Subject: Records regarding Operation Legend

Dear Mr. Evers,

The United States Marshals Service (USMS) is responding to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request pertaining to all records reflecting any order, directive, guidance, or memorandum (including informal direction distributed to your agency's officers, agents, or members) regarding the implementation of Operation Legend; and all records reflecting any order, directive, guidance, or memorandum (including informal direction distributed to your agency's officers, agents, or members) describing any strategy by which deployments associated with Operation Legend will reduce violent crime in targeted cities.

Pursuant to your request, the USMS conducted a search and located 25 pages of responsive documentation. These pages are released to you with portions withheld pursuant to Exemptions (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(E) and (b)(7)(F) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b).

FOIA Exemption (b)(6) allows an agency to withhold personnel, medical, and similar files, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Records that apply to or describe a particular individual, including investigative records, qualify as "personnel," "medical," or "similar files" under Exemption 6. FOIA Exemption (b)(7)(C) protects records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes to the extent that the production of such records or information could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. A discretionary release of such records is not appropriate. See United States Department of Justice (DOJ) v. Reporters Committee for Freedom of the Press, 489 U.S. 749 (1989). Exemption 7(E) of the Freedom of Information Act affords protection to all law enforcement information that "would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.

Finally, FOIA Exemption (b)(7)(F) protects law enforcement information that "could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual." 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(7)(F) (2006), amended by OPEN Government Act of 2007, Pub. L. No. 110175, 121 Stat. 2524. Courts have routinely upheld the use of Exemption (b)(7)(F) to protect the identities of law enforcement agents, as well as protect the names and identifying information of non-law enforcement federal employees, local law enforcement personnel, and other third persons in connection with particular law enforcement matters. See Rugiero v. DOJ, 257 F.3d 534, 552 (6th Cir. 2001); Johnston v. DOJ, No. 97-2173, 1998 WL 518529, *1 (8th Cir. Aug. 10, 1998).

Accordingly, the personally identifiable information of law enforcement officers and government employees was withheld from the responsive documentation. The disclosure of such sensitive information contained in records compiled for law enforcement purposes to the public could subject law enforcement officers and other government personnel to harassment and unwelcome contact. This could disrupt and impede official agency activity, as well as endanger the safety of law enforcement officials. Additionally, the personally identifiable information of third parties named in the records was withheld. The disclosure of third-party information could constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy and subject the individuals to embarrassment, harassment, and undue public attention. Individuals have a recognized privacy interest in not being publicly associated with law enforcement investigations, not being associated unwarrantedly with alleged criminal activity, and controlling how communications about them are disseminated.

For your information, Congress excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV (2010)). This response is limited to those records that are subject to the requirements of the FOIA. This is a standard notification that is given to all our requesters and should not be taken as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist.

If you are not satisfied with the response to this request, you may administratively appeal by writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy (OIP), United States Department of Justice, Suite 11050, 1425 New York Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20530-0001, or you may submit an appeal through OIP's FOIAonline portal by creating an account on the following web site: <https://foiaonline.regulations.gov/foia/action/public/home>. Your appeal must be postmarked or electronically transmitted within 90 days of the date of my response to your request. If you submit your appeal by mail, both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

