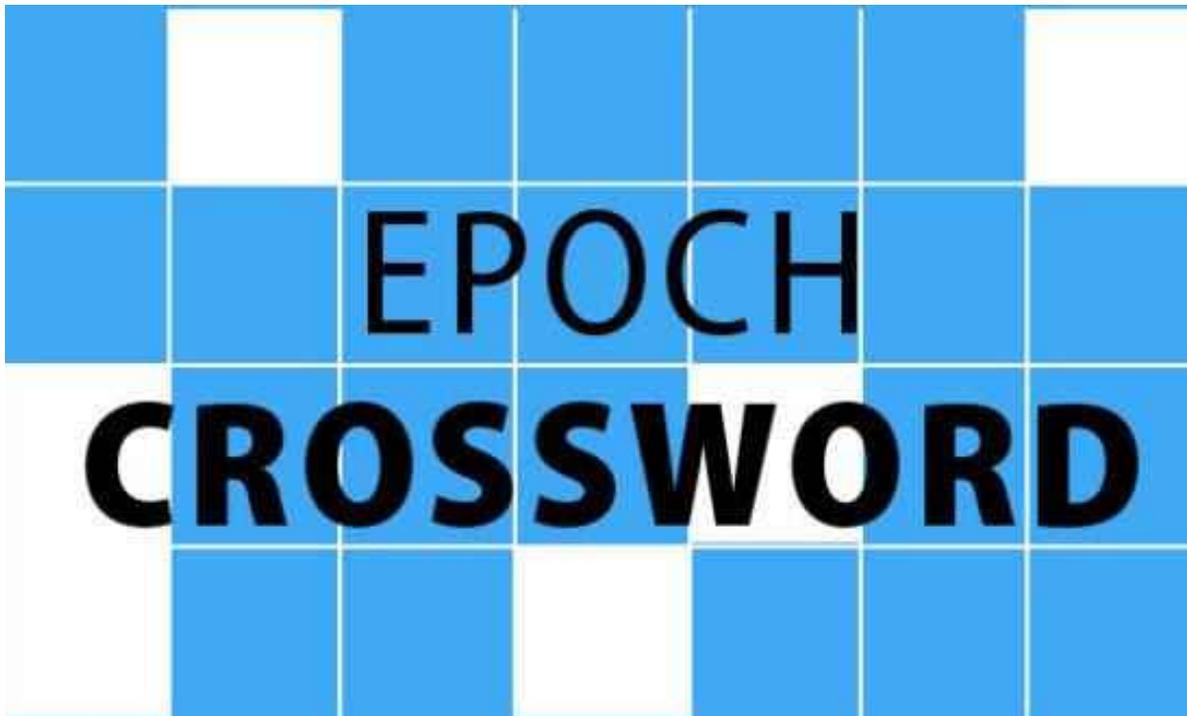

## Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine is a target for hackers

The European Medicines Agency (EMA), which is currently helping to roll out two coronavirus vaccines, has been hit by hackers, the organization said Wednesday. Attackers successfully accessed “some documents relating to the regulatory submission for Pfizer and BioNTech’s COVID-19 vaccine candidate,” according to a BioNTech statement. A spokesperson for Moderna, another company working with the EMA on a vaccine candidate, told CyberScoop the firm had not been informed it was affected by the breach. It’s just the latest hacking effort aimed at entities working on coronavirus research, as nation-states and criminals alike seek to steal valuable intellectual property or undermine confidence in vaccines. **Shannon Vavra has more.**

## AI Jazeera anchor files suit in alleged hack-and-leak

An AI Jazeera anchor, Ghada Oueiss, is alleging in a U.S. federal court that the crown princes of Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates helped to coordinate a hack-and-leak operation intended to intimidate and disparage her. The civil lawsuit, filed Wednesday in Miami, says the scheme centered on disseminating manipulated financial documents and photos of the journalist, who has been critical of both countries' alleged human rights abuses. The campaign against her included a breach of her iPhone, court documents say. It's one of several suits filed in the last several years involving journalists and dissidents allegedly ensnared in nation-state cyber-operations meant to intimidate or silence. **Shannon has the court documents.**

The annual Pwnie Awards for "celebrating the achievements and failures of security researchers and the security community" were announced today at the virtual Black Hat Europe conference. Winners included the discovery of the "[checkm8](#)" bug for jailbreaking Apple devices and the "[Zerologon](#)" attack allowing for credential spoofing within Microsoft's Netlogon protocol. The "Epic Achievement" award went to researcher Guang Gong for working out a method for remotely breaking into the root level of Android devices. Microsoft took home the "Most Epic Fail" award for a vulnerability in Windows 10 [discovered by the NSA](#) . **See the full list of winners.**

## US, Australia partnering on virtual cyber range

U.S. Cyber Command recently announced that the U.S. and Australia are working together to continuously develop a virtual cyber training range. The Cyber Training Capabilities Project Arrangement will incorporate feedback from the Australian military into the Persistent Cyber Training Environment, Cyber Command's simulated training domain. Officials say the range is a new approach, given that similar efforts by U.S. and its allies in the past

### What's in a name

Identity verification technology company ID.me quietly deployed a powerful form of facial recognition on unemployment benefits applicants while encouraging state partners to dispel the idea that the company used the technology, according to Oregon state records that the American Civil Liberties Union shared with CyberScoop. Privacy advocates say the documents raise concerns

### New technical details from the Iranian state TV hack

An Iranian state television broadcast was hacked Jan. 27, during which a video showed opposition figures and called for the death of the Iranian supreme leader. A group called "Predatory Sparrow" claimed responsibility, without proof, and the hack was just one in a series of incidents seemingly aimed at embarrassing the Iranian government. ## Biden's first SolarWinds question

At the first White House press briefing of the Biden administration Wednesday evening, Press Secretary Jen Psaki's second question was on the SolarWinds breach. Psaki indicated the U.S. government may be interested in responding to the suspected Russian espionage operation, which has impacted federal agencies and the private sector. "We've spoken about this previously...of course we reserve the right to respond at a time and manner of our choosing to any cyberattack," Psaki told reporters. ## \$5.1 million penalty in health insurer's data breach

New York health insurer Excellus has agreed to pay a \$5.1 million penalty to the federal government in connection with a data breach

that affected more than 9 million people between late 2013 and May 2015. The fine is for violations of privacy and security rules under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, according to the Department of Health and Human Services' Office for Civil Rights. The incident happened during an era known for high-profile data breaches — Target, Sony, Home Depot and so on — but the announcement of the fine comes as the feds are continuing to track multiple cyberthreats against health care organizations. **Joe Warminsky has the story.**

The attackers made a “simple mistake in their attack chain,” the researchers said, by not securing the pilfered information properly once it was uploaded to websites for temporary storage. In short, not only did people have their email credentials stolen, but they were also posted in a way that Google's search engine could publicly index them.
