting events that took place from January 1, 2020 to the date the search is conducted”. The specific calendars that you are seeking pertain to the following:

- a. Secretary Robert Wilkie;
- b. Acting Deputy Secretary Pamela J. Powers; and,
- c. Acting Chief of Staff Brooks D. Tucker.

Your request was referred to and received by the VA Office of the Secretary (OSVA) on August 7, 2020. As indicated in their September 28, 2020 letter, the OSVA referred eighty-two (82) pages of records to the Veterans Health Administration (VHA) Central Office FOIA Office for further processing and direct response to you, therefore no additional searches were completed. Your FOIA request was received in my office on September 29, 2020.

After a review of the referred documents was completed, it was determined that no portions of the requested records have been withheld either in whole or in part. All information is provided in its entirety. This concludes VHA’s response to your FOIA request.

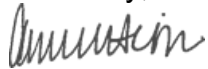

Bottom Line Up Front

- VHA request is **\$105.1 billion** for FY 2022
 - \$15.2 billion (16.9 percent) above FY 2021 Budget
 - \$10.9 billion for “second bite” above 2022 Advance Appropriation (AA)
- Majority of the increase projected by the Enrollee Health Care Projection Model (EHCPM) developed in conjunction with Milliman
 - Advance Appropriation (AA) based on Base Year (BY) 18 model
 - “Second Bite” above AA based on BY 19 model
- Largest programmatic increases outside of the model are for capital programs (non-recurring maintenance, equipment, leases, and activations)
- VHA and Milliman are still estimating the impacts of the COVID pandemic on 2022 requirements; these impacts could further increase the request

Risks

- The EHCPM has not yet adjusted for how the COVID pandemic may impact health care reliance and demand
- The EHCPM does not reflect updated unemployment projections, as OMB has not released economic assumptions since November 2019
- The collections estimate has not been refreshed since last budget cycle
- The request assumes continuation of the current VA practice of recording community care obligations at the time of payment
- The final 2021 enacted appropriation could drive additional requirements
- OMB directed VA to allocate the entire “Recurring Expenses Transformation Fund” (estimated at \$867 M) for VHA requirements in 2022
- The 2022 Advance Appropriation severely underfunds NRM and Equipment

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Legislative Proposals

- Net impact of all FY 2022 legislative proposals is a net **decrease of \$22.5 million** below the cost of the legislative proposals requested in the FY 2021 Budget.
- Forty proposals including the following:
 - Supportive services for suicide prevention (+\$18.6M)
 - Extending CHAMPVA to age 26 (+\$94.4M)
 - Multiple pay and continuing education authorities (+\$40.8M)
 - Authorities to improve the seamless transition from active duty (+\$81.2M)
- Several proposals with net savings:
 - Beneficiary Travel Monthly Stipend (\$161.2M savings)
 - VA payment for Medical Foster Home (\$19.2M savings)
 - Regulate pay for hybrid Title 38 and certain Title 5 positions (\$40.7M savings)
 - Authorities to improve collections (\$179M savings – **NOT IN REQUEST**)

- Due to COVID-19, thousands of blood drives in communities across the country have been cancelled as workplaces, schools, and other locations that regularly host them have closed.
- Because volunteer donors are the only source of blood and blood products necessary to treat trauma and other chronic illnesses, this has resulted in an ongoing national shortage.
- As a leader in health care, VA has an obligation to step forward to offer this support to our country. This is the time to do our part as an organization and as individuals – for the greater good.
- VA is partnering with the Red Cross and other local blood centers to sponsor blood drives at VA medical centers nationwide.
- This effort builds on local employee blood drives already underway at VA facilities across the country
- It also demonstrates our “fourth mission” to back up the nation’s health system and serve our fellow citizens in times of crisis.
- VA facilities are asked to volunteer to host blood drives only after determining that it will not impact Veteran care.
