Dear Mr. Evers:

This letter responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) dated and received in this office on August 23, 2019 and assigned tracking number 2019-448. Your request seeks from January 20, 2017, all email communications between or among (1) Mary Vought, or any employees of Vought Strategies, LLC, and (2) a list of eight current and former OMB officials.

In response to your FOIA request, OMB conducted a search of its files for documents that are responsive to this request and located a total of 51 pages. Enclosed are all 51 pages, which we are releasing in part, with redactions made pursuant to FOIA Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6). Exemption 6 protects personal information, such as email addresses, telephone numbers and dates of birth, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

If you are not satisfied with the response to this request, you may contact OMB's FOIA Requester Service Center at 202-395-FOIA or OMB's FOIA Public Liaison at 202-395-7250, for any further assistance or to discuss any aspect of your request. Pool report #1

The president spoke to pool before a working lunch with budget advisers in Roosevelt Room.

"We must do a lot more with less," he said, promising to end waste and to continue to renegotiate federal contracts. "We have already saved a lot – billions and billions of dollars."

"The finances of this country are a mess but we're going to clean that up," he said.

"I will be holding everybody accountable for that," he said, expressing confidence in

his team.

“We’re going to take this budget which is in all fairness I’ve only been here for four weeks so I can’t take too much of the blame for what’s happened but it is absolutely out of control,” Trump said.

He said the federal debt had doubled in a very short time.

He promised to do “tremendous” things with the budget, taking care of military, in particular. He promised a health care plan in March, “maybe mid to early March we’ll be submitting something that I think people will be very impressed by.”

He sat between OMB director Mick Mulvaney on his right and Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin on his left. “He’s going to be an absolutely great director,” Trump said of Mulvaney.

Pool set up before Trump arrived at 12:38. He greeted Mnuchin and others, then invited them to sit down. He made his statement and took no questions. All places were set with iced tea and water except for Trump’s which was set only with water.

Also seated at the table: Jared Kushner, Emma Doyle and Russ Vought of OMB, Steven Miller, economic adviser Gary Cohn, Reince Priebus, Steve Bannon.

Pool ushered out five minutes after Trump arrived.

BREAKING – White House budget blueprint calls for \$54B defense bump, domestic cuts

The White House will send its initial budget guidance to federal agencies at noon today, outlining a \$54 billion increase in defense spending and corresponding reductions to most non-security agencies.

An Office of Management and Budget official told reporters this morning that the Trump administration will be proposing a 10 percent increase in defense spending and funding bumps for national security-related efforts. But that will mean cuts to domestic programs as well as foreign aid.

"This budget expects the rest of the world to step up in some of the programs this country has been so generous in funding in the past," the OMB official said.

MIKA BRZEZINSKI: all right. 4 past the hour. joining us director of office of management and budget mick mulvaney. very good to have you on the set with us. thank you for coming in.

DIRECTOR MICK MULVANEY: happy to be here on a beautiful, warm, sunny day.

BRZEZINSKI: horrible out.

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: According to the CBO it's sunny and 74.

BRZEZINSKI: sun is coming up behind the blizzard. so we are looking at the cbo numbers and republicans have in the past supported cbo numbers. is it safe to say you have in the past supported cbo numbers?

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: i think what you're seeing is something we have in the past. you have to sort of rely on cbo to count money because that's why it's there. we've been very critical in the past about their

ability to count coverage numbers, insurance coverage numbers. i think just three years ago, for example, back down to 2013, obamacare was already around and they did an estimate then of what obamacare would look like this year. the number they estimated at that time, not 20 years, three years ago, 24 million people on the exchanges. today it's 11 1/2. they missed by 50% over a window of just a couple of years. it's really, really hard to do this. we don't even try to do this at omb. that's how difficult it is. cbo good at counting money in and out, tacks, policies, so forth. not sure --

BRZEZINSKI: so the question that's been asked over and over and over again is are people going to lose health care coverage? ar under trump care, whatever you want to call it, this new plan or repeal and replace. and republican after republican who supports it has failed to answer the question. now the cbo comes out with this report saying 24 million americans, 14 in the next year, and we're supposed to also believe that these numbers are way off and that nobody is going to lose their health care? can we be honest.

