Secretary Lee and Brad....

Deeply appreciate the good meeting you had with Terri, Katherine and I on November 29 relative to the internal control procedures and enforcement necessary to bolster election integrity within Florida.

A few matters have/are occurring in the interim giving us even greater pause for concern.

One is the attached video. some approximately 300 plus potential new voters arriving in Maitland, Orange County, just last Friday morning, Jan. 28. This video (now censored incidentally by someone to all of the recipients of it, on my own and numerous other cellphones), begs the question as to what internal control measures will you enforce statewide to assure that none of these folks are registered to vote in Florida, as long as that remains illegal? Recognizing that You will likely not be helped in those efforts by the Democratic officials within the counties and municipalities targeted for the receipt of these citizens of other sovereign nations. Police officials in The City of Orlando for example, and in Maitland, have confirmed to us that they have been told to stand down with respect to these new Florida illegal arrivals by their respective City and County government hierarchy. We also have video of caravans of SUVs bringing these new potential voters to Altamonte Springs several weeks ago.

The second matter are the recent actions of Merion County Supervisor of Elections Wesley Wilcox. As of last week, Supervisor Wilcox has become an avid supporter of the notion of extending November 2024 eligible voting days by three to four days, for Ocala, in Marion County. If this is the new accepted standard, as now being promoted by Supervisor Wilcox in his current influential capacity as The President of The Florida Supervisors of Elections, and to the extent the Department of State supports this for statewide application.....the following will need enforced to assure that this does not contaminate accurate results and fair elections, going forward...

- A complete prohibition on any pre-counting of any kind of these early cast votes.
- Should this not be done, an application of a public notice hourly, of pre-count results and all Voter information to the extent participating, are made available to the public in an open forum. This way, as to any advantage that can be taken of advance counting information, both sides can equally and fairly take advantage of that advance benefit, whatever that may consist of.

We are fully aware that the ESS voting systems, most dominantly used in Florida, have a module allowing a periodic pre-tabulation of votes submitted early (before election day). Obviously, the best solution here is the elimination of early voting and early counting, **and a return to an election day as opposed to an election week.**

Recognizing you have now received a torrent of information on Florida registration anomalies, were happy to summarize all of these key areas in one concise table requiring investigation and corrective action within the state voter rolls ahead of our meeting. Another area requiring corrective action will be the activity in Seminole County, which we see as illegal, of selecting ad hoc election canvassers beyond the intent of those officials who must serve as Canvassers (The Chief Judge, The County Commission Chair, and The Supervisor of Elections) according to a strict application of state statute. A group has separately requested the computer "cast voter rolls" from Seminole County, we will now elevate this to a valid and enforceable FOIA request, as the county has just today elected to provide in response only the highest-level total results summary information, as opposed to the complete cast voter roll file requested for review.

Let us know when we can follow up, either in person in Tallahassee, or by zoom

Ahead of our meeting today wanted to meet our prior commitment to you to send along an exhaustive highspot review done of various anomalies within the published voter roles for our largest counties. This work product was produced by Wes Huff, over the past few months, using the published voter roll data as the primary source.

The statistical analysis of various of the various unusual issues requiring further review and questioning, reveals that county by county far different application of statute appears to occur in respect to keeping the rolls up to date and compliant.

We will not exhaustively review this today in the call.....but it does indeed provide an excellent resource form which the State Auditor General and team could engage productively in looking into various issues within the voter registration data as a start to their important work. As well, would provide an excellent starting point for the new enforcement agency being established by the governor for work to be done. Particularly in respect to the categories where certain published voter addresses clearly do not comply with the law, and enforcement actions need taken.

The basis of a clean, transparent, unchallengeable election process as a foundational topic, is the maintenance of accurate and complaint voter rolls, consistently across all of our Florida Counties.
