Rob Cheng PC Matic 10/14/21 Meeting

Problem: There are no cybersecurity standards (at state, federal, or international level), decentralized cybersecurity leads to security holes.

Solution: Rob wants S.C. to be the first state to build and implement cybersecurity standards that can serve as a model for other states.

Has met with Sym Singh, Palmetto Promise, and SLED

Sym asked Rob to produce a proposal. (Rob was unclear exactly what that proposal needed to be)

Rob wants to donate PC Matic software to critical infrastructure providers throughout the state.

Ask 1: That the AG use RAGA contacts to popularize cybersecurity standards at the state level.
AG promised to do so once standards are implementable.

Ask 2: That the Office of the Attorney General implement PC Matic software (they have a contract with the state but our office doesn't use the software).

Need to discuss with Dennis and Tammie and potentially have them reach out to Rob.

DeLinda: AG wants a call with the Governor's office in the first two weeks of November to discuss proposed standards.

AG wants Rob's email added to his contacts.

Thank you for your email and thank you for interest and commitment in combating human trafficking in South Carolina. I have made combatting human trafficking a priority since becoming Attorney General and I truly appreciate citizens who recognize it as a real problem in our state.

Also, I am committed to defending the Constitution and the rule of law in our state. As you are already aware, I led a letter with 23 other state AGs to President Biden warning him that his vaccine mandate is unlawful and if he implements rules to effectuate that executive order we will all defend our states and its citizens. I am currently in discussions with staff in my office as well as other AG offices about this very subject.

Thank you so much for this response. Graham made no mention that he had any intention to protect the rights of citizens last Saturday. He merely said to get a lawyer as he urged us to get an injection while he talked in circles.

I knew you stated you intended to sue if this passed. My concern is that our elected representatives prefer to profit from this bill putting citizens at further risk while the intended legal action takes its course after it passes. It will pass because this state and many others want the tax payer money that they can repurpose however they wish (which are Graham's words regarding Gov. McMaster's intention with the 250 million in COVID money built into the Bill for SC).

Additionally, many employees are currently acting on the continued censorship of facts and media/Biden bait and switch (i.e., false statement that the BioTech biologic – only one in circulation – was fully approved; use of OSHA language that is not official/approved; false statements that these are not investigational drugs). I understand what is being said, however, nothing is currently being done. I noticed you both months ago that Summerville PD forced 3 officers who didn't want to take the shot to resign or go to a different station. I have a dear friend/fighter friend who was told he would have to undergo psychiatric care for his view of the shot and was forced to resign. Nurses at MUSC were fired. We have law enforcement friends who are experiencing severe side effects because they were coerced into getting this shot. This is how we treat our state heroes? You do nothing. How do you justify, per the Nurse Moberg Code, no knows being coerced and blackmailed into a medical procedure that is investigational and authorized under an "emergency" with zero informed consent, no product inserts, and no discussion of the damages caused by these shots? Who is anyone but a personal doctor to recommend medical procedures? How do you justify what employers are doing, including that which is being done to your own state's employees? This is a very real situation for your state and I am not easily pacified.

So, please help us NOW, not later. The damage has been done and the dominoes continue to fall.

If you cannot and will not do anything to help your citizens, *do you have a list of constitutional and discrimination lawyers who will take up our cause (class action suits against the state and private entities) that we can distribute?*

