This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of December 20, 2019 in which you requested:

- “All communications (including emails, email attachments, calendar invitations, letters, memoranda, or other communications) between (a) agency officials listed below in Column A and (b) the individuals or entities listed below in Column B (including but not limited to emails with the email domains or addresses included below), without regard to subject matter” – between the period of January 20, 2017 through February 20, 2018.
- “All communications (including emails, email attachments, calendar invitations, letters, memoranda, or other communications) between (a) the agency officials listed below in Column A and (b) the individuals or entities listed below in Column B (including but not limited to emails with the email domains or addresses included below), regarding short-term, limited-duration insurance plans and related proposed, draft, or final legislation or regulations” – between the period of January 20, 2017 through February 20, 2018.

Your request was received in our office on December 30, 2019 and assigned FOIA tracking number #886711.

We conducted a search of the records of the Office of Congressional and Intergovernmental Affairs and did not locate any information that is responsive to your request.

If you consider this an adverse determination, you have the right to file an administrative appeal. Your appeal must be received by the Solicitor of Labor within 90 calendar days of the date of this initial denial letter. Address your appeal to the following office:
