We have completed the attached open records request. We compiled the documents into a single PDF file and are sharing them with you via our secure file sharing system called Kiteworks. You should have received an email with instructions for accessing the file.

When we identified an email chain, we printed the most recent exchange containing previous emails rather than providing redundant copies of the same email. We also did not include duplicate email attachments.

We made redactions of personal cell phone numbers and email addresses pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72 (a) (20)(A). Lastly, we redacted records that reveal public employees' home addresses according to O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(B)(21).

Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 50-18-71(c)(1), cost associated with this request totaled **\$60.37**, which is based on 2.25 hours of administrative time at \$20 per hour; 15 minutes of attorney management time at \$61.50 per hour.



Dear Counsel:

Please complete and return the attached argument form to me no later than **Friday, April 1, 2022**. If there is a pending motion regarding argument in your case please complete section B and note the pending action. I will contact you should I need updated information after the disposition of the motion.

The Court has not yet confirmed what the Courtroom protocols and access allowances for the April argument session will be. The Clerk will notify you as soon as there is guidance to share.

In the meantime, we will proceed with our preparations for the April session as we currently are for the March session. Please see the following link to the Clerk's document outlining attorney COVID protocols for the March session

https://www.supremecourt.gov/announcements/March_2022_argument_COVID_protocols.pdf. Courtroom access has been limited to the Justices, essential Court personnel, arguing counsel in the scheduled cases and one co-counsel each, and journalists with full-time press credentials issued by the Supreme Court. The Courtroom has been closed to the public, and a live audio feed of the arguments has been available on the homepage of the Court's website.

We have been asking attorneys who planned to be in the Courtroom to take a Court-provided PCR COVID test the day before argument. These tests have been administered at a MedStar Health facility at 1120 20th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. at either 8:15am or 8:30am. Should we continue with this process, MedStar will contact you via email a few days prior to your test date with additional details related to setting up a patient portal and the precise time to report. We ask that attorneys either sign a waiver so that test results can be reported by Medstar directly to the Court, or report the results to the Clerk (sharris@supremecourt.gov) promptly after receiving them. (The waiver form will be available at the testing facility.) Counsel have also

been encouraged to obtain a PCR test independently within 72 hours of argument date, in order to facilitate planning for a remote argument in the event of a positive test.

Again, we will reach out to confirm what the April argument session protocols are when that information becomes available.



Below is information concerning the April 2022 oral argument session.

1. *COVID testing.* Arguing counsel and co-counsel planning to attend argument are asked to take a PCR COVID test on the morning before argument (including Sunday before a Monday argument). The Court will arrange for testing at a downtown medical facility at Court expense. We expect that results of those tests will be available by early afternoon on the day that they are administered.
2. *Remote argument.* An arguing attorney who receives a positive test will not argue in person, but will instead be expected to participate remotely by telephone connection to the Courtroom. While we hope that the chances of this occurring are small, counsel should give some advance consideration to the telephone setup that they would use in the event that it is necessary. Our experience with telephonic arguments has been that use of an iPhone or comparable cellular phone with wired earbuds worked well, so long as the cellular signal was strong in that location. Attorneys who have participated in the Court's telephonic arguments could also choose to use the same setup that was used previously. The best sound quality in those arguments was obtained through a traditional landline (not a "Voice over Internet Protocol" line) with a commercial-grade conference speakerphone that supports full-duplex calling, *i.e.*, a telephone that allows someone speaking to hear clearly when another person on the line is speaking as well. Questioning by telephone would follow the same format as in the Courtroom.
3. *Courtroom procedures.* Assuming that test results are negative, counsel should report to the Lawyers' Lounge by 9:15 am on the morning of argument. Counsel can enter through the north door (facing Maryland Avenue), and we ask that you not enter before 8:45 am. Please note that there will be no access to the Court cafeteria or Library for counsel on the day of argument. At the meeting in the Lawyers' Lounge, we will go over Courtroom procedures and answer any last-minute questions. Counsel in the first case of the day can then move to the Courtroom. If there is a second argument, counsel in that case will remain in the Lawyers' Lounge until the first case breaks, and then will move promptly to the Courtroom for argument. Audio of the argument will be made available in the Lawyers' Lounge. Counsel in the first case will be expected to leave the Courtroom and the building after the first case is finished. Use of masks is optional for counsel that received a negative PCR COVID test result the day before argument.


