Re: Sunshine Law Request

Dear Custodian of Records:

Pursuant to the Missouri Sunshine Law, Mo. Rev. Stat. § 610.010 *et seq.*, American Oversight makes the following request for records.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that your office produce copies of the following records within three business days:

1. All records reflecting communications (including emails, email attachments, text messages, messages on messaging platforms (such as Slack, GChat or Google Hangouts, Lync, Skype, or WhatsApp), telephone call logs, calendar invitations, calendar entries, meeting notices, meeting agendas, informational material, draft legislation, talking points, any handwritten or electronic notes taken during any oral communications, summaries of any oral communications, notes taken during or summaries of any meetings, materials exchanged during meetings, or other materials) between (a) the officials listed below, and (b) Mike Lindell, or anyone communicating on Lindell's behalf.
 - a. Secretary of State John R. Ashcroft
 - b. Anyone serving in the capacity of Chief of Staff, assistant, or scheduler to Secretary of State Ashcroft
 - c. The senior-most person in the Office of the Secretary of State tasked with managing election security or integrity.
2. All communications of the officials listed in part 1 of this request regarding Mike Lindell, his claims of election fraud, and/or his effort to conduct canvassing regarding the 2020 election.

Please provide all responsive records from November 3, 2020, through the date the search is conducted.



Fee Waiver Request

In accordance with Mo. Rev. Stat. § 610.026.1(1), American Oversight requests a waiver of fees associated with processing this request for records. Disclosure of the requested records is in the public interest because it will likely contribute to a better understanding of relevant government procedures by the general public in a significant way. Moreover, the request is primarily and fundamentally for non-commercial purposes.

American Oversight requests a waiver of fees because disclosure of the requested information “is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of [a] public governmental body.”¹ The public has a significant interest in potential communications or meeting between Mike Lindell and Missouri state officials.² Records with the potential to shed light on this matter would contribute significantly to public understanding of operations of the government, including whether and to what extent state officials are communicating with Mike Lindell. American Oversight is committed to transparency and makes the responses agencies provide to public records requests publicly available, and the public’s understanding of the government’s activities would be enhanced through American Oversight’s analysis and publication of these records.

This request is primarily and fundamentally for non-commercial purposes.³ As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, American Oversight does not have a commercial purpose and the release of the information requested is not in American Oversight’s financial interest. American Oversight’s mission is to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and Twitter.⁴

American Oversight has also demonstrated its commitment to the public disclosure of documents and creation of editorial content through regular substantive analyses posted to its website.⁵ Examples reflecting this commitment to the public disclosure of documents and the creation of editorial content include the posting of records and analysis related to the organization’s investigations into misconduct and corruption in

state governments;⁶ posting records and analysis of federal and state governments' responses to the Coronavirus pandemic;⁷ posting records received as part of American Oversight's "Audit the Wall" project to gather and analyze information related to the Trump administration's proposed construction of a barrier along the U.S.-Mexico border, and analyses of what those records reveal;⁸ and the posting of records related to an ethics waiver received by a senior Department of Justice attorney and an analysis of what those records demonstrated regarding the Department's process for issuing such waivers.⁹

Accordingly, American Oversight qualifies for a fee waiver.

Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

- Please search all locations and systems likely to have responsive records, regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics. RANSOMWARE

BUSIEST DAYS OF THE YEAR — As retailers prepare for what is sure to be a complicated holiday shopping season, another threat beside low inventory and supply chain woes will be on the top of retailers' mind: ransomware.

In the past year, retailers have increasingly found themselves battling ransomware gangs. Sophos Labs [estimates that retail was the most-hit sector](#) in 2020, tied with education, with 44 percent of organizations struck. And heading into Black Friday, the cyber risk assessment company BitSight estimated [in a report this morning](#) that about 60 percent of the retail sector is at a "heightened risk" of ransomware attacks because of poor cybersecurity practices, including slow patching of vulnerabilities.

That spells bad news for retailers, which are already struggling to keep up with consumer demand and delayed shipping estimates due to long-brewing supply chain struggles.

"Given the economy overall is recovering from Covid impacts, this is an even more important shopping season than there probably has ever been," said Simon Jelley, general manager and vice president of product at the cybersecurity firm Veritas Technologies.

— **Part of a trend:** Malware has long been a Black Friday and Cyber Monday concern. In 2019, security threat researchers at SonicWall Capture Labs [estimated that 129.3 million malware attacks](#) were deployed during the week of Thanksgiving, a 63 percent increase from the year before.

— **Not helping much:** Ransomware criminals have a tendency to strike when businesses are at their most vulnerable. For instance, a

couple of weeks before Halloween, U.S. candymaker Ferrara [disclosed that ransomware had encrypted its systems](#), leaving it with only “select manufacturing facilities” up and running.

