The Secretary of State, Chief Linda Hastings (Bureau of Voting Systems Certification), and I will be there. Deputy Secretary Underwood may also join us.

Florida Voter Registration Application-Part 1 – Instructions

To Register in Florida, you must be:

- a U.S. citizen,
- a Florida resident,
- at least 18 years old (you may pre-register at 16 or 17, but cannot vote until you are 18).

If you have been convicted of a felony, or if a court has found you to be mentally incapacitated as to your right to vote, you cannot register until your right to vote is restored.

If you do not meet any ONE of these requirements, you are not eligible to register.

CRIMINAL OFFENSE: It is a 3rd degree felony to submit false information. Maximum penalties are \$5,000 and/or 5 years in prison.

PUBLIC RECORD: Once filed, all information including your phone number and email address as provided become public record except for the following which can only be used for voter registration purposes: your FL DL#, FL ID#, SSN, where you registered to vote, and whether you declined to register or to update your voter registration record at a voter registration agency. Your signature can be viewed but not copied. (Section 97.0585, Fla. Stat.)

Where to Register: You can register to vote by completing this application and delivering it in person or by mail to any supervisor of elections' office, office that issues driver's licenses, or voter registration agency (public assistance office, center for independent living, office serving persons with disabilities, public library, or armed forces recruitment office) or the Division of Elections. Mailing addresses are on page 2 of this form.

Deadline to Register: The deadline to register to vote is 29 days before any election. You can update your registration record at any time, but for a Primary Election, party changes must be completed 29 days before that election. You will be contacted if your new application is incomplete, denied or a duplicate of an existing registration. Your Voter Information Card will be mailed to you once you are registered.

Identification (ID) Requirements: New applicants must provide a current and valid Florida driver's license number (FL DL#) or Florida identification card number (FL ID#). If you do not have a FL DL# or FL ID#, then you must provide the last four digits of your Social Security number (SSN). If you do not have any of these numbers, check "None." If you leave the field and box blank, your new registration may be denied. See section 97.053(6), Fla.Stat.

Special ID requirements: If you are registering by mail, have never voted in Florida, and have never been issued one of the ID numbers above, include one of the following with your application, or at a later time before you vote:
1) A copy of an ID that shows your name and photo (acceptable IDs--U.S. Passport, debit or credit card, military ID, student ID, retirement center ID, neighborhood association ID, or public assistance ID); or 2) A copy of an ID that shows your name and current residence address (acceptable documents--utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document).

The special ID is not required if you are 65 or older, have a temporary or permanent physical disability, are a member of the active uniformed services or merchant marine who is absent from the county for active duty, or a spouse or dependent thereof, or are currently living outside the U.S. but otherwise eligible to vote in Florida.

Political Party Affiliation: Florida is a closed primary election state. In primary elections, registered voters can only vote for their registered party's candidates in a partisan race on the ballot. In a primary election, all registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, can vote on any issue, nonpartisan race, and race where a candidate faces no opposition in the General Election. If you do not indicate your party affiliation, you will be registered with no party affiliation. Race/Ethnicity: It is optional to list your race or ethnicity.

Please forward this email to the staff members in your office who prepare and submit the canvass. If you forward this message from your phone, make sure that the settings are not such that it truncates the message.

A. Reporting Schedule

1. The first set of unofficial returns are due to the Division of Elections no later than **noon Eastern Time (ET), Saturday, November 12, 2016**. Once the Division receives these returns, it will determine if a machine recount is necessary for a federal, state, or multicounty race. If so, the Secretary of State will issue a machine recount order immediately. We will send a separate email when that happens.
2. If the Secretary orders a recount for your county, the second set of unofficial returns are due to the Division no later than **3 p.m. (ET), Thursday, November 17, 2016**. (Upon receipt of the second set of unofficial returns, the Division will determine if a manual recount of overvotes and undervotes is required. If so, the Secretary of State will issue a manual recount order immediately. The results of a manual recount are included in the official returns.)
 - a. You do not have to nor should you submit 2nd set of unofficial returns if you were not subject to a recount order from the State.
 - b. Local recount results are also not required nor should they be submitted to the Division.
3. Official returns are due to the Division no later than **noon (ET), Sunday, November 20, 2016**.

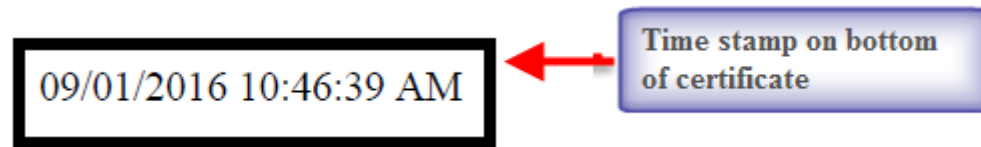

C. Instructions for Creating Canvass in the Portal

When submitting the hard copy of the certificate of the canvassing board to the Division, the time stamp on the bottom of the certificate **must** match the certificate print date in the SOE Portal: otherwise, you must submit another copy of the certificate of the canvassing board that matches the print date in the SOE Portal.



