Thank you Mr. Kern for taking the time to talk with me today. As mentioned we are having several issues with our DVUSD schools. We have found from our research that no agency or department has authority and oversight when they are non-compliant with laws and policies. We have been through the entire process for the last 7 months, without resolution. Bullying policy language is being misinterpreted. The district changes the process, sending us in circles. Nothing for the last 6 years of our children's issues are documented anywhere in the district. Our daughter was recently injured during a fire drill, and we can't get any straight answers about how 3 staff were notified, and no one called us or the nurse. They wrote false statements that she never spoke up or seemed distressed. 6 hours walking on a broken ankle and we finally picked her up and got her medical care at PCH.

Two weeks ago, a teacher for my 4th grader, pulled out her personal cell phone during instructional time to record a disruptive student. The teacher stood silent recording while the student had an outburst, then the student left the class on her own. We're upset the school is aware and allows the teachers to use this method as a replacement for real discipline and hands-on de-escalation techniques. So many legal ramifications on privacy and FERPA laws. The district, nor school has a policy outlining the usage of a cell phone as discipline.

We have taken all of these to the Board at every Board meeting the last 6 months, email and any way to get some answers. We finally had no choice but to file a complaint on Dr. Curtis Finch. Finch has censored our speech, cut off meetings, and lacks sympathy or consideration for our situations. Our own Board has been divided and refuses to have a hearing for the last 7 months

since our first complaint. In fact, the only thing they have done, is allowed Finch to investigate his own complaint, no independent investigation. We have now filed a 2nd complaint to the Board, but everything is in purgatory.

Thank you for your time in this matter, and pray we can get some resolution. As mentioned, if you can please email Paul Carver (board member) to use his authority where possible and see about rectifying these issues. Thank you.

- Due to Free and Reduced-Price Lunch Group B funding, School District and Charter funding increased approximately **\$40mil**. The result of which is a decrease of Basic State Aid surplus from **\$28,539,283** to **\$5,252,650**.
- Estimated Funding to Empowerment Scholarship Accounts decreased by approximately **\$2.7mil**
 - Estimated decrease due to additional data to calculate growth trend
- Revenue generated by the Qualifying Tax Rate Levy (QTR) continues to be less (**\$11mil**) than estimated by JLBC
- Additional State Aid continues to operate in a surplus of approximately **\$8mil**



President Petersen and Speaker Toma,

I'm very concerned that the Governor reduced to zero the 3rd quarter funding allocation for the arts consumables grant and ESA advertising. This is a very serious matter, and I would like to speak with both of you by phone as soon as possible.

The Arts Consumables Grant was approved in last year's state budget and has been a valuable new resource for schools statewide. For example, a teacher in Vail now has the funds to supply his band with things such as reeds and repairs. A teacher in Flagstaff purchased art supplies for the entire Kindergarten through 8th grade at her school. We have been hearing from arts teachers across the state telling us this grant makes them feel noticed and validated.

Of the \$10 million available, \$2.54 million has been approved and paid. We have pending requests that we have internally approved for another \$4.7 million. Based on experience, we expect to get meritorious requests for that full \$10 million. We were about to authorize the \$4.7 million when we got word that the governor's office put a hold on the funding. The total grant of \$10 million had been part of the budget that she approved in the compromise budget with the legislature. Pulling this funding, if it is not immediately corrected, would create a deep scar on arts education.

I analyzed the case of Rios v. Symington and here is a relevant quotation from the decision:

"The governor retains some discretion to exercise his judgment, not to spend money in a wasteful fashion, provided that he has determined reasonably that such a decision will not compromise the achievement of underlying legislative purposes and goals.... If the legislative purpose of the appropriation is carried out, and funds remain [note that the purpose of the legislation has to be carried out, and the remaining funds whose expenditure would be wasteful] the governor may revert them...."
"We are of the view that our constitution prohibits the governor from substituting his judgment, for that of the legislature, except for the use of the veto power."

The legislative purpose has not been fully carried out with respect to any of the funds the governor de-allocated, and there are no funds left over that would be wasteful because they would not contribute to the legislative purpose. The same legal analysis applies to the ESA advertising. There are \$2 million left from the approved budget, for which we had specific plans for advertising. I am sure that Senator Shamp would not agree that the purpose of the advertising has been fully accomplished, and that spending the remaining \$2 million would be wasteful.

This is a very urgent matter, and I would like to set up a conference call with you tomorrow morning, if possible.
