As noted in our letter of January 26, 2022, we are processing your request for material under the Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”), 5 U.S.C. § 552. The processing of records is ongoing and has located an additional 32 records responsive to your request. We have determined that all 32 records may be released in part.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made redactions, the applicable FOIA exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released and is enclosed.

I have captured all "major surprises" from USAF & Army Congressional Hearings yesterday. James McAleese

1. Air Force Sec. Heather Wilson & Chief of Staff, Gen. Dave Goldfein, (HASC, April 2, 2019): USAF is looking to get ~+25% bigger, but new HASC Chairman Adam Smith (D-WA) is looking for DoD to get smaller. Like it or not, China is coming... Stop the current USAF Readiness-sapping "cashflowing" of Tyndall AFB & Offutt AFB devastation, by passing an immediate 2019 Supplemental. Flying-hours, aircraft procurement, and Space investments are at-risk, if Congress flat-lines proposed +5% ~\$166B 2020 "Blue" USAF Budget Request. USAF fully-supports US Space Force, under the Department of the Air Force.

- Bizarre-question of the Hearing award, goes to: "Why does Air Force have to grow nearly-back to its Cold War peak, [~386 operational squadrons], when the Navy only has to grow back to about one-half [~355 ships], of Its Cold War ships?" (Rep. Elaine Luria (D-VA)).

Gen. Goldfein is personally-standing behind F-15EX replacement of crumbling F-15Cs. USAF still has ~\$1B 2022-2024 LAA procurement. Entire C-130H fleet will receive new MP-2000 eight-bladed propeller upgrades. Simple "fact-of-life", that USAF is now inspecting 100% of KC-46 closed-compartments, (for potential FOD debris), before additional KC-46 deliveries resume. (Boeing 1Q 2019 Results Call is April 24th). USAF is building additional hypersonic wind-tunnels at Arnold Engineering Center (TN), plus also in Indiana. NSSL Launch Services competition is proceeding, (despite recent Chairman Smith concerns). Strong HASC support for accelerated "Section 804" B-52 commercial re-engining.

2. Army Sec. Mark Esper & Chief of Staff, Gen. Mark Milley, (HASC, April 2, 2019): Despite the Army's ~-\$30B "self-funding" of 2020-2024 program cuts, (under flat-lined ~\$182B 2020 Army topline), there did not appear to be an immediate HASC "goodwill bounce". (HASC Members initially-fixated on 2018 Audit Q&A instead). Army needs ~+\$4B-\$5B/year Modernization increase, (to current ~\$34B 2020 "RDA"). Risk is measured in task, time, and Troops. If budgets drop, risk of war from deterrence failing, obviously increases. Russia is both aggressive, plus opportunistic in its "land-grabs". China is an IP thief, preparing to challenge US on a global-scale.

Importantly, Army escaped any potential for withering "border-wall-shenanigans" Q&A, because it had already returned the ~\$1B of excess 2019 Army Milper funding back to OSD in ~September-October; well before the recent March 2019 OSD transfer of that ~\$1B to "DoD-wide" Counter-narcotics Account, for border-wall construction.

Pennsylvania Delegation Question: What happened to Boeing's CH-47 II, (~542 total CH-47 II cut), plus BAE's Bradley & AMPV? No immediate Oshkosh JLTV cut outrage. Rep. Chrissy Houlahan (D-PA). (Gen. Milley: "If we continue to produce legacy systems...we will put at risk, the first battle of the next war..."). (Sec. Esper: "We have been very clear with industry where we are going...with those six priorities...There are +\$30B of opportunities...Meet us there...").

Army is committed to 2020-2024 procurement of: (1) Optionally Manned Fighting Vehicle, (Bradley-replacement); (2) Extended Range Cannon Artillery; (3) Iron Dome/Indirect Fire Protection Capability; and (4) ground combat vehicle active-protection-systems.

3. Army Futures Command, Deputy Commander, LTG Jim Richardson; Deputy ASAALT, LTG Paul Ostrowski; and DCS G-8, LTG James Pasquarette, (SASC Air Land, April 2, 2019): Army Futures Command (AFC) is laser-focused on fielding lethality now. Immediate AFC “wins” are fielding new Enhanced Night Vision Goggle-Binocular (ENVG-B) this Fall, and then Integrated Visual Augmentation System (IVAS) in ~2022, for ~2-3 second US Soldier advantage in close-combat.