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: meek, i don't think we'd be dodging the question. i think what we're saying is there's another more important question.

BRZEZINSKI: there's a question that dodging.

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: if you give me a chance, i'll explain.

BRZEZINSKI: answer that.

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: the democrats are focused on coverage. they covered me.

KASIE HUNT: the president of the united states has been very focused --

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: if you let me finish, i was covered. i was on obamacare, on the exchange as a member of the house. i have the same plan as somebody that makes a lot less than i did at the time. \$12,000 annual deductible, i could afford it. how could someone who makes a fifth of what i do afford it? you are talking coverage. coverage is not the end. they don't get better with coverage, they get better with care. you ask me about coverage, that's fine, but talk about how to afford to get it.

BRZEZINSKI: look, that's fine, meaning, yes, there are millions of people who will lose their coverage.

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: if you have coverage that doesn't allow you to go to the doctor, what good is it?

HUNT: most are covering medicaid. yes, limitations going to doctors. however, it is a system that is not that individual market or the obamacare exchange we talk about. it is a lot of people and why tom cotton is so concerned about this bill. again, i keep going back to this disconnect. paul ryan is making the same argument. look, this is not about universal coverage, this is about cost. the president going to take care of people. no one is going to lose their coverage. he tweeted, i will not cut medicare, social security, medicaid.

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: you heard people that have coverage, not care. the president is around to understanding the important thing is allowing people to go to the doctor when they get sick. democrats have all this credit for giving people coverage, but ignore the fact people could not go to the doctor. that's what's important to the president. how do folk that is support him and need the assistance and how they get to go to the doctor when they get sick.

HUNT: how do you answer the criticism this amounts to tax cuts and money to wealthier american who is didn't vote for the president.

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: we are going to repeal all the taxes. that's what the proposed bill does. all the taxes you can. keep in mind, when obamacare got created, some of it was put with 60 votes before ted kennedy passed away. there are things we cannot do. you talk about that in the show. everything we can repeal with 50 votes, we do. we do it in such a fashion that allows these folks to go to the doctor. who cares if somebody else benefits? why do you have to have a system that punishes somebody that helps somebody else. we think we have a system that allows people to get affordable health care. why is it bad if folks benefit from a tax reduction at the same time.

MARK HALPERIN: the house vote would have to change to get --

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: i believe every senator believes every house bill needs to be changed.

HALPERIN: do you agree it has to change somewhat to pass the senate?

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: we are working on getting it through the house.

HUNT: do you have 216 in the house?

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: i haven't run the final numbers yet because the framework bill has a couple ideas floating around. there wi resolutions today or tomorrow, depending on the weather for changes. as much repeal and as much replace we can do. there have been good ideas from across the political spectrum with republicans in the house. if they get added to the bill, the president will be there. i don't think we are in a position to count votes until we know what that bill looks like.

BRZEZINSKI: so, the cbo report. do you -- do you agree with the facts it presents? are the facts correct in the cbo report?

DIRECTOR MULVANEY: i don't believe the facts are correct. i'm not just saying that because it looks bad for my political position. i'm say thag based upon a track record of the cbo being wrong before and we believe they are wrong now. let me give you specific examples of that. it's not politics. go read the report. the cbo assumption, to get to the numbers they get to assume you are on medicaid today. the house bill passes tomorrow. the cbo assumes you go off med said. okay? it's a free program. the cbo assumes as soon as the mandate is gone, you will give up something free in exchange for nothing. that makes no sense. i think that's where it looks. the cbo is good at counting numbers, but not that good at coverage.

BRZEZINSKI: mick mulvaney, thank you for being on the show this morning.

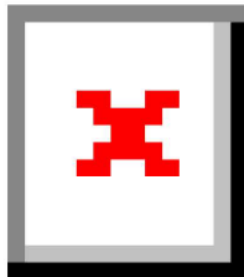