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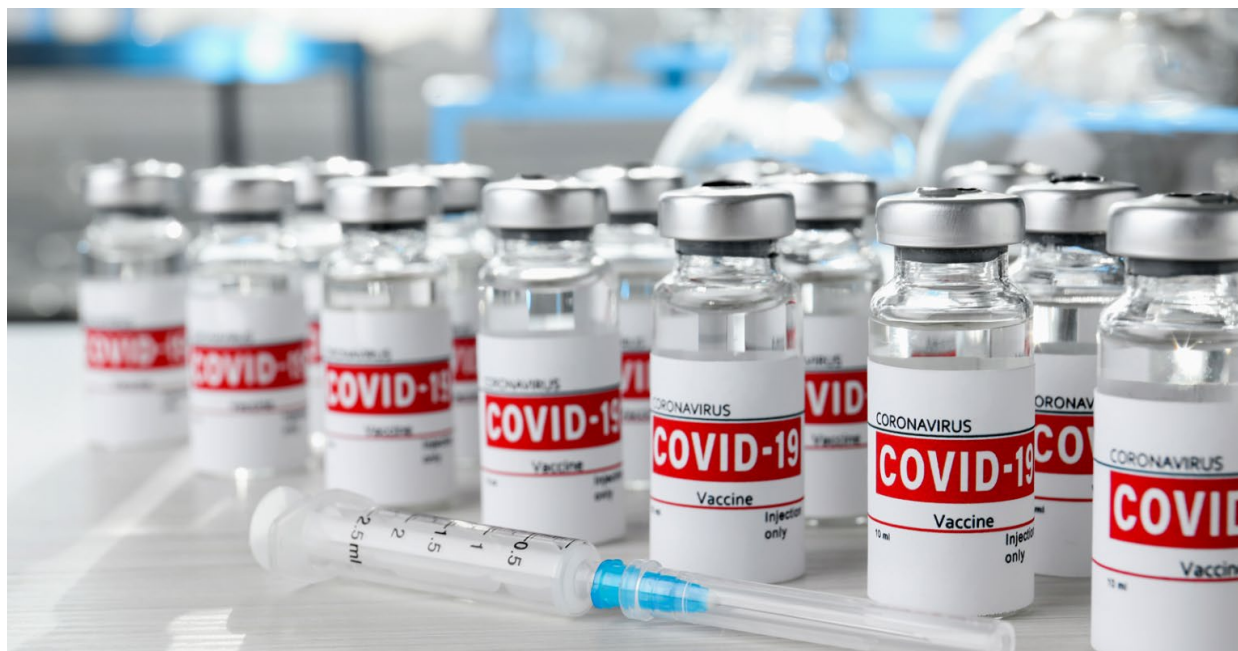

Per the EUA language, products are not approved and may or may not be effective:

EUA candidate products include medical products and uses that are not approved, cleared, or licensed under sections 505, 510(k), and 515 of the FD&C Act or section 351 of the PHS Act.

Medical products that may be considered for an EUA are those that "may be effective" to prevent, diagnose, or treat serious or life-threatening diseases or conditions that can be caused by a CBRN agent(s) identified in the HHS Secretary's declaration of emergency or threat of emergency under section 564(b). Potential EUA products also include those that may be effective to mitigate a disease or condition caused by an FDA-regulated product (including a product authorized for emergency use under section 564 or an approved product) used to diagnose, treat, or prevent a disease or condition caused by a CBRN agent.

The "may be effective" standard for EUAs provides for a lower level of evidence than the "effectiveness" standard that FDA uses for product approvals.⁴⁴ FDA intends to assess the potential effectiveness of a possible EUA product on a case-by-case basis using a risk-benefit analysis, as explained below. If, based on the totality of the scientific evidence available, it is reasonable to believe that the product may be effective for the specified use, FDA may authorize its emergency use, provided that other statutory criteria for issuing an EUA also are met.

If any of the above is alarming to you, you may ask, "How are the vaccine companies exempt from liability?" Ultimately, it is the contract between countries and Pfizer. [America's Frontline Doctors](#) just released the contents of a contract between Pfizer and Brazil stating that Pfizer is not liable for any damages because of the vaccine and, even if there are any viable treatments for COVID-19, countries cannot void the contract. The contract also states that Pfizer will stipulate the number of doses to be given to individuals, not any other entity, and that they are "exempt" from laws.

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Of 514 patients in Israel hospitalized with COVID-19 as of Aug. 15, 59 percent were fully vaccinated, according to an Aug. 16 article from Science that cited national data tracked by Israel's largest health management organization. The figures suggest breakthrough infections may be more common than the term implies, the report suggests.

Most of the vaccinated patients who were hospitalized, about 87 percent, were at least 60 years old.

"This is a very clear warning sign for the rest of the world," said Ron Balcer, CEO at Citi Health Services, Israel's largest health maintenance organization. "If it can happen here, it can probably happen anywhere," he told Science.

Dear Commission on Judicial Conduct,

Charles Vance Stricklin Jr, Bar No. 6943, DOB [REDACTED] Columbia, SC 29209-1947; 803 [REDACTED] sc811@scag.gov is legally incompetent, mentally deficient, and unfit to judge as an official in South Carolina. Vance Stricklin has intercepted numerous communications which were not to him, which were not addressed to him, and which he had no right to steal and take from the parties of whom said communications were intended. For years, I have tried to communicate with the Clerk of Court at the Richland County Court House where Vance Stricklin works. Vance Stricklin then steals these communications to the Clerk of Court, says that they are to him, and denies the actions I have requested to the Richland County Clerk of Court. This is shown in Exhibit A. These instructions contain immensely important details, like my legal address, please stop using the false addresses given to the court by my ex-wife and her paramour, the people in your court room are lying about my address, phone number, email, and even my representation in court, please file my communications and do not discard them. Instead of completing these instructions, Vance Stricklin steals my instructions to other parties, such that none of the instructions are followed.