Gung-ho on: (1) OMFV competition, (Army is expecting ~3-5 OMFV offerors); (2) Next Generation Automatic Squad Weapon & Rifle; (3) accelerate Future Long Range Assault Aircraft (FLRAA) (+\$75M in Army UPL, beyond \$32M 2020 FLRAA RDT&E already requested); (4) ground combat vehicle APS; (5) new 34.5-inch Army Common Hypersonic Glide Body. No interest in USMC CH-53K, (after just cutting ~542 CH-47 II). ASAALT, Dr. Bruce Jette, is Army’s SAE, consulting closely with AFC. Contractors must become cyber-secure. Stop hemorrhaging program data to China! Protesters must get only one bite at the apple.

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- “The Air Force That We Need” is ~+25% larger, at ~386 operational squadrons, (312 operational squadrons now). (“Desert Storm was a middleweight-fight, not a true peer-fight”). USAF also needs

immediate 2019 Supplemental funding, (Tyndall AFB hurricane & Offutt AFB flooding). ("We cannot cashflow the recovery of Tyndall & Offutt...").

- **Chairman Adam Smith (D-WA)** was skeptical that Congress can afford ~+25% increased future funding. ("You cannot eliminate risk...").
- **USAF needs to protect its recently-expanded acquisition authorities.** ("Old habits die hard...There are plenty of checkers, checking the checkers...").
- Over 90% of ~204 USAF pacing-operational-squadrons, are ready to fight tonight. (USAF successfully-closed previous ~-4K FTE Maintainer-gap, and is now seasoning them).
- Primary-risks from potential 2020 Congressional budget reductions are: (1) Flying-hours; (2) aircraft modernization; and (3) Space investment.
- **USAF is committed to both F-35 lethality & F-15EX capacity:** ("We have got F-15Cs that will not live long enough to be replaced...Our force structure will then decline in size...") Rep. Mike Turner (R-OH) is strong-advocate for immediate F-35 production-ramp, (+12 USAF F-35 plus-up, for ~60 total 2020 USAF F-35s). ("No, not even close...F-35 is a game-changer...It is part of a penetrating-joint-team...But four [4th-gen] aircraft have to fly into the 2030s...A-10, F-15E, F-16, and F-15C...We have a hot-line of F-15EXs...When you look at the operating costs over time, it became the most-affordable-solution...the transition costs are miniscule...").
- **USAF stands behind US Space Force, under the Department of the Air Force:** Rep. Jim Cooper (D-TN) is suspicious that USAF is under OSD-duress. No last-minute flinching of USAF Leadership. [Rep. Cooper did not specifically-ask about newly-formed Space Development Agency, (which is specific-area of past Sec. Wilson concern)] Gen. Goldfein is adamant-supporter of US Space Force, under the Department of the Air Force; where Airmen have direct-access to Space-warfighting-capabilities, (despite testy-Q&A from Rep. Seth Moulton (D-MA)).
- C-130H Fleet will all receive new eight-bladed propellers, (MP-2000).
- 2nd KC-46 FOD incident is requiring 100% physical-inspection of closed-compartments, before additional KC-46 deliveries.
- **Light Attack Aircraft Experiment:** ("We will fly to the sound of the guns, or die trying...") [**\$35M 2020 LAA RDT&E, plus additional ~\$1B 2022-2024 LAA Procurement**]
- **USAF is building more hypersonic windtunnels in Arnold Engineering Center (TN) & also in Indiana.** Separately, USAF is upgrading both Nellis AFB & JPARC AK to be "5th-gen-aircraft" training compliant.
- NSSL Launch Services competition will still likely downselect to two offerors, (transitioning off Russian RD-180 boosters, as previously-mandated by 2022). [Despite recent concerns by HASC Chairman Smith, at potential Blue Origin request]

- Why does USAF have to grow nearly-back to its Cold War peak, (~386 operational squadrons), when the Navy only has to grow back to about one-half (~355 ships), of its ~700 Cold War ships? (Rep. Elaine Luria (-VA)).
- Why only \$175M for 2020 B-52 commercial re-engining? Rep. Jim Banks (R-IN) [Rolls Royce] is seeking to accelerate B-52 re-engining.

