1. We learned yesterday that the software update planned for the Tarrant County Hart Voting System Jan 6, 2022, is being moved up to next week.

That means the three attached preservation demands we had in place for the May and June 2021 elections AND any later detailed forensic exams you may find necessary for your audit of the Nov 2020 election will be at least partially in jeopardy UNLESS forensic images of all the relevant Hart devices are made BEFORE the updates. We have an easy and convenient means available for Heider Garcia's staff to be able to do this under their control.

Dan Bates and Bill Fearer, our attorneys, will be filing the appropriate request on our behalf with Heider Garcia our Election Administrator and Tarrant County officials and we hope you will communicate the necessity of these forensic images for the data you need to be preserved also.

Our Citizens for Election Integrity Texas group (ceitx.org) is non-partisan and has 130+ volunteers dedicated to 1 legal vote cast = 1 legal vote counted. While focused on Ft. Worth and Tarrant County we also follow election integrity issues across Texas and the country. Dan Bates, a Principal at Decker Jones here who you may know, heads our legal team.

Our 4 findings are as follows:

- Voter roll and voting issues in Ft. Worth and Tarrant County shown in the attached 81 pages of voters from vacant lots, fictitious addresses, PO Boxes, excessive numbers of votes from a single address, etc., etc. NOTE THIS FILE CONTAINS THE PERSONALLY IDENTIFYING INFORMATION WE HAVE SHARED WITH SHERIFF BILL WAYBOURN WHICH MUST BE APPROPRIATELY SAFEGUARDED.
- An attached analysis from Dr. Douglas Frank showing Tarrant County voting in Nov 2020 able to be predicted with .999 accuracy based solely on age and Registrations with virtually the same graphs also produced for Harris, Dallas and Collin Counties. This could not have occurred naturally.
 - Significant voting reconciliation issues
 - Significant voting equipment processing issues

We all seek election integrity excellence. Our findings indicate we are falling far short of this. There are many unanswered questions.

Should you wish to preview our findings before we are able to meet, we would be happy to do so on a call or video conference.

Also, similar findings are turning up in Harris, Dallas and Collin Counties to many we have found in

Tarrant County. We have close relationships with Alan Vera, the Head of Republican Election Integrity in Harris County, as well as Precinct Chairs in each of these counties that we would be happy to share.

We in these 4 counties are all concerned that the planned audits will not be complete and independent and would like to work with you to make them so. To this end, the requirements for a real and complete forensic audit from Scott Britton of our team are attached with the portions highlighted that are not yet included in the planned SOS audits put in place before your appointment.

The results in Virginia and New Jersey last Tuesday only serve to emphasize the criticality of vigilance with regard to voter rolls, voting systems with far fewer vulnerabilities and extremely close legal and poll watching scrutiny to detect and prevent any malfeasance in the voting process.

We look forward to speaking with you in Ft. Worth to discuss our findings and how we can assist you in advancing election integrity excellence in Texas.

PRIMARY RUNOFF ELECTIONS AND DECLINE IN VOTER TURNOUT

Near-Universal Decline in Turnout. Turnout declined between the primary and the runoff in 240 of the 248 regularly scheduled primary runoffs in the U.S House and U.S. Senate from 1994 to 2020. In other words, in 97% of primary runoff elections fewer people voted in the second round than in the

first. The average decline in turnout was 38% and the median decline was 37%.

Despite the typical decline in the number of voters in runoff elections, in the Fort Worth Mayoral election runoff in June, 2021, there was a 30.5% increase in the number of voters over the number of voters in the primary election.

In the May Election, the total number of votes for City of Fort Worth Mayor was 66,658.

In the Runoff election in June, the number of votes was 87,072 votes.






First Time Voters County Wide





You are eligible to register to vote if:


- You are a United States citizen;
- You are a resident of the county where you submit the application;
- You are at least 17 years and 10 months old, and you are 18 years of age on Election Day.
- You are not a convicted felon (you may be eligible to vote if you have completed your sentence, probation, and parole); and
- You have not been declared by a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be either totally mentally incapacitated or partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote.