For years, Vance Stricklin has been holding ex parte communications inside and outside of courtrooms with my ex-wife Brook Yancey and her paramour Brian Dumas. I have requested all materials, communications, motions, pleadings, evidence, and everything else that Vance Stricklin has held with the other parties, without me present, my attorney, nor any other representative of mine present. Vance Stricklin has refused to give to me any of these ex parte communications he has continuously for years with Brook Yancey and Brian Dumas. I have previously filed complaints of judicial misconduct with this office against Vance Stricklin. These complaints have gone to your office and to other government officials in South Carolina involving similar criminal acts conducted by Vance Stricklin, Brook Yancey, and Brian Dumas. Again, Vance Stricklin intercepted these complaints, claimed that they are to him, and reported to said South Carolina government officials to discard my judicial misconduct complaints against him. This is shown in Exhibit B.

Vance Stricklin is presiding over multiple court cases in South Carolina involving my ex-spouse Brook Yancey and her paramour Brian Dumas. I have no attorney. I have no representation. Vance Stricklin says that anything that I send to the Richland County Court House for my court cases, is somehow ex parte communications with him. This is not only foolhardy and ridiculous. These actions by Vance Stricklin show a man that is legally incompetent, mentally deficient, and incapable of presiding as a judge or any official in South Carolina. Vance Stricklin must immediately be removed from his office, disbarred for his actions of misconduct, his blatant disregard for the rule of law, and his corruption in working with opposing parties for his benefit and the benefit of those parties.

What I actually sent to Vance Stricklin regarding his abuses and misconduct is shown in Exhibit C. I left this in a voicemail and email as Vance Stricklin's office or anyone else at the Richland County Court House refuses to answer their phones or respond to any form of communication be it US Mail, fax, or email. The letter I received from Vance Stricklin is contained in Exhibit D, which shows what Vance Stricklin said I sent him.

Vance Stricklin has worked for years with Brook Yancey and Brian Dumas to state that my legal address is that of any relative I have in the State of South Carolina. My family members have no ability either by means, cost, nor energy to forward any mail sent erroneously to them and not myself for years time. I have gone to great lengths to correct this with my valid, legal address and method of communication not only with Brook Yancey and Brian Dumas, but also with Vance Stricklin and the Richland County Court House. For years, not only have Brook Yancey and Brian Dumas refused to acknowledge any address of correspondence outside the State of South Carolina, with where I actually reside in Arizona, but Vance Stricklin reportedly refuses a change of address by his mental inadequacies and disregard for law. My own family members live in fear not only from Brook Yancey and Brian Dumas, but also Vance Stricklin as they have harassed, menaced, abused, and threatened my family members in South Carolina with harm and injury on numerous occasions.

To state again, I have never communicated with Vance Stricklin either directly nor indirectly. Yet Vance Stricklin claims that I have communicated with him? Perhaps Vance Stricklin also believes that aliens are also speaking to him at this very moment? I have never met Vance Stricklin nor have I ever spoken to him nor been in his presence. How else could such communications occur? I've never talked to him on the telephone or any long distance communications. Yet Vance Stricklin claims to have been communicating with me, and yet these communications are "ex parte" communications unlawful to the court. Apparently Vance Stricklin is either legally incompetent, judicially corrupt, or mentally deficient in his faculties. Ex parte means from the latin "for one party". Vance Stricklin has no idea what this means. Because for years, Vance Stricklin has been communicating directly and indirectly, in person, talking, with multiple appearances both the opposing party and opposing counsel, without me present, without my attorney present, and without any representative of mine present.

That Vance Stricklin is what the law means by ex parte, who is either a morally bankrupt criminal or an ignorant buffoon. In either case, Vance Stricklin is unqualified to serve in his position. Vance Stricklin is a menace to society. Vance Stricklin should be immediately apprehended and institutionalized because he is a raving lunatic. Communications addressed to other individuals are not addressed to Vance Stricklin. That seems common sense, Vance Stricklin lacks common sense. Vance Stricklin does not have the authority to steal my communications to other individuals and say that they are for him; that not only is a grave usurpation of his authority, it is corruption, and it is interference with the United States Postal Service, a federal offense. It is also a crime to steal other people's communications per eavesdropping and wiretapping laws. Vance Stricklin was not the recipient of any of those communications. Vance Stricklin refuses to allow any clerk or government employee in South Carolina to make known my actual address and allow communications from the court to be received by me. Oh, and I'm still waiting on the past years of Vance Stricklin's ex parte communications with the opposing party and opposing counsel because Vance Stricklin is selling every employee in South Carolina not to give to me nor anyone I hire any information about my court case.

