This letter is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) dated October 10, 2019. You have requested all email communications sent by any of the following individuals to any email address ending in bhfs.com, pmj-dc.com, dominionvoting.com, essvote.com, orhartintercivic.com. DHS may limit its search to the following individuals: (i) Acting Secretary Kevin McAleenan, as well as anyone serving as his scheduler or assistant; (ii) Former Secretary Kirstjen Nielsen, as well as anyone serving as her scheduler or assistant; (iii) Brandon Wales; (iv) David Pekoske; (v) Claire Grady; (vi) Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) Director Christopher Krebs, as well as anyone serving as his scheduler or assistant; (vii) CISA Chief of Staff Emily Early; (viii) Matthew Travis; (ix) Jeannette Manfra; (x) Richard Driggers; (xi) Division Brian Harrell; (xii) Steve Harris; (xiii) Bob Kolasky and (xiv) Mark Kneidinger.

The Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) has conducted a search of the files within the CISA for records responsive to your request. Unfortunately, we were unable to locate or identify any responsive records.

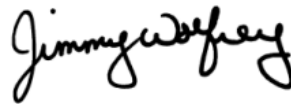
While an adequate search was conducted, you have the right to appeal this determination that no records exist within the listed offices that would be responsive to your request. Should you wish to do so, you must send your appeal and a copy of this letter, within 90 days of the date of this letter, to: Privacy Office, Attn: FOIA Appeals, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, 245 Murray Lane, SW, Mail Stop 0655, Washington, D.C. 20528-0655 or email to foia@hq.dhs.gov, following the procedures outlined in the DHS FOIA regulations at 6 C.F.R. Part 5 § 5.8. Your envelope and letter should be marked "FOIA Appeal." Copies of the FOIA and DHS FOIA regulations are available at www.dhs.gov/foia.

Provisions of FOIA allow DHS to charge for processing fees, up to \$25, unless you seek a waiver of fees. In this instance, because the cost is below the \$25 minimum, there is no charge.

You may contact the DHS FOIA Public Liaison for any further assistance and to discuss any aspect of your request. Additionally, you have a right to right to seek dispute resolution services from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) which mediates disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies as a non-exclusive alternative to litigation. If you are requesting access to your own records (which is considered a Privacy Act request), you should know that OGIS does not have the authority to handle requests made under the Privacy Act of 1974.