A voter registration agency shall provide a voter registration application form to each person who is of voting age and a United States citizen in connection with the person's application for initial services, and also in connection with any recertification, renewal, or change of address, unless the person declines in writing to register to vote. Added by Acts 1995, 74th Leg., ch. 797, Sec. 33, eff. Sept. 1, 1995.

- Health and Human Services
- Any SOS approved agency that provides public assistance or services to persons with disabilities
- Department of Public Safety (Driver Licenses)



Voter Opportunity Score – Calculation

- $$\text{Voter Opportunity Score} = \frac{\text{Number of times a voter has historically voted}}{\text{Total opportunities a voter has had to vote}}$$
 - Total opportunities a voter has had to vote
 - IF (Estimated Age – 17) > (Maximum Number Of Elections in Voter History File)
 - THEN (Maximum Number Of Elections in Voter History File)
 - ELSE (Estimated Age – 17)
- Lower score indicates a voter has voted infrequently compared to the opportunities they've had
- This formula can be rolled up at a precinct level to target initial precincts for canvassing
 - Replace numerator with the total number of times all voters in a precinct voted
 - Replace denominator with the total opportunities all voters in a precinct have had to vote


1. Voter Rolls must be cleaned up with public oversight
2. A Forensic Audit of all Paper, Electronic, and Mail in Ballots to ensure 1 vote for each legitimate voter
3. More oversight including regular audits of voting systems to be reported back to the citizens
4. Canvassing as required as part of a forensic audit
5. Transition from electronic voting system to secure paper ballots

IMMEDIATE CALL TO ACTION

- **Forensic Inspection of the Ballots and Voting Machines**
- **Evidence presented here clearly shows anomalies found in the recent Tarrant County Election results per Texas Election Codes:**
 - TEC 1.015 – Resident Requirements
 - TEC Ch 13 – Application for Voter Registrations
 - TEC Ch 18 – Identifying Registered Voters
- **Texas Secretary of State has Called for a Tarrant County Election Audit**
 - Based on evidence presented here this needs to be a deep analysis of equipment, procedures and inspection of ballots versus a simple recount of suspect results
 - Needs to remove any doubt of whether we have fair and open elections
- **Establish Bi-Partisan Team to Begin Working to Review and Audit the Systems and Equipment within 60 Days**
- **Complete and Report Findings within 90 Days of Review Start**

Analysis of Tarrant County Nov 2020 Voting by Dr. Douglas Frank

- Dr. Frank 6th Polynomial Analysis
 - Based on Tarrant County population and the 1.2 million registered voters and the 830,014 voters who voted as provided by the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
 - The “Predicted” curve on the graph shows that the number of “voters” can be foretold based on the number of Registrations with a near perfect correlation of $R=0.999$. This can not occur naturally. This anomaly is compounded by very similar graphs being found for other Texas counties and counties across the country.



Possible Explanations for our Suspicious Findings and Dr. Frank's Graph

- Padding of the voter rolls, sometimes with new registrations very near the time of the election
- Electronic vote flipping to produce the desired outcome
 - Via any of the 10+ avenues afforded in the current generation of voting equipment
 - Can include flipping inactive voters to active, voting them, and flipping them back
 - Can be done by external intrusion or by election machine contractors with admin privileges
- Use of the inflated voter rolls to provide the "phantom voters" needed to cover the "votes cast"
 - registered voters who have not voted in a long time
 - deceased voters
 - non-US citizens
 - voters in multiple counties
 - voters from commercial addresses, PO boxes, vacant lots, non-existent addresses
 - large numbers of voters from a single address where such a large number could not possibly reside
 - "harvested" mail-in / absentee votes
 - etc., etc., etc.
- Clean up of the voting records following the election (including deletion of some of the records)

Items to examine in a Forensic Election Office Audit (version 1.0)

