Arizona Recount

Here are some of my takeaways from the tour of the audit yesterday:

Increase in capacity now:

From 17 to 32 paper inspection tables using microscopic cameras

From 20 to 44 counting tables (yellow, green, blue)

From 4 to 12 aggregation tables

The pace is picking up daily

More audit forensics are done each day

Theoretically, mail-in ballots should all be of the same type, composition, and fiber with little to no variance. So if variances ARE seen, there should be an explanation, if there is no explanation, then that is a gap.

703 precincts were condensed down to 175 precincts. Every precinct has different ballots. Thus, if your ballot was "printed on demand", then the paper in those situations could legitimately vary... but the paper should not vary for mail-in ballots.

We now DO have the deleted databases folder

1. Despite news accounts, it really WAS deleted.

2. It was CyFIR who discovered this and they are none other than the firm who discovered the June 2015 US Gov't Office of Personnel Management (OPM) breach where SF86 forms used for Top Secret security clearances were compromised. The bad guys had been infiltrated into OPM for three years.

3. Sample scenario:

Ballot box's pink slip says 200 ballots contained in the box. Really only 99 physical ballots are actually IN the box. There should be TWO cross-references to verify this. The Dominion machine would have a batch number corresponding to that grouping of ballots AND Dominion should have the scanned imagery to similarly correlate to those ballots. Where are the remaining 101 ballots? Are they imaged in Dominion? Is their batch number tallied in Dominion?

Constituent questions:

Will the AZ Audit be enough?

Yes, because it will inform legislation necessary to plug the gaps to restore the public's confidence.

What has been the media's role?

The media have served to fragment and erode our confidence.

Will it be provable?

Contrary to her claims, Secretary Hobbs' concern of contamination of the tabulator machines is completely baseless. CyFIR's standard operating procedures for data collection are Read Only capabilities such that nothing can be altered. Everything is also provably videoed. Dominion itself

declined the invitation to observe the AZ Audit.

Will the AZ Audit's results be legally actionable?

Potentially, yes. Indeed, intent versus accidental sloppiness is determinable.

Bottom Line: The left redefines "evidence" to be proof. The way it really goes is you have enough evidence to proceed with investigation and discovery. Then you determine the conclusion based upon proof. Example: You go outside and the ground is wet. Was it due to rain? Was it your neighbor's sprinklers? Was it morning dew? One needs more information for proof. If the courts and media stop you, then you will never discover the proof to know the truth.

Summary to the audience from Cyber Ninjas CEO:

1. This has never been done before.
2. It's really important for our democracy to be transparent
3. Unfortunately, technology has gotten in the way rather than helping.
4. Where will we be if voters think their votes don't matter anymore?
5. We have a solid AZ Audit team that is ready and capable to get it done.
6. This is a calling. We will overcome any and every obstacle.
7. Can't wait till it's over so that the participants can talk all they want about what they've seen!
8. Physical data collection completed by the end of June. The report will follow sometime later.

Feedback from a floor volunteer who is a retired USAF pilot

1. Chain of custody procedures are as precise and flawless as Strategic Air Command's. Signing off of authenticators' "secrets" was not as stringent as the AZ Audit! Going to the bathroom for 10 minutes requires a sign-off.
2. Laughable that the AZ Secretary of State said her machines were compromised when she initially said they were unhackable.

Procedures on the floor:

1. All volunteer counters must be from Maricopa county and have voted in the November 2020 election. (skin in the game)
2. Tally sheets and ballots can physically move only if 3 things are present:
People
Paper
Camera
3. Three components to the AZ Audit layout: Counting - Aggregation - Forensics.
4. Every worker treats the process on the floor as if he were in a court of law.

I will put out more info during my upcoming interviews about what I saw.

Cyber Ninjas is precisely what kind of firm to be able to lead this audit?

- They are an application security company, which has allowed a quick understanding on how election system applications work in detail.
- Their modus operandi is to perform Threat Modeling.
- That is: They figure out ways a system can be attacked.
- How to identify a threat and protect against it.
- They find what the artifacts are in order to prove activity did or didn't happen.
- This was used in designing the audit scope.

Steps to the AZ Audit

1. Phase 1 - Canvassing - Currently indefinitely delayed by the AZ Senate.

- Did you vote?
- Does it match?
- There have been innumerable reports of mismatch anomalies.
- Was the voter registration history changed?

2. Phase 2 - Physical ballots

- Actual ballot counting: Everyone can relate to the concept of counting paper ballots.

Maricopa volunteer counters must have voted in the Nov 2020 election. No determination whether the counter volunteer is a Republican or a Democrat.