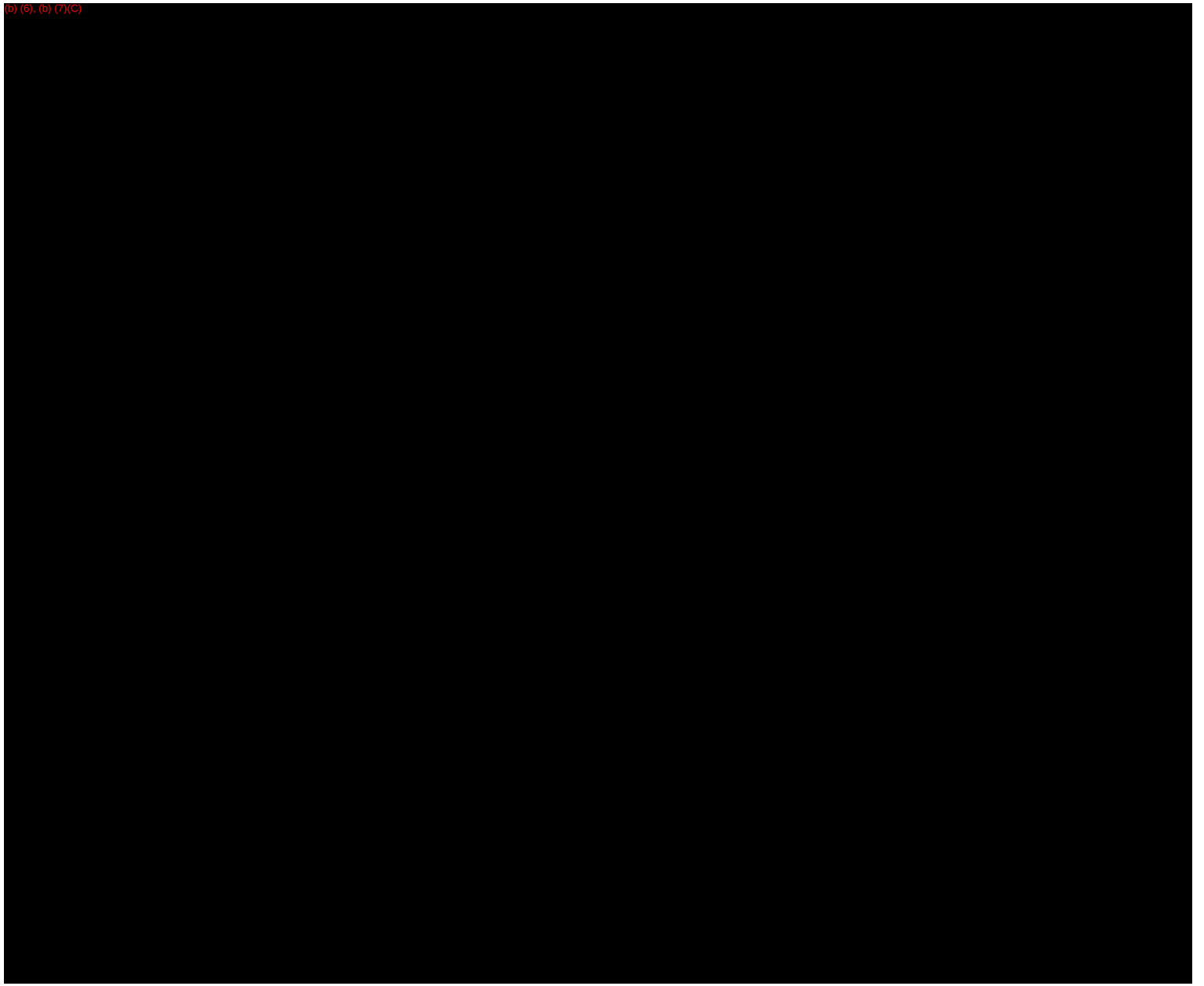

I believe it was the plan to try and consolidate all of the licenses under TODs contract. I think we were waiting for the current contracts to expire and instead of renewing them, we would roll them into TODs contract. We will definitely have to work together and with Intrepid to ensure a smooth transition and avoid any downtime.

The plan forward is that TOD plans on assigning various District/Division POCs to serve as (b) (7)(E) administrators. This will allow them to have access to create new users/channels, and reset password. TOD will notify the POCs and inform them how many account licenses they have, and they will have the flexibility to assign them where they need. If additional licenses are required, TOD will be responsible for modifying the contract to obtain them. TOD will still be the main POC for emergency deployment of (b) (7)(E) accounts. The monetary portion would still need to be worked out between TOD and the other Districts/Divisions. Please let me know if you have any other ideas or suggestions on how to best manage the contract.

I can set up a call between TOD, IOD, and (b) (7)(E) so we can discuss the current contracts, end dates, and the transition plan.

After talking with DAD (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), (b) (7)(F) and Commander (b) (6), (b) (7)(C), (b) (7)(F), I have a clearer picture of the status of IR licenses across the agency. It's quite a patchwork of contracts, with different numbers of licenses and periods of performance.

Is it possible for you to work with your contacts at (b) (7)(E) to see what it would take to consolidate all the USMS IR contracts under the one TOD contract? If it is possible, can it be done without downtime for current users?

Also, if TOD becomes the controlling entity, how will TOD coordinate the adding and removing of IR users?
