To the citizens of the United States of America,

We the undersigned state legislators of the United States are vested with the plenary power by our US Constitution (Article 2 Section 1 Clause 2) to oversee the election of the president of the United States. "Each State shall appoint, in such Manner as the Legislature thereof may direct, a Number of Electors, equal to the whole Number of Senators and Representatives to which the State may be entitled in the Congress: but no Senator or Representative, or Person holding an Office of Trust or Profit under the United States, shall be appointed an Elector."

It has come to our attention from an independently administered forensic election audit of 2.1 million ballots in Maricopa County, Arizona that the results of the 2020 election in Arizona should not have been certified due to a number of questionable and unexplainable actions taken by the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors to include: obstruction of an audit sanctioned by the Arizona Senate, deletion of data immediately prior to the audit, corrupted images and refusal to turn over subpoenaed routers and tokens. In addition, an in-depth canvass of votes in Arizona, as well as through multiple different data reviews of voting by independent experts conclude that there is enough reasonable maladministration to call into question the results of the Arizona 2020 election results and subsequently its electors.

It is clear that certification of Arizona electors were improperly rendered in January 2021 of the November 2020 United States presidential election and we call for a complete nullification of Arizona's electors. Arizona is not the only state that has experienced an unusually high number of irregularities. Sworn affidavits have accumulated from many states detailing rampant corruption and mismanagement in the election process. Multiple audits are either underway or about to start, canvasses underway or about to start, and lawsuits challenging the validity of several counties in our states, have already shown maladministration and significant inaccuracies. We have come to the conclusion that all 50 states need to be forensically audited as similar patterns are being discovered across the country. We must restore voter confidence in our election system that was compromised when guardrails were

taken off of our election systems in the name of “covid related safety precautions”. These safeguards must be restored. Voter rolls should be scrubbed with a canvass of the voters to ensure future integrity of our elections.

We cannot continue as if nothing happened. It is incumbent upon each state to ensure every legal vote is counted so that voters can trust that those elected were truly elected by the people. We must restore voter confidence as election integrity is the foundation of our republic and the peaceful transfer of power.

We the undersigned are legislators committed to seeking full forensic audits in our respective states, introducing risk limiting legislation to ensure fair and transparent elections, and working closely with organizations within our respective states to restore election integrity.