US must have large, ready forces, and ability to quickly project combat power, to deter Russia & China.
- Army will achieve required ~66% Readiness of Active BCTs by ~2022, (with ~105% manning for all BCTs). ("BCA would be catastrophic...which would increase risk...and possibility of war").
- Army cut ~\$30B of 2020-2024 "least-lethal" programs, to add ~+\$57B over 2020-2024 in Army Futures Command's eight Cross Functional Teams of: (1) LRPf; (2) NGCV; (3) FVL; (4) Network; (5) Air Missile Defense; (6) Soldier-Lethality; (7) assured PNT; and (8) Synthetic-Training.
- Chairman Smith initially-challenged Army on 2018 audit-failure, despite aggressive ~\$30B of 2020-2024 Army "Nightcourt" cuts, (under flat-lined ~\$182B 2020 Army Budget Request).
- Iron Dome/Indirect Fire Protection Capability: Army is buying two Iron Dome batteries in 2020.

- Accelerated "Section 804" Optionally-Manned Fighting Vehicle will be successful, because "Threshold Objective" technologies are mature. [OMFV final RFP released last week]
- Manning BCTs to ~105%, to maximize Readiness. Army recruited ~70K Soldiers in 2018, falling ~6.5K short of its self-established recruiting goal. ("We just set the bar too high"). Increasing manning to 105% in BCTs, for full-manning during all major training. Non-deployable Force is now only ~6%, (down from original ~17%).
- No border-wall "shenanigans": Army had already-returned the ~\$1B excess 2019 Army Milper funding to OSD, back in ~September-October, (after missing 2018 recruiting goals); well before the recent March 2019 OSD transfer of ~\$1B for border-wall construction.
- APS for all ground combat vehicles. Army will eventually install active-protection-systems (APS) on all ground combat vehicles. (1st four Abrams BCTs of Trophy APS, are just the initial solution).

- Pennsylvania Delegation Question: What happened to Boeing's CH-47 II, and BAE's Bradley & AMPV? No immediate Oshkosh JLTV cut outrage. Rep. Chrissy Houlahan (D-PA). (Gen. Milley: "If we continue to produce legacy systems...we will put at risk, the first battle of the next war..."). (Sec. Esper: "We have been very clear with industry where we are going...with those six priorities...There are +\$30B of opportunities...Meet us there...").
- Army is fully-committed to Extended Range Cannon Artillery (ERCA).
- Confident in current Abrams-lethality against Russian tanks. Gen. Milley is gung-ho to proceed with OMFV replacement of legacy Bradley in ~2023, but was visibly-reluctant to characterize Abrams Tank as "outgunned-or-outranged" by Russian tanks.
- Will HMMWV Recap increase, as JLTV slows? Rep. Jim Banks (R-IN) [AM General] is seeking Army interest in HMMWV Congressional plus-up, as JLTV slows. [~\$127M 2020 HMMWV Ambulance Request]

3. Army Futures Command, Deputy Commander, LTG Jim Richardson; Deputy ASAALT, LTG Paul Ostrowski; and DCS G-8, LTG James Pasquarette, (SASC Air Land, April 2, 2019): Army Futures Command (AFC) is laser-focused on speed, unity-of-command, and fielding lethality now. Immediate AFC "wins" are fielding new Enhanced Night Vision Goggle-Binocular (ENVG-B) this Fall, and then Integrated Visual Augmentation System (IVAS), for ~2-3 second US Soldier advantage in close-combat.

Gung-ho on: (1) OMFV competition, (Army is expecting ~3-5 OMFV offerors); (2) Next Generation Automatic Squad Weapon & Rifle; (3) accelerate Future Long Range Assault Aircraft (FLRAA) (+\$75M in Army UPL, beyond \$32M 2020 FLRAA RDT&E already requested); (4) ground combat vehicle APS; (5) new 34.5-inch Army Common Hypersonic Glide Body. No interest in USMC CH-53K, (after just cutting ~542 CH-47 II). ASAALT, Dr. Bruce Jette, is Army's SAE, consulting closely with AFC. Contractors must

