In response to your public records request pursuant to La. R.S. 44:1 et seq, which our office received on September 07, 2022, the information you requested has been processed. You sought records related to the following:

**“1. All email communications (including emails, email attachments, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments) sent by Attorney General Jeff Landry and Solicitor General Elizabeth Murrill from May 2, 2022 at 7:30 PM CT through May 3, 2022, and from June 24, 2022 through June 25, 2022.  
2. All text messages or messages on messaging platforms (such as Slack, GChat or Google Hangouts, Lync, Skype, Twitter direct messages, Facebook messages, WhatsApp, Signal, Telegram, or Parler) sent or received by Attorney General Jeff Landry and Solicitor General Elizabeth Murrill from May 2, 2022 at 7:30 PM CT through May 3, 2022, and from June 24, 2022 through June 25, 2022.”**

After a diligent search, our office has identified records which are responsive to your request. Copies of these records are available for download from our office's Public Records Center. Our office is withholding over 70 communications that fall under the attorney work product (La. R.S. 44:4.1(C)) and attorney-client communications (L.C.E. Art. 506) privileges, as well as six communications that are exempt under the deliberative process privilege. Our office is also withholding one email regarding private health information of employees. In addition, our office has made necessary redactions in released material of information that was previously mentioned as exempt.

Our office may have redacted information from released records. If redactions were not noted above, any redactions made were to personally identifying information (PII). PII includes certain financial account information (La. R.S. 44:4(41)), Social Security or driver's license numbers (La. R.S. 44:4(57)(a)), or patient healthcare data (La. R.S. 44:4(58)). In addition, PII may include information that, if released, may allow for identity theft to occur. These pieces of information include dates of birth, telephone numbers, or one's mother's maiden name. La. R.S. 14:67.16. Because identity theft may occur, our office redacts this information, as well as other private information, under La. Const. Art. 1, section 5.

**Subject:** Proclaimed Holidays

The following holidays have been proclaimed as Legal State Holidays:

- Monday, May 30, 2022 – National Memorial Day – Proclamation No. 62 JBE 2022
- Friday, June 17, 2022 – Juneteenth Day – Proclamation No. 60 JBE 2022

All LADOJ Offices will be closed on these dates in honor of these holidays.

Leave slips are **not** required for holidays; however, **eligible employees are required to enter 8.0 LH in CATs in order to receive holiday pay compensation for both of these proclaimed holidays.**

Timekeepers, please be sure to audit the entries for those employees within your sections. Reminder: Employees who are on 8.0 hours of leave without pay the day before and the day after the holiday, are not eligible for the holiday pay. Timekeepers must notify Shea Malbreaugh in Human Resources ([MalbreaughS@ag.louisiana.gov](mailto:MalbreaughS@ag.louisiana.gov)) to ensure compliance for these employees.

LADOJ Policy Excerpt: Employees shall be eligible for compensation on holidays observed except:

1. When the employee's regular work schedule averages less than twenty (20) hours a week.
2. When the employee is a temporary, intermittent, or seasonal employee.
3. When the employee is on leave without pay immediately preceding and following the holiday period.

**Alternate Work Schedules:** If a Holiday falls on an employee's regularly scheduled day off, the employee should request to use either the day before or the day after the holiday as their alternate holiday. Reminder, alternate holidays must fall within the same week for non-exempt employees. Ex: John works four (4) ten (10) hour days and his normal day off is Friday. John will use Thursday, June 16<sup>th</sup> as his alternate holiday. Eligible employees are required to enter the LHDH hours in CATs in order to receive holiday pay compensation for the alternate holiday. Timekeepers must notify Shea Malbreaugh in Human Resources ([MalbreaughS@ag.louisiana.gov](mailto:MalbreaughS@ag.louisiana.gov)) to ensure compliance for these employees.



# DHS to expedite asylum process

Deportations also will speed up, agency says

The Department of Homeland Security has detailed a plan to manage the expected increase in illegal crossings at the southern border after a pandemic-related border restriction is lifted next month.

Outlined in a memo issued amid bipartisan pushback to the Biden administration's decision to end Title 42 on May 23, the department says it will streamline processing to avoid overcrowding; increase sanctions for repeat crossers; and reach bilateral agreements with countries that migrants pass through on their way to the United States.

Homeland Security has increased staffing by 600, returned about 500 agents back to the "vital border security mission," and plans to increase Customs and Border Protection custody capacity by 5,000 extra people by May 23, the memo issued Tuesday said.

A previous planning document released by the agency in late March, said preparations for higher migration scenarios would require thousands more law enforcement officers, medical providers and other staff.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention on April 1 cleared the way for Homeland Security to end the controversial health policy, which allows U.S. officials to quickly expel in the interest of public health "non-citizens" trying to enter the country.

But court challenges could delay the termination.

In response to a lawsuit from Arizona, Louisiana and Missouri's attorneys

It also created an incentive for many more to try crossing illegally numerous times because of reduced penalties under Title 42, immigration experts and shelter staff said.

When Title 42 is lifted, Customs and Border Protection will not only resume regular immigration processing but "maximize" expedited removal, senior officials said on Tuesday.

About 30% of migrants that agents encountered at the border since March 2020 have attempted to illegally enter the U.S. more than once — and as many as 10 times, some told agents and aid centers. Processing times under Title 42 were reduced to about 15 minutes.

A migrant shelter director in Sonora said it was like "a carousel."

La Divina Providencia, a migrant aid shelter in the border city of San Luis Río Colorado, started seeing many people they had sheltered come back after they had already departed. Often the same day.

"We couldn't admit them again; we would be fomenting illegal crossing. This (shelter) was so people could get their life back in order," said Martin Salgado, the son of the center's late founder and now the president of the council at La Divina Providencia. They turned repeated crossers away, but do not deny them food or clothing.

Salgado said he believes Title 42 was very attractive to migrants because they were not detained. Contrary to the prediction of other shelters, he forecasts a decrease in the number of people arriving in the border city.


