Dear Mr. Morris,

This letter is in response to your Open Records Act request for the following:

1. All email communications (including emails, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and attachments thereto) sent by any of the Office of the Attorney General officials listed below concerning the ability of the Governor or Attorney General to request recounts of statewide ballot measure (aka issue or question election) vote results, including, but not limited to, communications concerning House Bill 2564.

Office of the Attorney General Officials:

- a. Mike Hunter, former Attorney General
- b. John O'Connor, Attorney General
- c. Anyone serving as Chief of Staff to Attorney General O'Connor
- d. Anyone serving as Chief Deputy Attorney General
- e. Anyone serving as General Counsel
- f. Anyone serving as liaison to the Oklahoma Legislature

In an effort to accommodate the Office of the Attorney General and reduce the number of potentially responsive records to be processed and produced, American Oversight has limited request item 1 to emails sent by the listed officials. To be clear, however, American Oversight still requests that complete email chains be produced, displaying both sent and received messages. This means, for example, that both Attorney General O'Connor's response to an email concerning the ability of the Governor to request recounts of statewide ballot measure vote results and the initial received message are responsive to this request and should be produced.

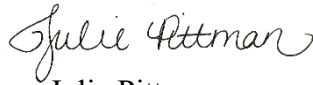
2. All records reflecting any formal or informal directive, order, advisory, guidance, or final analysis regarding the provision of House Bill 2564 referenced in request item 1.

For both items 1 and 2, please provide all responsive records from February 1, 2021, through the date the search is conducted.

The Oklahoma Attorney General's Office has reviewed your request and determined the Office has no documents which are responsive to your request.

This response completed your Open Records Act request to the Oklahoma Attorney General's Office and closes your file.
