Dear Mr. Evers,

This letter responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of February 25, 2020, in which you requested all records reflecting the content of a meeting between (a) Mark Zelden, Director, Centers for Faith and Opportunity Initiatives, and (b) employees or representatives of Sedera Health, among others, on or around December 6, 2017, including any calendar entries, emails and other written communications about the meeting, agendas, lists of meeting attendees, minutes, summaries, handwritten notes, talking points, transcripts, or materials displayed or exchanged during the meeting. Your search includes dates for all responsive records from November 1, 2017, through December 31, 2017.

Your request was received in our office on February 25, 2020, and assigned FOIA tracking number 889343.

A search for responsive records of the Office of the Secretary (OSEC) was conducted based on your request. No responsive records were located.

Additionally, if you are not satisfied with the response to this request, you may administratively appeal by writing to the Solicitor of Labor within 90 days from the date of this letter. The appeal must state in writing the grounds for the appeal, and it may include any supporting statements or arguments, but such statements are not required. In order to facilitate processing of the appeal, please include your mailing address and daytime telephone number, as well as a copy of the initial request and copy of this letter. The envelope and letter of the appeal should be clearly

marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." Any amendment to the appeal must be made in writing and received prior to a decision. The appeal should be addressed to the Solicitor of Labor, Division of Management and Administrative Legal Services, U.S. Department of Labor, 200 Constitution Avenue, NW, Room N2420, Washington, DC 20210. Appeals may also be submitted by email to foiaappeal@dol.gov. Appeals submitted to any other email address will not be accepted.