It is likely that Vance Stricklin is receiving compensation in the form of drugs, sex, and money from Brian Dumas. Brian Dumas is a pimp of prostitutes and whores, a drug addict, and head of a criminal organization. Vance Stricklin is likely receiving sex services, snorting cocaine, and accepting bribes from Brian Dumas to do his bidding. Vance Stricklin is abusing my children, covering up domestic violence, neglect, and assault. We take this opportunity to advise you of the limited role of this office and the Commission so that you will be aware that we cannot provide you with assistance or advice. You should promptly seek assistance or advice that you might need from legal counsel or other sources. If you do not have an attorney and believe that you need one, you should contact the South Carolina Bar Lawyer Referral Service at 1(800) 868-2284.

You will be notified of the final disposition of your complaint. It is often many months after receipt of a complaint before a final decision is made. In the meantime, feel free to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

- Attaching the wrong file to an email e.g. client A information being sent to Client B
- Adding the wrong recipient to an email (thanks Autocomplete!)
- Replying to sophisticated spear phishing attacks that pass through inbound boundary filters.
- Malicious or negligent data exfiltration (partners sending client details to their personal email addresses

With DLP rules being static, these incidents have historically been near impossible to detect & prevent.

- ESG/Shareholder Activism – Proposal by the SEC to increase climate change related disclosures from regulated companies, asking whether current standards adequately informed investors and the public on climate change. Republican AGs sent a letter to the SEC opposing this proposal, led by West Virginia.

Course Description

The Office of State Attorney General (AGO) has evolved greatly over time and has gained importance in recent decades. This is true within the states/territories in which they function but more so in relation to other legal and policy actors nationally and even internationally. Virtually every public policy issue today has a legal component that falls within the purview of the state Attorneys General (AGs). This seminar, which focuses on the public practice of law, addresses the unique role of the Attorney General (AG) in our legal system; the powers and duties of the AGO; the complexities of the role as the state's chief legal officer, including the political dynamics that have made AGs into the political force they are today; the oft-competing perspectives of AG work within the broader context of law and policy; and the role of AGs on national issues today.

Throughout the semester, lectures and class discussion will focus on many current state AG issues, highlight legal authority and examine emerging legal issues. The course begins with an overview of the culture, legal authority, and optics of the AGO, followed by a survey of the law and related issues pertaining to jurisdiction, powers, duties, staff responsibilities, and AGs role in state government and on the national stage. The focus is on the public practice of law through the viewpoint of the state AG. Particular attention is paid to perspectives on federalism and the ever-changing landscape of state-federal relationships.

Current AGs and top staff are invited to guest lecture, offering their insights on the role and work of AGs. These speakers will engage directly with students, thus affording an opportunity to become acquainted, to dialogue about legal issues of concern, and often, to provide some advice about public service careers and choices made along the way.

Case studies will focus on an array of topics related to the role of AGs throughout the semester including cybercrime, protection of public health and safety (including COVID-19), medicinal/recreational marijuana, criminal justice reform, multistate investigations in consumer protection, role of outside counsel, and more

partisan actions when Republican and Democratic AGs file litigation. With a new administration, recent AG multistate actions against Facebook and Google, the pending multistate Opioid litigation, to name but a few, 2021 promises a continued highlight on the power of AGs, with a big impact on individual lives, the economy, the law, and our nation's standing in the world.

Prof. Blake, former Chief Deputy Attorney General for Colorado, is currently the General Counsel for the Attorney General Alliance (AGA) and Conference of Western Attorneys General (CWAG). It is expected that students will research and understand the powers and duties of their AG; and that actions and significant initiatives will be monitored weekly, to be presented with a very brief (3-5 minutes) report at the beginning of each class, focused on the Powers and Responsibilities chapter assignment and theme for the class that week. Be prepared weekly to present what your AG is doing and why. Beginning with the second class, students will be asked to present their AG, including background, an explanation of their legal authority, key policy initiatives involving multistate lawsuits/investigations your AG is involved in; and heads up on brewing conflicts especially with other state or federal officials.

Class Schedule

Session #1: January 26

Overview of the Course / Powers and Duties (Part I) and Rules of the Road – AG 101

Students will introduce themselves and talk about their expectations for the course. Professors will review the syllabus, and discuss administrative aspects of attendance, class participation, grading, writing assignments and course materials and our expectations of students and learning outcomes. In this first class, Professors will introduce you to the AGO and AGs and their staff, the culture, the relevant acronyms, legal framework, and individual and collective actions of AGs in their states and beyond.

In Part 1, Prof. Ross will provide an overview of the role of AGs, citing their powers and duties broadly. Topics will include a brief historical background, methods of selection and qualifications to run for office, and the varied backgrounds of AGs in office today. During the semester, there will be discussion of the common law authority of AGs, the complexities involved in potential conflicts in representation/ defining who is the client, the role of the AG in defending the states, the tools that AGs use to express their views, and the “people’s lawyer” role that many AGs reference in their advocacy, legislative, and public policy initiatives.