If a count is off by more than 1 person per 50 ballots counted, then the ballots are recounted

- It takes approximately 8 seconds to count a ballot. There is no way to coordinate or sully this very precise process. "There is no speed without accuracy."

-
- Paper examination table uses digital single-lens reflex (DSLR) cameras.
 - 0% chance of damaging ballots
 - Determines which oval was marked and if marked by a human.
 - Analyzes fibers of ballot material and barely-detectable yellow-dot watermarks.
 - Every last ballot should be able to be accounted for.

Bottom Line: Opposition pushback may be an indication of the more questionable areas to investigate.

3. Phase 3 - Electronic Voting Systems

- Digital capture of all voting systems provided is completed.

WI-REP-21-0928-A-000006

- CyFIR followed industry best practices with write-block devices that prevented any hard drive from being changed.
- Analysis of the data captured is ongoing.

4. Phase 4 – Results

- Numbers from various phases will be compared against the certified results.

Cyber Ninjas CEO overall observations:

1. Americans must be able to trust how one's vote is cast.
2. A judge's scope of expertise does not tend to include higher math or computer systems.
3. However, EVERY American understands how to count and for the counting to be done at the local community level.
4. We should go to paper only.
5. We should be counting at the precinct level.
6. We should declare voting day a national holiday, so everyone can vote and participate in the counting.
7. Even Canada's federal election is paper only.

What now could Pennsylvania (PA) do, if it wanted to pursue a comprehensive AZ-level audit?

In theory, the PA State Senate's "State Government Committee" can issue a subpoena on behalf of the PA State Senate to start an in-depth audit of a PA county.

Arizona welcomes ALL states to adopt this gold-standard of a process to ensure free and fair elections for 2022.

Assembly Passes 6 Election Reform Bills

[AB 179](#) – Prohibits employees of long-term care facilities from influencing a resident’s decision to vote or which candidate to vote for. It also requires administrators to notify the resident’s family of when Special Voting Deputies will be conducting in-person absentee voting at the facility.

[AB 198](#) – Prohibits clerks from fixing any errors on absentee ballots. If there is an incomplete certificate envelope, the clerk must mail the ballot back to the voter and post notification of the error on the voter’s MyVote page. It also includes penalties for election fraud committed by election officials.


[AB 201](#) - Requires the Elections Commission to create a standard absentee ballot request form, requires municipalities to post updates on absentee ballots and requires voters to enclose a copy of their ID when applying for absentee ballots. It also addresses absentee ballots by indefinitely confined voters, automatic receipt of absentee ballots, and unsolicited mailings of absentee ballot applications and ballots.

[AB 271](#) – Any municipality that broadcasts their canvassing procedures must treat it as a public record by recording it and retaining it for 22 months.

[SB 203](#) – Prohibits ballot harvesting by limiting the collection event to only one site, staffed by members of the clerk’s office and can only occur during the 14-day early voting period. It limits a person to returning only two ballots on behalf of others, and allows voters to apply and return absentee ballots via for-profit delivery services such as UPS and FedEx.

[SB 210](#) – Provides election observers uniform access of 6 feet throughout all stages of the election process – Election Day, central count and recounts. Observers must wear a name badge but it may not advocate for candidates. Observers may not interfere with voters or hinder election officials.

These bills will now head to the Governor’s desk.



Middle Class Tax Cut

I mentioned [earlier](#) that the state will collect \$4.4 billion more than expected by the end of the 2021-23 budget cycle. Republicans plan to pass a \$3.4 billion tax cut for our middle class by lowering income and property taxes. By the end of 2023, the average Wisconsin family will save about \$1,200 in income and property tax relief. This proposal would eliminate the personal property tax, abolishing one more tax. This is an opportunity to give money back to Wisconsinites, not spend it frivolously.

Worker Shortage Will Continue

The Governor vetoed a [bill](#) that would end the additional federal benefits for unemployment recipients. The largest benefit gives recipients an extra \$300 per week and this extra money is keeping people at home rather than in the workforce. If you've been out to eat lately, you probably noticed the struggle that restaurants are facing, along with many other types of businesses. Apparently, Governor Evers likes to encourage people to stay home while Wisconsin businesses suffer from it.



The audit that is underway by the State Auditor's Office may do such an audit but it would be at their discretion and they are completely independent of the legislature once the Audit Committee provides them with the scope statement.





Assembly Passes 6 Election Reform Bills

[AB 179](#) – Prohibits employees of long-term care facilities from influencing a resident’s decision to vote or which candidate to vote for. It also requires administrators to notify the resident’s family of when Special Voting Deputies will be conducting in-person absentee voting at the facility.

