An act relating to specialty license plates; amending ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058, F.S.; requiring the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to create a Florida Native license plate; establishing an annual use fee for the plate; providing for the distribution of use fees received from the sale of such plates; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (iiii) is added to subsection (4) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, to read:

320.08056 Specialty license plates. --

(4) The following license plate annual use fees shall be collected for the appropriate specialty license plates:

(iiii) Florida Native license plate, \$25.

## **Florida State Statute 196.081 with Disabled Veterans Property Tax Exemption VFW Priority #1**

**Background:** The current law was initially passed in 1933, when a home was just over \$5,000.00; and provided veterans of the Spanish American War, and the Great War (Now WWI), with a \$500.00, if they had a VA Recognized disability of at least 10%. This was during the Great Depression, and almost 10% of the current property value. More recently, only after a recent adjustment, most veterans, with a 10% - 100% (not-Permanent & Total) receive a \$5,000.00 Property Tax deduction. With the average of most homes in Florida; at about \$ 200,000.00 this is about 2.5%. This does not consider the Housing CPI, and/or is not indexed to housing costs, within the State of Florida.

- The current State of Florida Disabled Veterans Property Tax Exemption, Florida State Statute 196.081 was initially passed in in 1933, and was \$500.00 when an average home was about \$ 5,100.00 - 5,500.00. Which was approximately 9.75% of the average Florida home value in 1933.
- The current Disabled Veterans Property Tax Exemption, in Florida State Statute 196.081 does not include any index to inflation of housing property values, or property taxes, or increased cost since the law was first enacted in 1933. We should advocate for an updated calculation or index based upon the original intent and application of the Florida State Statute passed into law in 1933.
- The current Disabled Veterans in Florida are not receiving the intended support intended under the law. We therefore should advocate the Florida Legislative to update the current Florida Statute 196.081, to reflect that an equity should be established at least 9% of the current market value of the property value, with a Grandfather clause to protect any older veterans who may have property who value would not benefit for such an adjustment.

We Recommend, that the Florida Legislature; adjust Florida Stature 196.081 for Disabled Veterans to receive 9% Disable Veterans Property Tax Exemption; for the State of Florida, for the modification of the current Florida State Statute 196.081 to provide for an annualized housing index for Veterans Disabled Property Tax

Exemption, under the original Florida State Statute 196.081, at 9% total value of Disabled Veterans Property Tax Exemption of the primary residence for all Florida Residents. Additionally, with a Grandfather Clause to protect any older veterans who primary residence property value would not benefit

under such a disabled veteran's property tax adjustment, receive at least the current \$ 5,000.00 deduction.