Prof. Blake will assign an AG for students to follow throughout the semester, and to report on briefly at the beginning of each class. Professors will explain the writing assignments in either the first session or the second class.

Session #2: February 2

Overview of the Course / Powers and Duties (Part II)

Profs. Ross and Blake will continue the overview begun in the first class with a focus on the key functions/roles of the OAG, including consumer protection, antitrust, environmental protection, civil rights, criminal, among

others. Discussion will continue regarding relationships of the OAG to the Governor, legislature, and citizens as well as key cases where the independence and authority of the Office has been reaffirmed by the court.

In Part 2, Prof. Blake will discuss the structure and operation of an AG Office, using the Colorado AG Office as a case study. Gaining an understanding of the culture of the office, as well as the authority of each position/section/division adds to an understanding of how AGs accomplish their goals, meet public expectations and perform their roles as the states' chief legal officers.

Prof. Blake will discuss the topic for the Term paper and the related outline.

Session #3: February 9

Influencers: Political Aspects of AG Life and National AG Organizations

AGs have been highly visible on many partisan issues, including elections. This class will focus both on partisan political activity and how (or not) it impacts the role, profile and cooperation of state AGs; and also discuss the AG national membership organizations such as the AGA and NAAG. The political organizations are the Republican Attorneys General Association and the Democratic Attorneys General Association.

Session #4: February 16

Relationships with the Governor, Other State Officials & State Agencies

As the chief legal officer of the state, the AG holds a unique position in state government as both legal adviser to the Governor and state agencies and as the people's lawyer representing the public interest of the citizens. This class will explore these relationships and answer the questions of: can the Governor tell the AG what to do? What happens if the Governor won't accept the AG's advice? Are AG opinions binding? How are conflicts in representation generally handled? What does representing the public interest mean? Discussion will also include how COVID-19 has affected these relationships and how partisan politics may impact the outcomes on state legal policy and on national issues.

Session #5: February 23

Role of the State Solicitor General

An increasingly important role in the determination of the state's legal policy has been the creation of the position of Solicitor General (SG) in AG offices. Most AG Offices now have a dedicated position, the Solicitor General, who oversees and manages the civil appellate work of the office. In other offices, the person responsible for this function may be called the Appellate Chief. The SG also plays a significant role on national issues and in turn, on national politics to the extent high-profile cases are moving through the courts towards the Supreme Court and having policy impacts, such as the Affordable Care Act and immigration, among many other areas. The Solicitor General represents the state in matters before the U.S. Supreme Court.

SGs, who coordinate closely on many matters, are also affected by partisan politics particularly on national issues/cases.

Session #6: March 2

Role of the Attorney General in Consumer Protection/Multistate Investigations

AGs are key advocates for consumer protection, and their enforcement authority derives from consumer protection statutes that give them enormous power. Often AGs are at odds with the business community, both large and small. This class will focus on understanding the AGs role in consumer protection, with emphasis on

multistate actions. How does this process get initiated and when, where and how does it end? Issues to be discussed include case selection and criteria; structure and oversight of a multistate; differences in legal strategy and state laws; and use of outside counsel among other matters.

Session #7: March 9

Role of the AG in Criminal Law

The criminal law jurisdiction of AGs varies from state to state with only a few offices having full original criminal jurisdiction where the AG functions as the main local/state prosecutor. In many states the AGO has concurrent and/or supplemental jurisdiction and primarily prosecutes murders and other such high-profile cases. This session will explore these roles, with discussion including the legal authority of the AG; relationships with the U.S. DOJ /state-federal roles and coordination where appropriate; and role of local prosecutors v AGs. Other topics of discussion will include efforts to curb trafficking of women and children; domestic violence; and child abuse.

Session #8: March 16

Role of the AG as Advocate for Change in the Justice System – Social Justice Reform

Recent events of violence across the nation have increased the demands on AGs to investigate crimes, to address calls for police reform, or in some cases, to prosecute those accused of committing these crimes. AGs are responding with multi-faceted approaches and several AGs are very involved with social justice reform, advocating for change in the justice system. The approaches to resolution of these matters vary from state to state, and the AG is the key player in many instances. This class will focus on the multi-faceted role of the AG in such matters, including discussion of legislative and other reforms.

