Dear Mr. Evers:

This is the final response to the request for information that you sent to the Department of Energy (DOE) under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552. You requested:

All email communications (including emails, email attachments, calendar entries, or any other records reflecting communications) with the following individuals:

- i. Wells Griffith, Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for International Energy and Environment at the National Security Council/National Economic Council;
- ii. Francis Brooke, Senior Energy Advisor to the President in the White House Office; and/or
- iii. Brooke Rollins, Assistant to the President in the White House Office of American Innovation.

American Oversight requests that the search include at a minimum the records of the following individuals:

- i. Secretary Rick Perry;
- ii. Deputy Secretary Dan Brouillette;
- iii. Under Secretary Mark Menezes;
- iv. Any person serving in the position of Chief of Staff;
- v. Any person serving in the position of White House Liaison or Advisor;
- vi. Any person serving in the position of Assistant Secretary for the Office of International Affairs and the Chief of Staff for the Office of International Affairs;



- vii. Any person serving in the position of Assistant Secretary for Fossil Energy; and viii. Any person serving in the position of Assistant Secretary for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy.

Please provide all responsive records from April 1, 2018, through the date the search is conducted for communications with Wells Griffith and Francis Brooke. Please provide all responsive records from February 1, 2018, through the date the search is conducted for communications with Brooke Rollins.

On April 29, 2019, in an email exchange with Ms. Rachel Fellows, formerly of this office, you confirmed that: for any person serving in Chief of Staff would be Brian McCormack; that any person serving in the capacity of White House Liaison or Advisor would be Jonathan Wetzel; that any person serving in the position of Assistant Secretary for the Office of International Affairs and the Chief of Staff for the Office of International Affairs would be Theodore Garrish or Andrew Horn; any person serving in the position of Assistant Secretary for Fossil Energy would be Steven Winberg, and any person serving in the position of Assistant Secretary for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy would be Daniel Simmons. You confirmed this was a comprehensive list of custodians.

Your request was assigned to DOE's Office of the Executive Secretariat (ES), Office of International Affairs (IA), Office of Fossil Energy (FE), and Office of Energy Efficiency (EE) to conduct searches of their files for responsive documents. DOE started its search on July 11, 2019, which is the cut-off date for responsive documents.

DOE has completed its search and has identified ten (10) documents responsive to your request. The documents are being released to you in part as described in the accompanying index.

Upon review, DOE has determined that certain information should be withheld in the documents pursuant to Exemptions 5, 6, 7(C), and 7(E) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(5), (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), and (b)(7)(E).

Exemption 5 protects from mandatory disclosure "inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters that would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency...." Exemption 5 incorporates the deliberative process privilege which protects recommendations, advice, and opinions that are part of the process by which agency decisions and policies are formulated. The information withheld under Exemption 5 consists of inter-agency pre-decisional information.

A part of the document reflects deliberative discussions. The DOE may consider these preliminary views as part of the process that will lead to the agency's final policy decision about these matters. The withheld information does not represent a final agency position, and its release would compromise the deliberative process by which the government makes its decisions. Thus, the information is being withheld under

Exemption 5 of the FOIA as pre-decisional material that is part of the agency's deliberative process.

Exemption 6 generally is referred to as the "personal privacy" exemption; it provides that the disclosure requirements of FOIA do not apply to "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). In applying Exemption 6, DOE considered: 1) whether a significant privacy interest would be invaded; 2) whether the release of the information would further the public interest by shedding light on the operations or activities of the Government; and 3) whether in balancing the privacy interests against the public interest, disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy.

The information withheld under Exemption 6 consists of mobile phone numbers and personal schedule information. This information qualifies as "similar files" because it is information in which an individual has a privacy interest. Moreover, releasing the information could subject the individual to unwarranted or unsolicited communications. Since no public interest would be served by disclosing this information, and since there is a viable privacy interest that would be threatened by such disclosure, Exemption 6 authorizes withholding the information. Therefore, we have determined that the public interest in the information's release does not outweigh the overriding privacy interests in keeping it confidential, and this information is being withheld under Exemption 6.