1. Verify the written standard operating procedures (SOP) of all election workers as well as poll workers. What is the process to distribute machines to voting locations? What is the process to retrieve machines from voting locations? What is the process to count votes?
2. Verify voter rolls. Examine complete database of voter rolls and compare this pre and post-election. Post-election electronic poll book should be identical to pre-election. Did any voters vote which should not have been allowed to (non-citizens, etc.,)? Did any voters vote that had commercial addresses? Did any voters vote that non-existent address (vacant lots, etc.)?
3. Verify all election system components agree with the State-approved hardware and software versions. Verify all software up to date as approved by the State.
4. Verify pre-election integrity tests.
5. Hand count all early voted paper ballots. Ensure counts match official election counts.
6. Hand count all mail in absentee ballots. Ensure counts match official election counts.
7. Hand count all day of voting paper ballots. Ensure counts match official election counts.
8. Open the case of multiple election scanner/tabulators (representative sample). Verify all components inside the scanner/tabulator and insure there are no wireless devices inside (whether active or not).
9. Verify all election management servers (EMS) are not connected to any type of network. Open case of EMS machines and verify there are no wireless devices (whether active or not). Examine all wires coming out of the EMS. Even wires going to a printer. Is the printer wirelessly enabled?
10. Verify ballot images of scanned ballots. If ballots are absentee, are all ballots 'marked by hand'? Look for evidence of photocopying ballots that were supposed to be marked by hand.
11. Verify signatures on envelopes of mail in ballots. Also verify any other critical information that is supposed to be present (driver's license, SSN, etc.)
12. Examine the provisional ballots submitted in an election. Were there an abnormal amount of provisional ballots?
13. Examine the Reasonable Impediment Documents/Forms (RID or RIF) submitted in an election. These forms are completed by voters in TX if they do not have a picture ID. Like if all they have is a birth certificate or a copy of a utility bill.
14. Determine if any ballots had to be 'cured' or re-created during the election process. Were representatives of both parties present at all times when a ballot was cured/re-created? (20K Runbeck printing issue, etc.)
15. Verify all chain of custody documents. Were all documents signed? Was the information correct (agreeing serial numbers, etc.) on the documents? Did the ballot issue count match what a voting location was provided? Did they lose any blank ballots?

16. Examine all paper ballots to insure the paper was the exact paper acquired from the supplier. (i.e. paper was not photo copy paper). Does ballot paper have any security measures embedded in it?
17. Take forensic images of all EMS machines. Examine images to insure all logons and security aspects. Examine logs to insure no network connections have been present. Examine user logon tables and verify all users are valid and have strong passwords (i.e. no anonymous logons and no old employee logons present).
18. Take forensic images of the scanner/tabulator machine. Examine images to insure all logons and security aspects. Examine logs to insure no network connections have been present. Examine user logon tables and verify all users are valid and have strong passwords (i.e. no anonymous logons and no old employee logons present).
19. Take forensic images of the ballot marking device/machine. Examine images to insure all logons and security aspects. Examine logs to insure no network connections have been present. Examine user logon tables and verify all users are valid and have strong passwords (i.e. no anonymous logons and no old employee logons present).
20. Verify the process by which the election office receives absentee ballots from the USPS. Does the election office send over a driver to pick up mail? Does this driver have representatives from the Ballot Board with them to pick up ballots? Does the USPS deliver ballots to the election office? Is this process logged somewhere?
21. Verify if any machines were programmed 'incorrectly' when set out to polling locations. One particular mistake that causes a 'hand fix/cure' of all ballots is if a scanner/tabulator is programmed for Early Voting when it is actually Day of Voting. The electronic tabulated results need to be entirely re-created in order for those electronic ballots to be counted in the EMS.
22. Look at personnel assigned to voting locations. Are the same Election Judge and Asst Election Judge assigned to the same voting location over and over again? Did all voting locations have partisan poll watchers? Where there any written complaints submitted by any Election Judges or Poll Watchers or Voters?
23. Perform statistical analysis on election results. Are election stats within the 'norms' of other elections? Examine voting by age groups. Examine voting by party, sex, location, etc. Examine any anomalies in voter turnout. Examine voting statistics by precinct number. Do these results fall in line with other elections?
24. Perform a manual canvassing of voters by going door-to-door. Pick out voters to canvass who:
 - a. Are on the voter rolls and that supposedly voted.
 - b. Are on the voter rolls but that did not vote.
 - c. Are not on the voter rolls. See if they voted, etc.