Generate Canvass

Generation may take a few minutes. After the print date updates, click on 'Refresh' until the file name contains the print date.

At least two canvassing board member signatures are required.

The results are **not** submitted until you click on the “Submit to DOE” button, which will populate the time of your submittal. If you do not click on this button, DOE staff will be doing it once the deadline has passed. This will make it appear as if you did not meet the deadline.

You cannot generate the next required canvass until you have “submitted” the current canvass.

The conduct of elections report must be submitted at the same time as the official results are certified and submitted. The conduct of elections, however, goes to the **Bureau of Voting Systems Certification**. You can use the SOE File Transfer Utility to submit that report

or you can email it. The instructions for submission are on page 30 of the *SOE Guide to the Division of Elections – Reports, Downloads, and Uploads* at: <http://soe.dos.state.fl.us/pdf/SoeGuideToReports.pdf>. Governor Ron DeSantis signed CS/SB 7066 into law on June 28, 2019 which addressed elections administration including list maintenance as it specifically relates to Constitutional Amendment 4. See [Chapter 2019-162, Laws of Florida](#).

Please be advised the online voter registration system and the statewide voter registration form (English and Spanish attached) will now reflect the three new statements regarding eligibility based on felony status. The final fillable English and Spanish forms will be available on the Division's website under Forms later today. Prior voter registration applications will still be acceptable. Please note for the statewide voter registration form, a person who checks one or more of the felony statement checkboxes is eligible as to that field.

As in the past, we plan to provide a memo outlining all the key provisions of election-related laws and providing clarification as needed. We appreciate your patience as these changes occur.

Marc,
I spoke with Maria Matthews at the State about the letter. This is not an investigation, according to Ms. Matthews. The state wants to be kept in the loop on the matter and fully understand the Broward SOE's position of what happened with the ballot duplication. Know that they have read your article and are fully aware of Mr. Canova's position and all of the negative press that your article has been generated.

I feel compelled to write you again - even after having made multiple attempts to reach out to you for corrections pertaining to several areas of your December 15, 2017 online story. While you did agree to make one correction, your correction does not address my concerns and it is still unclear exactly what you are referring to. Understanding that you certainly have an upper hand and the "power of the pen" it is my intent to appeal to your sense of fairness and honest reporting.

In your article entitled: *Experts: Broward County Election Chief Broke Law in Destroying Ballots*. Below are factual inaccuracies of which I am gravely concerned and would like for you to include our side:

- 1) The cost for the records did not simply go down from \$71,868.87 to \$3,000.00. The Plaintiff removed some of the things that they previously requested. Additionally, Dr. Snipes decided not to charge the special charge that she is permitted to charge pursuant to Section 119.07 (3)(d), Florida Statutes. This section allows for a special charge if the "nature or volume" of public records requested to be inspected or copied requires extensive use of information technology resources or extensive clerical or

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supervisory assistance by personnel of the agency involved, or both. The request that they recently made to review hundreds of boxes to be removed from shelves and placed in another room within the elections office is a cost that the SOE's office can pass off by law. The way that your article reads would convey to readers that the reduction amount was arbitrary.