Exemption 7 protects from disclosure "records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes" that fall within the purview of one or more of six enumerated categories. To qualify under Exemption 7, the information must have been compiled, either originally or at some later date, for a law enforcement purpose, which includes crime prevention and security measures, even if that is only one of the many purposes for compilation.

Exemption 7(C) provides that, "records of information compiled for law enforcement purposes" may be withheld from disclosure, but only to the extent that the production of such documents "could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy...." In applying Exemption 7(C), DOE considered whether a significant privacy interest would be invaded, whether the release of the information would further the public interest in shedding light on the operations or activities of the Government, and whether in balancing the privacy interests against the public interest, disclosure would constitute unwarranted invasion of privacy.

The information withheld under Exemption 7(C) consists of the names of security personnel, including executive protection employees, and travel logistics. This information, if known, could pose a serious safety risk to the individual in question. The disclosure of such information may result in an unwarranted invasion of privacy and could reasonably pose a serious safety threat. Releasing the names of security personnel and the travel-related information in question would reveal little about the operations or activities of the Government. Therefore, disclosure of this information could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, and this

information will be withheld pursuant to Exemption 7(C).

Exemption 7(E) provides that, “records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes” may be withheld from disclosure, but only to the extent that the production of such documents “would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.”

The information withheld under Exemption 7(E) consists of secured conference room numbers. That information was compiled for preventative law enforcement and/or security purposes to prevent future illegal acts in the form of cyber security intrusions. Because the redacted portions of the enclosed document contains information about DOE’s investigative techniques that could be used by an individual to obtain classified or sensitive information on DOE networks without authorization, we are withholding this information pursuant to Exemption 7(E).

This satisfies the standard set forth at 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(8)(A) that agencies shall withhold information under FOIA “only if (I) the agency reasonably foresees that disclosure would harm an interest protect by an exemption...; or (II) disclosure is prohibited by law...” 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(8)(A) also provides that whenever full disclosure of a record is not possible, agencies shall “consider whether partial disclosure of information is possible...and (II) take reasonable steps necessary to segregate and release nonexempt information.” Therefore, we have determined that, in certain instances, a partial disclosure is proper.

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.7(b)(2), I am the individual responsible for the determination to withhold the information described above. The FOIA requires that “any reasonably segregable portion of a record shall be provided to any person requesting such record after deletion of the portions which are exempt.” 5 U.S.C. § 552(b). As a result, redacted versions of the documents are being released to you in accordance with 10 C.F.R. § 1004.7(b)(3).

This decision, as well as the adequacy of the search, may be appealed within 90 calendar days from your receipt of this letter pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8. Appeals should be addressed to Director, Office of Hearings and Appeals, HG-1, L’Enfant Plaza, U.S. Department of Energy, 1000 Independence Avenue, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20585-1615. The written appeal, including the envelope, must clearly indicate that a FOIA appeal is being made. You may also submit your appeal by e-mail to OHA.filings@hq.doe.gov, including the phrase “Freedom of Information Appeal” in the subject line (this is the method preferred by the Office of Hearings and Appeals). The appeal must contain all the elements required by 10 C.F.R. § 1004.8, including a copy of the determination letter. Thereafter, judicial review will be available to you in the Federal District Court either (1) in the district where you reside, (2) where you have your principal place of business, (3) where DOE’s records are situated, or (4) in the District of Columbia.

The FOIA provides for the assessment of fees for the processing of requests. *See* 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(i); *see also* 10 C.F.R. § 1004.9(a). Your request was placed in the "other" category for fee purposes. Requesters in this category are entitled to two (2) free hours of search time and are provided 100 pages at no cost. In my interim letter dated May 3, 2019, I indicated that you qualified for a fee waiver. Thus, no fees will be charged for processing your request.