[AB 198](#) – Prohibits clerks from fixing any errors on absentee ballots. If there is an incomplete certificate envelope, the clerk must mail the ballot back to the voter and post notification of the error on the voter’s MyVote page. It also includes penalties for election fraud committed by election officials.


[AB 201](#) - Requires the Elections Commission to create a standard absentee ballot request form, requires municipalities to post updates on absentee ballots and requires voters to enclose a copy of their ID when applying for absentee ballots. It also addresses absentee ballots by indefinitely confined voters, automatic receipt of absentee ballots, and unsolicited mailings of absentee ballot applications and ballots.

[AB 271](#) – Any municipality that broadcasts their canvassing procedures must treat it as a public record by recording it and retaining it for 22 months.

[SB 203](#) – Prohibits ballot harvesting by limiting the collection event to only one site, staffed by members of the clerk’s office and can only occur during the 14-day early voting period. It limits a person to returning only two ballots on behalf of others, and allows voters to apply and return absentee ballots via for-profit delivery services such as UPS and FedEx.

[SB 210](#) – Provides election observers uniform access of 6 feet throughout all stages of the election process – Election Day, central count and recounts. Observers must wear a name badge but it may not advocate for candidates. Observers may not interfere with voters or hinder election officials.

These bills will now head to the Governor’s desk.



Middle Class Tax Cut

I mentioned [earlier](#) that the state will collect \$4.4 billion more than expected by the end of the 2021-23 budget cycle. Republicans plan to pass a \$3.4 billion tax cut for our middle class by lowering income and property taxes. By the end of 2023, the average Wisconsin family will save about \$1,200 in income and property tax relief.

This proposal would eliminate the personal property tax, abolishing one more tax. This is an opportunity to give money back to Wisconsinites, not spend it frivolously.

Worker Shortage Will Continue

The Governor vetoed a [bill](#) that would end the additional federal benefits for unemployment recipients. The largest benefit gives recipients an extra \$300 per week and this extra money is keeping people at home rather than in the workforce. If you've been out to eat lately, you probably noticed the struggle that restaurants are facing, along with many other types of businesses. Apparently, Governor Evers likes to encourage people to stay home while Wisconsin businesses suffer from it.

We want a replication of the Maricopa AZ audit. I know you saw it, are you pushing for this to happen in Wisconsin?



Historic \$3.4 Billion Tax Cut

No budget is perfect, but this one seems to be a good balance of investing in infrastructure, schools, healthcare and higher education, while still providing the largest tax cut in the history of the state. The [budget bill](#) passed both houses with bipartisan support this week and here are a few highlights:

Taxes - These tax cuts are not the usual, temporary kickbacks you've seen in prior budgets. These cuts are permanent, and will have long-lasting, positive results for Wisconsin taxpayers.

- * \$2.3 billion income tax cut in the third rate from 6.27% to the smaller 5.3% rate. This will affect married couples earning \$31,910 to \$351,310 and singles earning \$23,930 to \$263,480 per year.
- * Property tax cut: A typical family would save \$1,200 in income and property tax relief.
- * Exempts all active-duty military income, spending \$40 million over the biennium.
- * Created tax credit for childcare expenses to help get parents back into the workforce. An average tax reduction would be \$91 during 2022.
- * Keeping Unemployment Insurance taxes at the lowest level to make sure taxes are not raised on Wisconsin businesses.

Transportation - Borrowing less and investing more.

- * Includes \$300 million less than Evers' proposal in new bonding. The debt ratio is estimated to remain flat.
- * Increased funding for local roads and highways by \$25 million more than Evers' proposal.

Health

- * \$100 million more for nursing home reimbursement rates.
- * \$104 million to Direct Caregivers in Family Care.

Education

- * Increase of \$2 billion to K-12 schools.
- * Increased special education by 10% or \$86 million.
- * Increase in funding of \$14.5 million for autism services.

Eliminating Personal Property Tax

After the pandemic and Governor Evers' mandated shutdown, we need to hold down taxes on businesses. We are investing \$200 million to ELIMINATE the personal property tax to help businesses, both small and large. The personal property tax is financially burdensome and difficult to comply with. These bills are usually miniscule, and most times the accountant fee exceeds the actual tax bill. The entire process is complicated and time-consuming. Assessing and collecting the tax is also an inefficient use of time and resources for many municipalities when compared to its generated tax revenue. Wisconsinites have been trying to repeal this tax since 1916.

I voted in favor of this budget and I would encourage Governor Evers to sign this sensible proposal.