We are delighted to report very positive developments including one of your suggestions really paying off:

- Our Election Integrity event Jan 26th with Republican primary candidates at the Ridglea Theater attracted over 300 attendees, with widespread pickup after Louie Gohmert texted our video link (tarrantelectionintegrity.com) to 150,000 Republicans last Friday.

This has caught Judge Whitley's attention who has invited us to make a full repeat presentation to the Tarrant County Board of Supervisors in March.

A revelation coming out of Jan 26th video Session 4 is that the cost to conduct an all-electronic election in Tarrant County has gone from \$9 per registered voter in 2018 to \$30 this year (see attached graph), all with the vastly increased hacking potential of our "Rally site" internet transmission of "unofficial" votes to the main election office which then sit on an internet-connected server for the duration of the election (as discussed in Session 3). Denton County uses a hybrid much safer system of hand-marked paper ballots scanned into existing scanners then tabulated centrally for less than half the Tarrant County cost.

In Session 5 Dan Bates looks the candidates in the eye and asks why we are having to do their jobs for them?

Scores and scores of new volunteers are coming forward after Jan 26 and are signing up on the website now. New "whistle blowers" are also coming forward.

- Our Central Texas group has attracted Democrat volunteers and the head of the group, Paul Parker has been invited to serve on the Board of the Democratic group. Paul (214-280-7716) lives in Georgetown and continues to have major findings he would be only too happy to share with you and your staff.
- We are preparing training videos and live sessions with pastors across Texas featuring multiple short videos of a diverse set of presenters describing material blatant vote manufacturing by ballot harvesting and "over the top" dereliction of duty in conducting and reconciling various elections. This could be a good opportunity for you to enforce your call for honest elections if you would like to kick-off these videos.

- Unfortunately, our continued data mining across the 9 counties is now turning up material numbers of "changed votes" which we are continuing to investigate. As always, we are happy to share these findings with you and your staff.
- During the primaries and runoffs, we will be taking daily snapshots of county and SOS voting records and analyzing them. We will keep you posted on findings.
- Based on all this, it only makes sense to "look under the covers" making and examining forensic images of the servers in Collin County where there are cooperating officials at all levels. This can be done quietly and quickly.

We remain ready to serve you any way we can, we pray for you constantly and ask you to consider all 9 counties as a resource to you.






2020 Election Paper vs Electronic Cost per Vote

Our Citizens for Election Integrity Texas group (ceitx.org) is non-partisan and has 130+ volunteers dedicated to 1 legal vote cast = 1 legal vote counted. While focused on Ft. Worth and Tarrant County we also follow election integrity issues across Texas and the country. Dan Bates, a Principal at Decker Jones here who you may know, heads our legal team.

Our 4 findings are as follows:

- Voter roll and voting issues in Ft. Worth and Tarrant County shown in the attached 81 pages of voters from vacant lots, fictitious addresses, PO Boxes, excessive numbers of votes from a single address, etc., etc. NOTE THIS FILE CONTAINS THE PERSONALLY IDENTIFYING INFORMATION WE HAVE SHARED WITH SHERIFF BILL WAYBOURN WHICH MUST BE APPROPRIATELY SAFEGUARDED.
- An attached analysis from Dr. Douglas Frank showing Tarrant County voting in Nov 2020 able to be predicted with .999 accuracy based solely on age and Registrations with virtually the same graphs also produced for Harris, Dallas and Collin Counties. This could not have occurred naturally.
- Significant voting reconciliation issues
- Significant voting equipment processing issues

We all seek election integrity excellence. Our findings indicate we are falling far short of this. There are many unanswered questions.

