Dear Mr. Evers:

This is in response to your request for information under the Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts. You requested a copy of the document with conditions of confinement (or similar conditions) that Paul Manafort signed before being released to home confinement on May 13, 2020 and all responsive records from March 26, 2020 through the date the search is conducted.

A copy of the document with conditions of confinement signed by Paul Manafort is maintained in a Privacy Act protected system of records and requires written authorization from the subject of the record before it can be released. The written authorization must meet the requirements of 28 C.F.R. §16.41(d).

A copy of a document with similar conditions is already available to the public pursuant to the statute. The FOIA allows you to request any records not already required to be made available to the public pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(1) or (a)(2). BOP is not required to release the type of record you seek. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(3). If you are not satisfied with my response to this request, you may administratively appeal by writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy (OIP), United States Department of Justice, 441 G Street, NW, 6th Floor, Washington, DC 20530, or you may submit an appeal through OIP's FOIA STAR portal by creating an account following the instructions on OIP's website: <https://www.justice.gov/oip/submit-and-track-request-or-appeal>. Your appeal must be postmarked or electronically transmitted within 90 days of the date of my response to your request. If you submit your appeal by mail, both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."
