See attached spreadsheet extract.

Today's Absentee data file shows two accepted ballots for the same NCID#. The first was voted two days ago in Forsyth but that entry shows no Precinct, Congressional or Legislative District for them which usually indicates they are not qualified to vote in this election for some reason. The second record shows it was voted yesterday in Cabarrus County as an SDR and both show "ACCEPTED" as their status today.

My concern is if the Forsyth ballot was not actually counted and the status is in error, would that not create a differential between their number of ballots scanned and the number who voted when they shut down the night before?

Two issues: Curbside and Poll Worker not asking names and addresses

•**A note about curbside.** (It was the last slide in my PP. Point it out to the judge. Write it up in SEIRS.. The statute needs revision big time. The only excuse they will give you is that it is more efficient.)

NOTE: The poll observer should be able to hear the interaction between the poll worker and the voter in the vehicle. The distance from the vehicle should allow for this.

- The poll worker asks for the voter's ID.
Voter signs Authorization to Vote (ATV) to obtain official ballot (just like inside the voting enclosure.)
- The poll worker should deliver ONE ballot at a time to the vehicle.
However, you will see that this is not the case. (The vehicle should be treated as an 'inside' check-in table.) The CC/CJ/BOE Directors will tell you this is more efficient but it is not consistent with the law.
- You see more than one ballot delivered per vehicle, contact the CJ/SS. Point out the discrepancy. Write it up in SEIRS

WRITE IT UP IN SEIRS! We are seeing this across the state already. In my county, Henderson, twice the BOE members confronted the BOE director to correct the problem and it's only days 1 & 2! . We shall see today if it is.

WRITE IT UP IN SEIRS with the who, what, when, where, how and if the problem was resolved or not with the judge. Leave it open if he/she blew you off. Resolved is worker complied. Keep an eye on the situation. Like Henderson, the workers may go back to not asking.

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2. There isn't a law change to this. Multiple curbside voters can be served at the same time.

§ 163-166.9. Curbside voting.

(a) In any election or referendum, if any qualified voter is able to travel to the voting place, but because of age or physical disability and physical barriers encountered at the voting place is unable to enter the voting enclosure to vote in person without physical assistance, that voter shall be allowed to vote either in the vehicle conveying that voter or in the immediate proximity of the voting place.

(b) Repealed by Session Laws 2018-144, s. 3.1(d), effective December 19, 2018.

(c) The State Board of Elections shall adopt rules for the administration of this section. (2001-460, s. 3; 2013-381, s. 2.6; 2017-6, s. 3; 2018-144, s. 3.1(d); 2018-146, s. 3.1(a), (b).)

Subject: Stating name and address AND question on voting curbside

Tim,

1. OK, so I'm getting reports that the registration desk is not always asking the voter to STATE name and address. At Large at Old Town, for one, saw this. CJ was out of room, so AL asked another judge - who firmly stated the AL was incorrect. CJ re-appeared and concurred with AL. I can see how this is confusing - since we're handing over an ID. And it's the law.

Would it be appropriate for you to send a message to the poll workers across the county reminding them that STATING name and address is still required?

2. Question on curbside - I believe the law changed - if there are multiple voters in a vehicle, each voter must now be completely processed one at a time. So if a vehicle pulls up, the poll worker gets the info for voter #1. Once that process of back and forth is completed and the poll worker has inserted that ballot into the tabulator, the poll worker can then start the process for voter #2. And so on. Is that correct? If yes, can you quote the GS or where it is in the training manual?



If costs are going to be assessed against the requestor in excess of \$25, please let me know before proceeding.

The law requires that you respond to and fulfill this request “as promptly as possible.” If you expect a significant delay in responding to and fulfilling this request, please contact me with information about when I might expect the copies or the ability to inspect the requested records.