- \$34B total 2020 Army "RDA" Request, (with ~\$8.9B in 2020, for the eight AFC Cross-Functional-Team priorities: (1) LRPf; (2) NGCV; (3) FVL; (4) Network; (5) AMD; (6) Soldier-Lethality; (7) assured PNT; (8) Synthetic-Training). ~\$30B lower priority RDA cut during 2020-2024, with ~+\$57B 2020-2024 high priority RDA growth.
- Army is "all-in" on Multi-Domain-Operations. Russia & China have generated "layers-of-standoff-defense". AFC integrates: (1) Requirements; (2) Technology; (3) Resourcing; and (4) Acquisition, (in close coordination with ASAALT Dr. Bruce Jette).
- Big "MDO" penetrators of defensive-layers-of-standoff are: (1) LRPF; (2) NGCV; and (3) FVL. Sen. Tom Cotton (R-AR) adamant that Precision Strike Missile range be immediately extended beyond current 499KM range of failed INF Treaty.
- Immediate AFC "win" is the fielding of Enhanced Night Vision Goggles-Binocular (ENVG-B) this Fall; with Integrated Visual Augmentation System (IVAS) coming in ~2022. ("Soldiers are using it on the ranges, going from Marksman, to Expert...Reticule is hooked to the weapon system...We are on track to field in October, to 1st 100,000...Where we are going in the future is IVAS..."). Plan to field initial IVAS in 4Q of 2022. [\$129M 2020 ENVG-B Procurement Request. \$76M 2020 IVAS Procurement Request]
- ~\$228M 2020 Land-Based Hypersonic Missile: (Army & Navy working together on new 34.5 inch-wide Common Hypersonic Glide Body). Tri-Service Hypersonics MoU, (Army/Navy are responsible for Common Hypersonic Glide Body, (current 50-inch, moving to smaller new 34.5-inch variant. Six test shots planned for 2019-2023).
- ~\$75M 2020 FLRAA acceleration, in \$2.3B Army UPL: (~\$32M 2020 FLRAA RDT&E already requested. Separate ~\$427M 2020 FARA RDT&E already requested). Army wants to accelerate FLRAA downselect to ~2022, for IOC fielding in ~2030. Sen. Tammy Duckworth (D-IL) was visibly-skeptical. FARA is 1st priority, followed by FLRAA. (FARA will use ITEP engine; but larger FLRAA will require larger-engine).
- Robotic Combat Vehicle Demonstration: (2020, 2022, 2023 Experiments).
- OMFV final RFP: AFC is confident that OMFV Threshold Requirements are achievable. Army is expecting ~3-5 OMFV offerors, ("Fair price for a great vehicle").
- Stryker APS selection will take ~one-year: Trophy APS on Abrams & Iron Fist APS on Bradley. Not pleased with Iron Curtain APS solution for Stryker. Have 2 new Stryker APS competitors (DRS/Rafael versus Rheinmetall/UBT), with ~one-year lead-time for final decision. Army is currently buying 1 BCT of Bradley Iron Fist APS, plus 4 BCTs of Abrams Trophy APS. From there, Army will make final decision on "MAPS" as potential open-system program-of-record. (No proprietary solutions will be allowed).

- **Army Next Generation Automatic Squad Weapon & Rifle**: Downselect to ~3 offerors in July. Final downselect in early 2021, with fielding in late 2021. (Army has selected bigger 6.8mm round, and contractor will provide their cartridge, with plastic telescoped casings). Will buy ~100K weapons for close-combat.
 - **UH-60 National Guard plus-up likely coming**: Sen. Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) is seeking Congressional plus-up of additional ANG UH-60, (beyond the 73 UH-60 already in 2020 Request).
 - **CH-53K for Army?** Sen. Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) fishing for potential Army interest, in also buying USMC CH-53K from Sikorsky/Lockheed.
 - **Contractors must be cyber-secure**: Army must police contractor networks. Not sufficient to just insert cybersecurity clauses into contracts.
 - **ASAALT, Dr. Bruce Jette, is Army's SAE authority**. USD(A&S) Lord has delegated vast majority of programs back to Army, (except FVL & IAMD).
 - **Protesters must only get "one-bite-at-the-apple"**, (instead of sequential agency protest; GAO protest; and then US Court of Federal Claims protest).

Last Nights Update—

We are trying to determine if there is any change in posture in Haiti. Earlier Saturday we reported that Friday night demonstrations died down at dusk and did not resume till daylight this morning; Embassy hopes for similar pattern overnight, and that the President's 1730 broadcast announcing the rescinding of the fuel price hikes will calm the protests down some at least for the rest of the weekend.

U.S. Citizens in Haiti

We do not have confirmed reports of harm to any Americans in Haiti in spite of vandalism at some hotels. However international flight cancellations, and uncertainty over airport re-opening, are causing

concern. PaP Airport itself is secure, but transportation to and from - for passengers, staff, and fuel, still appears to be unsafe at the moment.

We continue to urge everyone in Haiti to shelter in place, and that Americans postpone non-urgent travel to Haiti until further notice.