Retailers are still ahead of the cyber curve compared with some other sectors, but they still have a ways to go to protect them from ransomware gangs this week, Jelley told MC. While they tend to have meticulous data back-ups, which can speed up ransomware recovery, Jelley said those back-ups might not be centralized and few retailers test how quickly they can access those systems.

“Ensuring that you’ve got resiliency in place for your central backup infrastructure is something that [retailers] can immediately do,” Jelley said, adding that ransomware hackers have increasingly targeted data backups as their techniques advance.

ON THE HILL

ALL EYES ON THE SENATE — The fate of lawmakers’ most ambitious cybersecurity mandates depends on the Senate after the House [passed the social spending package on Friday](#) and senators [postponed consideration](#) of the [National Defense Authorization Act](#) until after Thanksgiving.

While many of those mandates have bipartisan backing, it still won’t be an easy road ahead:

— **FISMA faltering**: Late Thursday evening, Senate Armed Services Chair [Jack Reed](#) (D-R.I.) included a variety of cybersecurity measures in a substitute amendment he was trying to pass, including an update to government agencies’ cybersecurity standards.

By Friday morning, the 2021 update to the Federal Information Security Management Act was [gone from Reed’s substitute amendment](#), indicating the latest FISMA update is struggling to make the cut. The House’s version of the NDAA also lacks a similar amendment.

— **Incident reporting differences**: If senators’ latest [consensus agreement on mandatory cybersecurity incident reporting legislation](#) makes it through, House and Senate lawmakers will have to address a looming issue with the Biden administration: which agencies should receive these reports? So far, provisions in both the House-passed

NDAA and the Senate bill would only require critical infrastructure operators and contractors to report incidents to CISA. But the FBI is starting to [request that forthcoming laws require those reports](#) be sent to it as well.

— **CISA funding:** Republican lawmakers, who have questioned giving CISA billions in new funding this year without proper audits and discussions, could push back on the roughly \$865 million CISA would receive from the [Democrats' social spending package](#).

CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

INCIDENT REPORTING BLUEPRINT — U.S. banks and their federal regulators have until May to start abiding by new mandatory cybersecurity incident reporting rules, marking one of the first test cases for how such mandates will work as lawmakers rush to cover all critical infrastructure sectors.

The [industry's new rules](#), issued late last week, differ from congressional efforts in a key way: the timeline. Whereas lawmakers are working to give most operators and federal contractors a 72-hour timeline to report significant incidents to CISA, banks will have just 36 hours from discovery to give notice. The Federal Reserve, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. and the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency signed off on the rules.

— **Setting up a fragmented system** : While lawmakers are pushing to include mandatory incident reporting for all critical infrastructure sectors in the NDAA, several sector regulators are pursuing their own rules. The Transportation Security Administration required [mandatory reporting for pipeline operators](#), and it's said to be [eyeing similar rules for the railroad and aviation industries](#).

— **Tight turnaround time** : Banks might not have to deal with the rapid 12-hour notice that pipelines are facing, but their new

turnaround still isn't a walk in the park. "That's a short timeline," said Whitney Merrill, a former FTC attorney and current data protection officer at Asana, [in a tweet](#) about the new rules. "For anyone who has tried to hit 72, it's tough. I wish there was a clear consistent timeline for all companies though."

VULNERABILITIES

KNOWLEDGE DROP — The FBI, CISA and Coast Guard Cyber Command [updated their warning Friday](#) about advanced hacking groups targeting known exploits in the password management tool Zoho ManageEngine ADSelfService Plus. In the update, the agencies provide more details about the types of tools the groups are using, including a Chinese language web shell known as Godzilla and two types of trojans. The ADSelfService Plus warning was first issued in September.

— **Which vulnerability is it, anyway?** The agencies said they cannot confirm that the groups are targeting only one previously reported vulnerability. As such, "it is key that network defenders focus on detecting the tools listed above in addition to initial access vector," the agencies said.

INVESTOR SCAMS — Cybercriminals appear to be targeting investors in their most recent phishing scheme by sending emails about fake concerns about unauthorized transactions and suspicious trading activity, the [Securities and Exchange Commission warned](#) on Friday. The agency said the suspects are using the names of real SEC employees in both phone calls and email messages to investors. However, the SEC said it doesn't make "unsolicited communications" asking for payments related to enforcement actions or trades.

"Be skeptical if you are contacted by someone claiming to be from the SEC and asking about your shareholdings, account numbers, PIN numbers, passwords, or other information that may be used to access your financial accounts," the agency said.
