**Re: Public Records Request**

Dear Public Records Officer:

Pursuant to the Arizona Public Records Law, A.R.S. §§ 39-121 *et seq.*, American Oversight makes the following request for records.

Following the November 2020 election, members of the Trump campaign's legal team and individuals seeking to overturn the election results coordinated with members of the Arizona legislature in an attempt to affect the election's certification.<sup>1</sup> Later, many of these same individuals remained involved in the Arizona Senate's partisan "audit" of Maricopa County's election results.<sup>2</sup>

American Oversight seeks records with the potential to shed light on efforts to alter the results of Arizona's November 2020 election and the subsequent "audit" undertaken by the Arizona Senate. American Oversight does not seek records at issue in ongoing litigation against the Arizona Senate nor records over which the Arizona Senate has asserted a claim of privilege.

**Requested Records**

American Oversight requests that your office promptly produce the following records:

All electronic communications (including emails, email attachments, complete email chains, calendar invitations, text messages, or messages on messaging platforms, such as Slack, GChat or Google Hangouts, Lync, Skype, or

Please provide all responsive records from November 3, 2020, through the date the search was conducted.

Please note that American Oversight does not seek records currently at issue in litigation against the Arizona Senate, and American Oversight has specifically excluded communications with any individual or entity over whose communications the Arizona Senate has previously claimed privilege.<sup>3</sup>

Please note that American Oversight does not seek, and that this request specifically excludes, the initial mailing of news clips or other mass-distribution emails. However, subsequent communications forwarding such emails are responsive to this request. In other words, for example, if one of the listed officials received a mass-distribution news clip email from someone communicating in an email address ending in [@frankspeech.com](mailto:@frankspeech.com), that initial email would not be responsive to this request. However, if that official forwarded

that email to another individual with their own commentary, that subsequent message would be responsive to this request and should be produced.

### **Statement of Noncommercial Purpose**

This request is made for noncommercial purposes. American Oversight seeks records regarding attempts to alter the certification of the November 2020 election and the subsequent partisan “audit” of Maricopa County’s election results by the Arizona Senate.<sup>4</sup> Records with the potential to shed light on this matter would contribute significantly to public understanding of operations of the government, including regarding the involvement of actors external to the Arizona legislature.

Because American Oversight is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, this request is not in American Oversight’s financial interest and is not made for a commercial purpose. American Oversight’s mission is to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and Twitter.<sup>5</sup>

Because this request is made for noncommercial purposes, American Oversight requests that any fees charged in connection with processing this request be limited to copying and postage charges, if applicable.<sup>6</sup> Please notify American Oversight of any anticipated fees or costs in excess of \$100 prior to incurring such costs or fees.

### **Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records**

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

other direct messaging systems (such as iMessage, WhatsApp, Signal, or Twitter direct messages), voicemail messages, instant messaging systems such as Lync or ICQ, and shared messages systems such as Slack.

- In conducting your search, please understand the terms “record,” “document,” and “information” in their broadest sense, to include any written, typed, recorded, graphic, printed, or audio material of any kind. We seek records of any kind, including electronic records, audiotapes, videotapes, and photographs, as well as letters, emails, facsimiles, telephone messages, voice mail messages and transcripts, notes, or minutes of any meetings, telephone conversations or discussions.
- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted. To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to the email.
- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages.
- If any records are withheld in full or in part, pursuant to A.R.S. § 39-121.01(D)(2), please provide an index of records or categories of records that have been withheld and the reasons the records or categories of records have been withheld.
- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

Dear Representative Finchem,

As the Editor of Prescott eNews, in Prescott, Arizona, I have been made aware by many citizens in Yavapai County that continuing serious questions linger regarding the recent national and state elections as to their authenticity and questions of voter fraud. As Chair of the State Legislature's Committee on Federal Relations, I am asking you the following questions;