Session #9: March 23

Representing Clients Before AG Offices: Perspectives of A Former AG

After AGs leave office, many join law firms or set up their own consulting firms and represent clients who have received inquiries of civil investigative demands (CIDs) from AG Offices. Often, these former AGs are called upon to help their former colleagues. This class will focus on this expanding business of AG Practice Groups in big law and consulting firms and their role in resolving client concerns related to AG actions. What is the framework/parameters for these interactions, the political/ legal/ policy implications, and the pros and cons of their potential actions? How are AGs and formers viewed by the Congress and the Administration? Do lobbying rules apply? Please come to class with questions!

Session #10: March 30

The Role of State AGs in our Federalist System – Shifting Sands?

This class will focus on the ever - evolving role of the state AG in our federalist system and the relationships between the states and the federal government. How do AGs make judgment calls as to their appropriate roles and relationships? Will the AG role in setting national legal policy continue to expand or contract and will the business community push restrictions on AG authority or cooperate to bring about change?

The array of legal and policy issues that arise daily is diverse, challenging, and always potentially shifting course, whenever the constitutional framework and legal/policy/political aspects of the ongoing state-federal relationship is redefined by the Administration and Congress. With a new Administration, what will once again

shift, bringing with it new potential for state AG actions pro and con? Please think about how the AG you are following fits in to this and be prepared to discuss.

Session #11: April 6

Role of Attorneys General in Shaping Technology Policy

New technology developments are announced every day, and often face scrutiny by AGs from consumer protection and privacy aspects, among others. Whether it is facial recognition technology, artificial intelligence-related, safety or data issues related to electric cars, or Facebook or Google, it's an ever-expanding list. AGs rely upon their existing legal authority to act, absent other clear legislative directives. The new technology area is moving fast, posing challenges in learning how it operates and what the issues actually are. What are the outcomes and how are AGs initiatives being received? How do AGs respond to data breaches and how is the privacy landscape changing, including CCPA impact? And how is the private sector responding and, in some cases, collaborating with AGs? Case studies will include Facebook-related issues as well as other emerging issues.

Session #12: April 13

Emerging AG Hot Topics

The class will focus on several hot topics of AG interest, including the role of the AG/state in medicinal and recreational marijuana; pandemic response; and state legal developments on cybercrime, among others. Each of these topics (and there are many more that could pop up) demonstrate once again the broad scope of the AG's powers and duties. Prof. Blake will teach, having been at the forefront of the Colorado experience with marijuana and subsequently, implementing the state's regulatory regime.

Session #13: April 20

FINAL WRAP-UP

Pros Blake and Ross will conclude the course with a review of AG roles and responsibilities. Students will discuss their AGs in a 10 minute or less presentation, with the focus on lessons learned this semester, particularly noting wisdom/information offered by guest speakers. What's your own perspective? Are AGs doing their jobs? Should they be re-elected? Should their authority be enhanced or curtailed? Has state authority expanded or contracted in recent years? And for you, which job do you believe you would like to have in an AG Office and why? Your Professors invite your feedback.

The topic for the memo will be presented and discussed during the first class. It will be a memorandum not to exceed 4 pages from you to the AG. The due date will be March 16 at 4pm via email to both Professors.

Details: assignments must be in Times New Roman, 12 pt. font, double-spaced, one-sided and must be submitted via email. Page limits are inclusive of all citations, which should be footnotes in accordance with Blue Book format. Failure to follow instructions as to format or to respond to issues presented or a lack of legal citations to substantive legal authorities (writing assignments CANNOT be based solely on newspaper articles or opinions), will result in a lowered grade by at least one level or more.

Term Paper Outline

The outlines should demonstrate serious thought and summary of your term paper. It need not be extremely detailed but it should indicate an outline of how you plan to address the topic and demonstrate knowledge of legal sources. Organization is the key. Instructors will make every effort to return within 10 days.

Final Term Paper – Writing Assignment 2

The primary assignment for this class will be a paper not to exceed 12 pages. Prof. Blake will discuss the topic and expectations in second class. **Details:** assignments must be in Times New Roman, 12 pt. font, double-spaced, one-sided and must be submitted via email. Page limits are inclusive of all citations, which should be footnotes in accordance with Blue Book format. Failure to follow instructions as to format or to respond to issues presented or a lack of legal citations to substantive legal authorities (writing assignments CANNOT be based solely on newspaper articles or opinions), will result in a lowered grade by at least one level or more. Please put your name at the right-hand corner of first page and whether you are a graduating 3L.

Class Schedule

Session #1: January 26

Overview of the Course / Powers and Duties (Part I) and Rules of the Road – AG 101

Students will introduce themselves and talk about their expectations for the course. Professors will review the syllabus, and discuss administrative aspects of attendance, class participation, grading, writing assignments and course materials and our expectations of students and learning outcomes. In this first class, Professors will introduce you to the AGO and AGs and their staff, the culture, the relevant acronyms, legal framework, and individual and collective actions of AGs in their states and beyond.