- 2) The article also makes reference that "Snipes' office, meanwhile, is involved in two other lawsuits and has been plagued by errors and controversies over public records and paperwork." It is unclear what is being referred to by this statement. The article later references a Federal case involving list maintenance responsibilities that was filed by a conservative organization where we are awaiting a ruling. I am only assuming that you are referring to that, however, it is not clear what the word "plagued" is referencing. I have explained to you that there were legal and contractual reason why the computer manual that you wrote about in the December 15, 2017 article was not produced. The manual contains protected, confidential and proprietary information from the vendor of the electronic equipment. We made this fact known in discovery. The court later ruled that the manual could be produced under seal. SOE Employees testified that they regularly used the electronic manual from the computer system rather than any printed manuals. Nevertheless, a printed manual was located in the warehouse and it was produced. The Court reviewed the manual and it was later filed under seal. There was no issue of a "botched manual". The office refers to the computer manual as the "manual" that they use. When it was discovered that there was a printed hard copy, the printed manual was produced and the one section missing was also produced directly from the online computer manual.
- 3) The month when the hard copy records were no longer available in paper form was in September and not October. There are references to "last month", which would have been November and not September. There is a record in the Court file showing the date. During most of the month of October, the case had actually been dismissed by the Court (a fact that was never mentioned in your article).
- 4) The matters in the article that I find most disappointing are the ones dealing with inaccuracies related to past and present lawsuits (excluding the present one that we would like the judge to hear). For example, you stated *"Before the election last year, her office mistakenly sent out some absentee ballots to voters that failed to list a popular medical marijuana measure that ultimately passed by wide margin, but not before the office was sued by the Florida chapter of the National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws."* You did not mention that this case involved four test ballots that were accidentally inserted by the printer, not the SOE's office and that we won the case after a three and a half day trial on the matter. This hardly seems like a fair matter to raise without including background making it fair to both sides. It would be easy to take cheap shots at any SOE in a large county dealing with millions of sheets of paper related to a large election.
- 5) You go on to state *"in another case" the office mailed out about 1,700 ballots that had the word "no" in Creole where it should have said "wi" for "yes."* I have advised you that there was no court case involving this matter where the printing error was caught off-site by the printer vendor and immediately corrected. It is my understanding that one precinct in one municipality was impacted and immediately corrected. This issue is merged in the middle of other text pertaining to litigation. It would suggest to anyone reading that this involves a Court case. What else could "in another case" mean?
- 6) You write that *"Right before the general election, the Republican Party of Florida threatened to sue Snipes for the way in which her office handled the opening of the absentee ballots. The matter was settled promptly, but the party filed a lawsuit this year to get a court order enforcing ballot handling procedures."* The office has no idea what you are talking about here. I called you to discuss that there was never a settlement and we had no idea what you was referring to. You told me that you saw it in the

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pleadings. When I challenged you that allegations placed in a pleading are just allegations written by lawyers to support their case, you then told me that your information came from the Miami Herald. Please be advised that there was NEVER a settlement of this matter. We have no idea what you are referring to but you write it as a fact. We dispute a settlement and would like our position stated within the article where there is ongoing litigation and the Court has not heard these matters at all.

- 7) One of the more offensive things about the article is the reference to the past supervisor. The Supervisor and her staff work far too hard to be compared with anyone else. While nobody is immune from mistakes, it was disappointing to see this reference. We would like for you to remove it.
- 8) It is equally disturbing that you would interview an opposing counsel in an active Federal Court matter where his own Corporate Representative said in open court that he sits on a committee for ACRU and was the person whose idea it was to file the litigation in the first place. Will I get equal time to insult J. Christian Adams? I am not interested in doing that but my point is that it is unfortunate that your news organization would allow such a quote from Mr. Adams that "It's complete incompetence" without contacting us for a response. What was he referring to? Additionally, what were you referring to when you stated Adams learned that documents had been destroyed in November? If he is referring to the Canova case, they knew that the paper documents were not available in September. Additionally, you may not be aware that Canova and his team never wanted paper documents. Would you be interested in supporting email sent by their representative sent just prior to the litigation being filed?

We are requesting that you add our side of the story as to the matters set forth above. Know that anyone can file a lawsuit about anything and that these groups often work together all around the Country to discredit and harass. I received a call from a Texas attorney just yesterday in reference to ACRU and the Republican Party working together in that area.

The Canova matter started as a public records case. He initially filed simply because he did not want to pay for any records or an inspection. Canova agreed to pay only after the judge asked why they were not inspecting if they could. Now, Canova has all of the records that he sought. He has been able to compare the records with the vote counts and I am assuming has realized that he squarely lost the 2016 election. Know that they originally wrote us for a "recount" not knowing how the process worked.

Finally, be advised that there is no way to manipulate the vote count within the scanning system utilized. It is a ridiculous claim made by people who have no idea what they are taking about. The scanning for each ballot shows the exact time it was scanned. The Broward SOE's office is allowed to defend itself in this matter. Please allow us a fair opportunity to present our case at the appropriate time. In the meanwhile, we would ask for some semblance of balance. We are requesting, once again, that you make the corrections referenced above. Thank you for offering the opportunity to emphasize our position on these matters.

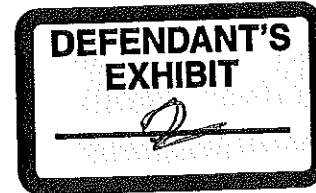

The Voter Participation Center has the sole responsibility to consult with its counsel regarding compliance with federal and state law and regulations. Regrettably, while well-intentioned, these third-party mailers have had a history of confusing voters who are already registered and conflict with ongoing official voter registration and list maintenance efforts by the Supervisors of Elections.

Since the Supervisors of Elections are the ones that must primarily deal with their constituents regarding questions about these third-party mailings, it is best to reach out to them as it appears you did, at least with Supervisor Lux as the FSASE president.