1) Are our State legislators at all interested in getting to the bottom of questions and concerns that citizens across our state have re: the recent elections and their legitimacy? Indeed we are. While many of us have been accused of "doing nothing" or "not doing enough" there are several factors at work. The first order issue to consider is the election is over. We are now in the process of litigation. Every possible legal theory is being evaluated for protecting the personal voting franchise; after all is said and done, this is the full measure of consent of the governed. When the election of our leadership is interfered with, voters are disenfranchised, and the consent of the governed drains away. It is replaced with fraud of the highest order. The most important legal theory under examination right now is the plenary authority noted in Article II Section 1 of the U. S. Constitution. It says, "*Each State shall appoint, in such Manner as the Legislature thereof may direct, a Number of Electors, equal to the whole Number of Senators and Representatives to which the State may be entitled in the Congress.*" It is our view that when there is controversy, it is the under the plenary power of the State Legislature to fulfil this duty to take care that all legal votes are counted and all

fraudulent votes are found and purged from the count in order for us to have clarity as to who is to receive the Electoral College votes from Arizona.

2) Are our State legislators impotent to act on behalf of We the People? If they are so impotent, as a State Representative, what do you advise us to do? We are only impotent if we do not act. There are a number of actions that are in motion at this moment. People are calling the Governor's office demanding that the Legislature be called into special session to take up the controversy and properly assign the Electors to the candidate who has won the highest vote count of legal votes. To do that we must hear testimony and receive evidence. I have requested that the Speaker of the House, Russell Bowers, approve a hearing held by the Federal Relations Committee for next Tuesday to take testimony and hear evidence that there is sufficient cause to suggest that Maricopa County and Pima County votes are either properly tabulated and awarded to the correct candidates, or that they have been manipulated and awarded in some other manner. It is alleged that a CIA system called Hammer and an application called Scorecard that calculates the vote count needed for a specific candidate to win, and then reallocates those votes fraudulently, has been used in this election. We have a responsibility to verify that is not the case, and that all ballot tabulation equipment did in fact operated properly, awarding votes to the right person.

3) In my research, I understand if a majority of the members of our legislature vote to hold a special session for the purpose of subpoenaing certain selected election officials and subpoenaing said officials for the purposes of attempting to answer the myriad of questions citizens have regarding this recent election, that the session can be held. You are correct, however, typically the Speaker of the House approves the hearing. From time to time there have been hearings on a number of matters from water regulations to energy generation that have not been approved by the speaker. However, to exercise investigative authority and the use of subpoena's, I am under the understanding that the Speaker's approval is required. There is a legal theory that because this is not a state office matter, the super majority requirement for the Legislature to call itself back into session does not apply, rather the plenary power of the Legislature is untethered to state statutes because of the federal office. That means the Article II Section 1 language rules supreme.

Please be advised that Pima County Recorder, located at 240 N Stone Ave, Tucson, AZ 85701 in Pima County Arizona and the Democratic Party added "fraud votes" in the initial count to the Vote-By-Mail (VBM) totals released at 8pm on Nov 3rd 2020.

There were approximately 35,000 fraud votes added to each democrat candidate's vote totals. Candidates impacted include county, state and federal election candidates. Through the utilization of the automated ballot count machines in Pima County Elections, my understanding is that 35,000 was embedded into each democrat candidate's total votes.

Below are the meeting notes:

In a meeting I was invited to by the democrat party in Pima County Arizona on Sept 10th 2020, no phones or recording devices were allowed, a presentation was given including detailed plans to embed 35,000 in a "spread configured distribution" to each democrat candidate's vote totals.

When I asked "how in the world will 35,000 be kept hidden or from being discovered", it was stated that "spread distribution will be embedded across the total registered voter range and will not exceed the registered voter count, and the 35,000 was determined allowable for pima county based on our county registered voter count". It was also stated that "total voter turnout versus total registered voters determine how many votes we can embed. The embedding will auto adjust based on voter turn-out." Because the "embed votes are distributed sporadically all embedded votes will not be found, if audited, because the embeds are in groups of approximately 1,000. This is so the county recorder can declare an oversite issue or error as a group of 1,000 is a normal and acceptable error." "Maricopa County's embed totals will be substantially higher than Pima due to embeds being calculated based on the total number of registered voters."

When I asked "has this ever been tested? and how do we know it works?" The response was "Yes, this has been testing and has shown significant success in Arizona Judicial Retention Elections since 2014 even undetectable in post audits because no candidate will spend the kind of funds needed to audit and contact voters to verify votes in the full potential of total registered voters which is more then 500,000 registered voter. This year our Secretary of State has removed precinct level detail for election night releases so canidates can't see precinct over-votes".
