A friendly reminder that we have our first agency overview meeting with LFB on **Thursday, January 21 from 10:00am-12:00pm in GAR**. The first meeting will focus on DOT.

As Sen. Marklein mentioned, we have put together agency summary/review packets for the major agencies. The agency review for DOT is attached.

The documents are set up in the following way – with a few additional notes to keep in mind as you review them.

1. Core Agency Mission
2. List of Major Functions and Programs by Division
 - a. *The positions listed by division are accurate as of December 19, 2020. This is a moment in time snapshot.*

i. It should also be noted that

“the internal organization of agencies and the allocation of positions to organizational sub-units is determined administratively by each agency...an agency may generally divide and allocate position authority of an appropriation to more than one organizational sub-unit...an organization sub-unit may be staffed by positions that are authorized under different appropriations.”

- . Historical GPR Funding
- 4. All Agency Funding Sources
- 5. Historical Employee Count
 - a. *The historical GPR funding, all agency funding sources, and historical employee count are pulled from the LFB budget summaries. These numbers are accurate at the time of the budget passage in that biennium and do not account for funding/position changes implemented during subsequent legislation/action.*
 - b. *For the 2021-2023 budget, the numbers listed are pulled from the agency budget request.*
- 6. Current Vacancy Rate and Number of Vacant FTE
 - a. *Vacancies are accurate as of November 21, 2020. This is a moment in time snapshot.*
 - b. *Beginning March 20, 2020 a hiring freeze was instituted for executive branch agencies due to COVID-19. Therefore, positions vacant for less than 9 months have generally become vacant subsequent to the implementation of the hiring freeze.*
 - c. *Note that the number of total positions listed throughout the document may not all equal each other due to the data being pulled from different sources at different times.*
- 7. Agency Lapse Plan
 - a. *The Governor required GPR agencies to lapse money in FY 20 (~\$70 million) and FY 21 (~\$300 million). For GPR agencies, the required lapses are show by appropriation (information from LFB).*
 - b. *As of today, we do not have final FY 21 lapse information from LFB. LFB is working to get it from DOA.*
- 8. Act 201 Budget Reduction Plan
 - a. *2015 WI Act 201 required that each executive state agency, in its biennial budget request, include a proposal to reduce the agency's state operations budget for each fiscal year of the next biennium by 5% of the agency's base level of funding.*
 - b. *Some agencies take this more seriously than others – as you will see as we go along.*