Should you wish to preview our findings before we are able to meet, we would be happy to do so on a call or video conference.

Also, similar findings are turning up in Harris, Dallas and Collin Counties to many we have found in Tarrant County. We have close relationships with Alan Vera, the Head of Republican Election Integrity in Harris County, as well as Precinct Chairs in each of these counties that we would be happy to share.

We in these 4 counties are all concerned that the planned audits will not be complete and independent and would like to work with you to make them so. To this end, the requirements for a real and complete forensic audit from Scott Britton of our team are attached with the portions highlighted that are not yet included in the planned SOS audits put in place before your appointment.

The results in Virginia and New Jersey last Tuesday only serve to emphasize the criticality of vigilance with regard to voter rolls, voting systems with far fewer vulnerabilities and extremely close legal and poll watching scrutiny to detect and prevent any malfeasance in the voting process.

We look forward to speaking with you in Ft. Worth to discuss our findings and how we can assist you in advancing election integrity excellence in Texas.

Dear Secretary Scott,

Thanks again for our Ft. Worth meeting and we all so appreciate your openness and publication of the Phase 1 Audit results. Please regard us as supporters and a resource. Our prayers are with you, as the chief elections officer in Texas, and as you seek to “do the right thing.”

We share information developed through tireless efforts of citizens in participating counties to better understand the election processes and contribute toward safeguarding elections. You suggested that we broaden participation. We are seeking Independents, Democrats, and faith-based groups to join in our efforts.

The four “one-pagers,” attached, summarize findings clearly established in the data and report relevant behavior seen across the participating counties, **Tarrant, Harris, Dallas** and on a combined basis for **Travis, Bexar, Williamson, Bell and Hays**. Please recall, Scott Britton, a key technical leader on the Tarrant County team, resides and serves as a Precinct Chair in **Collin County**. He is close to the Election Administrator and Sheriff there and provides the insights into Collin County. Please use these findings as they relate to your Phase 1 Audit findings and inform on conducting Phase 2.

We summarize our findings as follows:

- Significant questions exist regarding Elections Administrator responses to the Phase 1 Audit.
- Discrepancies exist between the Secretary of State’s and the County Registration and Voting records because:
 - a. Tens of thousands of continuing disparities between the Secretary of State election data and the county election data, constantly changing and evolving long after the November 2020 election;
 - b. Scores and scores of changed voting records; and
 - c. **Unknown whether a.) and b.) are beyond innocent errors and occurring maliciously and / or because of dereliction of duty or incompetence (that a full investigation including a forensic audit would reveal). In all cases the magnitude of discrepancies signal we have problems and underlying vulnerabilities that must be acknowledged and addressed for this year’s Mid-Terms and beyond.**
- Separately from the above, we also continue to see and encounter **willful manufacturing of a material number of votes and the bullying / harassment of poll workers**.
 - a. As you know, we continue to properly submit voter registration residency challenges such as the 488 in September in Harris County that have not been acted on by the Elections Administrator.

John, you know our backgrounds. You've met us. We are not making this up. It is time to publicly acknowledge the vulnerabilities in our Texas voting systems meriting:

1. Further continuing attention to voter roll clean-up, enhanced reconciliation between Secretary of State and County registration and voting data and addressing voting systems errors; and
2. Working together openly across our state to reduce the vulnerabilities in our election systems that malicious actors continue to utilize to change / add votes.

We renew our strong suggestion that you obtain the perspective of Russell Ramsland on serious anomalies detected in our electronic voting equipment. Ramsland's willingness to meet when and where convenient for you has been confirmed. We stand ready to set up this meeting by your contacting any of us.

Complementing the four county Phase 2 Audits, a thorough independent forensic audit is merited. Collin County, with its cooperating Election Administrator, needs only your request to begin. Ramsland could take and analyze the forensic snapshots. This will provide additional data, one way or the other, as you and your staff continue to analyze the Phase 1 results, our findings and data, information and data received from others, and the forthcoming Phase 2 results.

