

Agreement for Professional Services

When executed by both parties, this letter constitutes the engagement of Allied Special Operations Group, LLC ("ASOG" together with its affiliates) by the Louisiana Department of State ("Client") to provide consulting services ("Services") as set forth on Exhibit A hereto.

SERVICES, COST, TERM, AND PAYMENT

ASOG is hereby engaged to provide Services on behalf of Client. We anticipate billing executive team members at the hourly rate of \$225.00/hr., cyber technicians and others at the hourly rate of \$175.00/hr., plus any applicable out-of-pocket expenses and sales tax.

Client agrees to pay a retainer of \$ 5,000.00 upon execution of this agreement. Any unused portion of the retainer will be refunded or applied to future tasking as directed at the Client's sole discretion.

This Agreement will commence on the date of its execution and will be from the date of execution of this Agreement until terminated as provided herein. Any net payment due for services or out-of-pocket costs incurred in connection with the engagement will be made within fifteen (15) days following receipt of each invoice by Client.

Subsequent specific tasks requested by Client and applicable costs will be agreed upon by Client prior to initiating and will be memorialized by an attachment to this Agreement signed by all parties.

ASOG's engagement hereunder may be terminated by either Client or ASOG at any time, without cause, upon forty-eight (48) hours prior written notice to the other party, it being understood that the provisions under headings "Services, Cost, Term, and Payment," "Additional Documents," "Nonexclusivity," "Authority," "Notices," "Standard of Care," "Limitation on Liability," "Indemnification," "Confidentiality," "Assignment," and "Governing Law and Venue" shall survive any such termination.

The parties agree that they will execute such additional documents as shall be reasonably required to evidence or clarify the intent of the parties contemplated by this Agreement.

NONEXCLUSIVITY

ASOG and Client shall be free to render or receive professional services to and from others and to engage in other activities, so long as the Services rendered and received under this Agreement are not impaired thereby.

AUTHORITY

The parties agree that ASOG shall operate as, and have the status of, an independent arm's length contractor and shall not act as or be a partner, agent, co-venturer, or employee of any other party. No party shall have any right or authority to assume or create any obligations or to make any representations or warranties on behalf of any other party, whether express or implied, or to bind the other party in any respect whatsoever.

INDEMNIFICATION

Line (10) There should be at least 3, but no more than 5, public hearings for the evaluation of the voting system in a large venue for the public to express their opinions and bring in experts.

Page 7 of 12 add.

Line (22) add - **, and the division of administration, and the Attorney General no later than December 1, 2021.**

Observation:

The period, September 1 – December 1, should be reviewed. It needs to be extended – basically you have 2 ½ months with the Thanksgiving holidays at the end of November. That is not enough time for public hearings to be held and for the commission to educate themselves about the different voting systems available and for the vendors to plan several public equipment shows.

Line 27 (10) "Secure Paper Ballot" means a unique ~~layered~~-paper ballot that supports watermarks or ~~crypto-marking capability produced~~ any other security measures that are produced per election by the secretary of state and distributed based on inventory-controlled counters printed on the forms and accounted for per precinct with all ballots including used, unused, and spoiled ballots, returned at the end of each election.

“(CRS) 1-5-601.5 requires...compliance with...2002 Voting System Standards...this forensic examination found that a substantially large number of these requirements have not been met.”
- Halderman Declaration, 1:17-CV-2989-AT, Curling v. Raffensberger:
“My July 1, 2021, expert report describes...flaws that would allow attackers to install malicious software on the ICX,...with temporary physical access...or remotely from (EMS)...Nor do these problems affect (GA) alone...It will be used for accessible voting in...Colorado”
