Dear Ms. Sloan:

This is further to our 8 January 2020 letter and is also a final response concerning your 7 January 2020 correspondence, on behalf of American Oversight, requesting records under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) for:

- 1. All records reflecting any legal analysis- including but not limited to, opinions, memoranda, file memos, talking points, emails, or other informal communications- regarding the legality or illegality of conducting a U.S. military strike against Iranian Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps Quds Force Commander Qasem Soleimani.**
- 2. Analyses conducted by other federal government entities and sent to your agency are responsive to this request.**

Please provide all responsive records from December 27, 2019, through January 7, 2020.


We completed a thorough review of your request and determined that in accordance with Section 3.6(a) of Executive Order 13526, the CIA can neither confirm nor deny the existence or nonexistence of records responsive to your request. The fact of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself currently and properly classified and is intelligence sources and methods information protected from disclosure by Section 6 of the CIA Act of 1949, as amended, and Section 102A(i)(1) of the National Security Act of 1947, as amended. Therefore, your request is denied pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1) and (b)(3). As the CIA Information and Privacy Coordinator, I am the CIA official responsible for this determination. You may appeal this response to the Agency Release Panel, in my care, within 90 days from the date of this letter. Please include the basis of your appeal.

Please be advised that you may seek dispute resolution services from the CIA's FOIA Public Liaison or from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS) of the National Archives and Records Administration. OGIS offers mediation services to help resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and Federal agencies. Please note, contacting CIA's FOIA Public Liaison or OGIS does not affect your right to pursue an administrative appeal.