We are happy to provide any additional information we obtain. Whether via phone, Zoom call, meeting in your office (as you will see below Paul Parker is close by), in Ft. Worth or any of our locations we remain willing to confer with you further.

Harris County

- Organized ballot harvesting rings operating with impunity.
- No credible chain of custody for critical election documents.
- Large discrepancies in precinct data between # of voters and # of ballots.
- Locally posted election data doesn't match what's sent to SOS.
- Fake photo IDs (TXDL) in use in last 4 elections.
- Poll watcher obstruction rampant and uncorrected.
- Improper cancellation of mail ballots surrendered by voters at polls.
- Widespread "errors" allowing thousands of provisional voters to vote regular ballots.
- EA refusing to take required action on 5,300 voters with illegal residence addresses.
- Military mail ballots sent out without complete L&A test.
- L&A tests have been chaotic for last 2 years.
- EA not running "hash code tests" on election equipment.
- EA training of election judges and workers is totally unsatisfactory.
- Chaos at election night equipment turn-in causing election judges to quit.
- Election workers remain unpaid by temp agency contracted by EA.
- Electronic poll books missing mail ballot voters in 3 of last 4 elections.
- Assignment of election judges and clerks is in chaos with inexperienced EA staff.
- Deceased voters still on the voter rolls—some 19-26 years after their deaths.
- Information on individual voters is continually altered on the daily voter roster.
- EA continues to require election workers to wear masks, despite Governor's order.
- Over 33% of ED polls in November 2021 opened late due to equipment problems.,
- Help lines for election judges are understaffed---judges on hold for over an hour.

Dallas County Texas, November 3, 2020 General and Joint Election Previous Elections Administrator

10s of thousands of vote roster anomalies identified, including but not limited to:

- Absentee Ballot Reported Returned 3 to 27 Days after Return Date by Dallas County.
- Absentee Ballot Reported Returned Prior to Being Requested.
- Absentee Early Vote purged in early voting and in Final Vote Roster.
- Absentee Early Vote Reported Only by Texas SOS.
- Absentee Early Vote Roster Entries - Differences in Timeliness of Reporting between Dallas County and TX SOS.
- Absentee Vote changed to VOTER VOTED AT POLLS in Final Vote Roster.
- Absentee Vote Not Reported by Texas SOS for Dallas County.
- In-Person Early Vote changed to VOTER VOTED BY ABSENTEE BALLOT in Final Vote Roster.
- In-Person Early Vote Not Reported to Texas SOS by Dallas County.
- In-Person Early Vote Prior to October 13, 2020, the first day of early voting.
- In-Person Early Vote Reported Only by Texas SOS.
- In-Person Early Vote reported only in Final Vote Roster as VOTER VOTED EARLY IN PERSON.

Additionally:

- Registrations at approximately 68 postal business locations with no residential address provided.
- 201 potential irregular votes cast, found by concerned citizens in brief opening research of votes cast from P.O. Boxes or postal businesses with no residential address provided.
- 15 out of 15 votes from one virtual business address with no residential address provided have voter registration irregularities, including APT # misrepresentation written on many applications.
- 3 out of 15 votes from one virtual business address with no residential address provided, or 20%, have MISSING REGISTRATIONS.
- 3 votes cast from one address with no record of registration show as In-Person Early Vote, begging the question, "HOW DID VOTERS NOT REGISTERED CHECK IN AND CAST A VOTE IN PERSON?" Did these "people" actually "check in" and "vote in person" or were the e-pollbooks and voting machines hacked - inserting, voting and deleting VUID's in the days right around the election, as discovered in other states?
- 1 vote from the virtual business address investigated shows a Registration Application signed SIX (6) MONTHS AFTER the 3 November 2020 general and joint election.
- 5,039 more votes reported on TX SOS website than on Dallas County website at end of early voting
- Texas Election Code (TEC): Sec. 52.0061 appears potentially violated by county judge and previous elections administrator. Ballots were reprinted WITHOUT NOTIFYING the Secretary of State according to General Counsel of TX SOS office showing no record. This was concurrent with negotiating, announcing and receiving fifteen million dollars from Zuckerberg funded CTCL.