In Part 1, Prof. Ross will provide an overview of the role of AGs, citing their powers and duties broadly. Topics will include a brief historical background, methods of selection and qualifications to run for office, and the varied backgrounds of AGs in office today. During the semester, there will be discussion of the common law authority of AGs, the complexities involved in potential conflicts in representation/ defining who is the client, the role of the AG in defending the states, the tools that AGs use to express their views, and the “people’s lawyer” role that many AGs reference in their advocacy, legislative, and public policy initiatives.

Prof. Blake will assign an AG for students to follow throughout the semester, and to report on briefly at the beginning of each class. Professors will explain the writing assignments in either the first session or the second class.

Session #2: February 2

Overview of the Course / Powers and Duties (Part II)

Profs. Ross and Blake will continue the overview begun in the first class with a focus on the key functions/roles of the OAG, including consumer protection, antitrust, environmental protection, civil rights, criminal, among

others. Discussion will continue regarding relationships of the OAG to the Governor, legislature, and citizens as well as key cases where the independence and authority of the Office has been reaffirmed by the court.

In Part 2, Prof. Blake will discuss the structure and operation of an AG Office, using the Colorado AG Office as a case study. Gaining an understanding of the culture of the office, as well as the authority of each position/section/division adds to an understanding of how AGs accomplish their goals, meet public expectations and perform their roles as the states' chief legal officers.

Prof. Blake will discuss the topic for the Term paper and the related outline.

Session #3: February 9

Influencers: Political Aspects of AG Life and National AG Organizations

AGs have been highly visible on many partisan issues, including elections. This class will focus both on partisan political activity and how (or not) it impacts the role, profile and cooperation of state AGs; and also discuss the AG national membership organizations such as the AGA and NAAG. The political organizations are the Republican Attorneys General Association and the Democratic Attorneys General Association.

Session #4: February 16

Relationships with the Governor, Other State Officials & State Agencies

As the chief legal officer of the state, the AG holds a unique position in state government as both legal adviser to the Governor and state agencies and as the people's lawyer representing the public interest of the citizens. This class will explore these relationships and answer the questions of: can the Governor tell the AG what to do? What happens if the Governor won't accept the AG's advice? Are AG opinions binding? How are conflicts in representation generally handled? What does representing the public interest mean? Discussion will also include how COVID-19 has affected these relationships and how partisan politics may impact the outcomes on state legal policy and on national issues.

Session #5: February 23

Role of the State Solicitor General

An increasingly important role in the determination of the state's legal policy has been the creation of the position of Solicitor General (SG) in AG offices. Most AG Offices now have a dedicated position, the Solicitor General, who oversees and manages the civil appellate work of the office. In other offices, the person responsible for this function may be called the Appellate Chief. The SG also plays a significant role on national issues and in turn, on national politics to the extent high-profile cases are moving through the courts towards the Supreme Court and having policy impacts, such as the Affordable Care Act and immigration, among many other areas. The Solicitor General represents the state in matters before the U.S. Supreme Court.

SGs, who coordinate closely on many matters, are also affected by partisan politics particularly on national issues/cases.

Session #6: March 2

Role of the Attorney General in Consumer Protection/Multistate Investigations

AGs are key advocates for consumer protection, and their enforcement authority derives from consumer protection statutes that give them enormous power. Often AGs are at odds with the business community, both large and small. This class will focus on understanding the AGs role in consumer protection, with emphasis on

multistate actions. How does this process get initiated and when, where and how does it end? Issues to be discussed include case selection and criteria; structure and oversight of a multistate; differences in legal strategy and state laws; and use of outside counsel among other matters.

Session #7: March 9

Role of the AG in Criminal Law

The criminal law jurisdiction of AGs varies from state to state with only a few offices having full original criminal jurisdiction where the AG functions as the main local/state prosecutor. In many states the AGO has concurrent and/or supplemental jurisdiction and primarily prosecutes murders and other such high-profile cases. This session will explore these roles, with discussion including the legal authority of the AG; relationships with the U.S. DOJ /state-federal roles and coordination where appropriate; and role of local prosecutors v AGs. Other topics of discussion will include efforts to curb trafficking of women and children; domestic violence; and child abuse.

Session #8: March 16

Role of the AG as Advocate for Change in the Justice System – Social Justice Reform

Recent events of violence across the nation have increased the demands on AGs to investigate crimes, to address calls for police reform, or in some cases, to prosecute those accused of committing these crimes. AGs are responding with multi-faceted approaches and several AGs are very involved with social justice reform, advocating for change in the justice system. The approaches to resolution of these matters vary from state to state, and the AG is the key player in many instances. This class will focus on the multi-faceted role of the AG in such matters, including discussion of legislative and other reforms.

Session #9: March 23

Representing Clients Before AG Offices: Perspectives of A Former AG

After AGs leave office, many join law firms or set up their own consulting firms and represent clients who have received inquiries of civil investigative demands (CIDs) from AG Offices. Often, these former AGs are called upon to help their former colleagues. This class will focus on this expanding business of AG Practice Groups in big law and consulting firms and their role in resolving client concerns related to AG actions. What is the framework/parameters for these interactions, the political/ legal/ policy implications, and the pros and cons of their potential actions? How are AGs and formers viewed by the Congress and the Administration? Do lobbying rules apply? Please come to class with questions!

Session #10: March 30

The Role of State AGs in our Federalist System – Shifting Sands?

This class will focus on the ever - evolving role of the state AG in our federalist system and the relationships between the states and the federal government. How do AGs make judgment calls as to their appropriate roles and relationships? Will the AG role in setting national legal policy continue to expand or contract and will the business community push restrictions on AG authority or cooperate to bring about change?

The array of legal and policy issues that arise daily is diverse, challenging, and always potentially shifting course, whenever the constitutional framework and legal/policy/political aspects of the ongoing state-federal relationship is redefined by the Administration and Congress. With a new Administration, what will once again

shift, bringing with it new potential for state AG actions pro and con? Please think about how the AG you are following fits in to this and be prepared to discuss.

Session #11: April 6

Role of Attorneys General in Shaping Technology Policy

New technology developments are announced every day, and often face scrutiny by AGs from consumer protection and privacy aspects, among others. Whether it is facial recognition technology, artificial intelligence-related, safety or data issues related to electric cars, or Facebook or Google, it's an ever-expanding list. AGs rely upon their existing legal authority to act, absent other clear legislative directives. The new technology area is moving fast, posing challenges in learning how it operates and what the issues actually are. What are the outcomes and how are AGs initiatives being received? How do AGs respond to data breaches and how is the privacy landscape changing, including CCPA impact? And how is the private sector responding and, in some cases, collaborating with AGs? Case studies will include Facebook-related issues as well as other emerging issues.

Session #12: April 13

Emerging AG Hot Topics

The class will focus on several hot topics of AG interest, including the role of the AG/state in medicinal and recreational marijuana; pandemic response; and state legal developments on cybercrime, among others. Each of these topics (and there are many more that could pop up) demonstrate once again the broad scope of the AG's powers and duties. Prof. Blake will teach, having been at the forefront of the Colorado experience with marijuana and subsequently, implementing the state's regulatory regime.

Session #13: April 20

FINAL WRAP-UP

Pros Blake and Ross will conclude the course with a review of AG roles and responsibilities. Students will discuss their AGs in a 10 minute or less presentation, with the focus on lessons learned this semester, particularly noting wisdom/information offered by guest speakers. What's your own perspective? Are AGs doing their jobs? Should they be re-elected? Should their authority be enhanced or curtailed? Has state authority expanded or contracted in recent years? And for you, which job do you believe you would like to have in an AG Office and why? Your Professors invite your feedback.

CONCEPT NOTE

The Covid-19 pandemic and the attendant lockdown measures to control the spread, has forced courts and advocates to adapt a new pace in the dispensation of justice. Advocates and judges alike have begun to grapple with some of the challenges in doing their work. In other areas such as arbitration and international litigation, there is already a lot of experience of remote hearings and cross-examination of distant witnesses by video. Courts and advocates are rapidly gaining experience of the skills required to deal effectively with remote hearings. Virtual courtrooms were once the stuff of science fiction, but today they are an accepted reality. In some jurisdiction, the overall experience of virtual hearings seems to have been positive. In any event, given the likelihood of virtual hearing becoming more common place, even after the pandemic has subsided, undue negativity and resistance to them may not be the best way forward for legal industry.

This hybrid virtual and in-venue training will consider what our commitment to open courts should look like in a world where virtual hearings are, if not ubiquitous, quite suddenly much more common. In addition to providing meaningful public access to virtual hearings, courts must apart from policy consideration also consider important interests, like privacy, and be alert to the possibility that moving court proceedings online can have unintentional impacts on participant experiences and case outcomes. Virtual hearings bring important benefits, but also bring new risks that are worthy of attention.

This training webinar is also tailored to address the issues of the impact of COVID 19 outbreak on the administration of justice, how it has forever changed our “normal” which will of a necessity require policy changes to deal with the not just the exacerbation of the endemic delays in court hearing but how we can surmount the challenges to implement effective and efficient virtual court hearing system that is suited to our needs.