Bexar, Bell, Hays, Travis and Williamson Counties

- Voters interviewed in all counties comparing method of voting in 2020 election to state and county records
 - Significant discrepancies found in all counties, including:
 - Voters who claim to have voted in 2020 but State and County records show them as not voting
 - Voters who did not vote but records indicate a vote in their name
 - Voters who voted in person but their record indicates voted Absentee ballot
 - Thousands of instances where SoS and County records do not match
 - Ex: Williamson County voter VUID 1136046061
 - She said she voted Early In-Person like she has done for years
 - SoS records shows she voted Absentee
 - Williamson Cty record shows no vote
- 10 – 16% of voter records surveyed did not reside at the voter registration address as of Oct '20.
- Dead voters and voters who have moved still on the rolls after over 20 years: Bexar County VUID 1065931583 passed away in 2000; VUID 1066637932 moved to CA and registered there in 1985, still registered in Bexar. Some Travis County voters have made repeated unsuccessful requests to their county to have their obsolete registrations removed.
- There are a minimum of 22 fraternity/sorority houses on the voter rolls in Travis County with 766 registrations. Of these, 168 are 35 years old or older with a dozen of those voters over the age of 65, and one age 97 (VUID 1140096738).
- One county’s audit logs for the November 3, 2020, election shows an anonymous user logged in to the system at 2:17 pm and updated Voter Registrations data. Multiple hundreds of voter registrations were changed at exactly the same time and date stamp.
- Bexar County has failed its legal requirement to fulfill a PIA request within 10 business days. Request for voter records (ref # R008505-120521) was issued 12/5/21 and has still not been completed as of 1/18/22 despite repeated follow up requests.
- Unusual distribution of registered voters from mail store locations. Voters disproportionately concentrated in a few stores. Frequent use of “APT” or “STE” to describe a mail box address.

Tarrant County

- 81 pages of suspicious findings
 - Votes counted from vacant lots, addresses which don't exist, P.O. boxes, inaccurate registered voter roll addresses, excessive multi voters at addresses that can't accommodate the numbers, etc., etc.
- Suspicious Texas Phase 1 Audit findings and EA response
 - 700+ Tarrant County potential non-US citizen registrations
 - 2,000+ discrepancies in 7 sampled precincts between the Precinct Report and Electronic Count / Hand Count
 - Failure to disclose the Runbeck printing error that resulted in the Ballot Board manually remaking 20-30k Absentee ballots the day of and day after the November 2020 Election.
 - Misstatements regarding 11,700+ surrendered Absentee ballots that were voted in-person
- Only 30% accuracy in May and June 2021 Tarrant Election Day "Register of Official Ballots" Reconciliations of the number of cast votes cast across all in-person voting locations
 - 3,300+ more ballots cast than ballots issued
 - 38,000+ ballots un-accounted for
 - Since 2019 Tarrant County has disabled reconciliation of voting locations with central reporting or by Precincts making it difficult to identify how votes entered the election system
- Race total reconciliations between electronic voting at polling locations and paper ballots produced at polling locations do not exist. The paper ballots are collected by polling locations but reported by Precinct. Race totals are reconciled after the election and before certification by the County Commissioners by comparing the original USB drive to a copy of the USB drive made during the Election.
- As far as we know, Tarrant County is the last remaining county in Texas with Internet transmission of "unofficial" votes, accumulated "unofficial" votes held on an Internet-connected server with voting tabulations run, all totally capable of being monitored or changed by hackers from the 1st day of Absentee and Early In-Person Voting through to Election Day
- \$1.6 million grant coming from Mark Zuckerberg distributed by the CTCL (Center for Tech and Civic Life) was made to Tarrant County for the Nov 2020 elections
 - The grant was offered by CTCL on 10/12/2020 and formally accepted by the county on 11/3/2020.
 - The grant was a 21% "boost" in Tarrant County election spending
