Dear Ms. Rasheed:

This is in response to your request for records made pursuant the Pennsylvania Right-to-Know Law (RTKL). This Office received your request on April 26, 2024 and notified you on May 3, 2024 that an extension of time to respond to your request was necessary due to bona fide staffing limitations. In addition, on June 3, 2024 this office requested an extension until June 11, 2024 to provide a final response. I apologize for this additional delay in providing a response and appreciate your patience.

Your request is granted in part and denied in part for the reasons set forth below.

At my request, the Allegheny County Department of Information Technology (DIT) conducted a record search based on the criteria identified in your request. Based upon the stated criteria, records responsive to your request for Sam DeMarco, Bethany Hallam, Jessica Garofolo and David Voye were found. They are attached hereto in an electronic format. However, the content of some of these records have been redacted to remove personal identification information. Such information is exempt from disclosure under Section 708 (b) (6) (i) (A) of the RTKL. Therefore, as to the items redacted from these records, your request is respectfully denied in part.

Your request for records for Sara Innamorato and Chet Harhut must be respectfully denied because DIT has not found any records responsive to your request. Section 705 of the RTKL states, "When responding to a request for access, an agency shall not be required to create a record which does not currently exist or to compile, maintain, format or organize a record in a manner in which the agency does not currently compile, maintain, format or organize the record." Therefore, under Section 705 of the RTKL, your request for these records must be denied.

Pursuant to Section 1101 of the RTKL, a party denied access to a requested record may file a written appeal of the denial with the Pennsylvania Office of Open Records ("OOR") within fifteen (15) business days of the mailing date of the local agency's response. The OOR's address is:

ICYMI: America First Opposes Biden Supplemental Spending Request

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, the America First Policy Institute formally announced its opposition to President Joe Biden’s proposed \$106 billion spending supplemental proposal.

America First Policy Institute believes Ukraine funding should be separated from the supplemental request that includes aid to Israel since the war in Ukraine is now 600 days old and not an emergency. AFPI also opposes the Biden Administration's failed policy and requests for more funding to process more illegal immigrants rather than stopping their entry.

"Throwing more money at the border is not the answer," said Chad Wolf, **Executive Director of the America First Policy Institute and former Acting Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security**. "This supplemental spending bill doubles down on the Biden Administration's failed policy of processing and transporting more illegals into our country rather than stop them from entering in the first place."

As it relates to the other spending proposals sought by President Biden and Senator Schumer, they should only be funded with matching spending cuts.

"America does not have a revenue problem, it has a spending problem," said Michael Faulkender, **Chief Economist at the America First Policy Institute and Former Assistant Secretary for Economic Policy at the U.S. Department of the Treasury**. "Simply by eliminating Joe Biden's wasteful radical left spending on things we don't need, our country can redirect that money to our friends, allies, and the issues that matter most to the security of the American people."

These are dangerous times. The Biden Administration is the first in U.S. history to preside over a \$1.7 trillion budget gap, and support for our economy is just as vital as support for Israel and our allies. The America First Policy Institute suggests Congress offset the non-Ukraine and border supplemental provisions with the following cuts:

- Enact the House-passed Resolution 23, which eliminates funding for 87,000 additional IRS Agents and would save taxpayers \$72 billion,
- Rescind the nearly [\\$22 billion](#) in federal and state subsidies and regulatory credits related to producing electric vehicles,
- Restore work requirements to the Child Tax Credit and close programmatic loopholes that made these funds available to illegal immigrants. Doing so would save taxpayers [\\$2.4 billion](#) annually. (Read more about the CTC [here](#) and [here](#).)
- Block [funding](#) to the Biden Administration's [\\$10 billion](#) Civilian Climate Corps initiative, which creates jobs for illegal aliens, and
- Defund the [\\$27 billion](#) national climate bank for political elites, which is administered by the Environmental Protection Agency.

These offsets alone would save taxpayers more than \$130 billion and help save our country from bankruptcy. Congress is expected to begin consideration of the Administration's spending request in the coming weeks.

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

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

“America First policies built the strongest economy in the world with low inflation and growing paychecks, unleashed our country’s energy dominance, secured the border, and pushed back against the growing threat from China,” **said Brooke Rollins, President and CEO of the America First Policy Institute.** “Due to the current lack of leadership in Washington, DC, many states are taking the lead on issues such as school choice, confronting China, and protecting its citizens against out-of-control crime.”

AFPI has tapped well-known leaders in the America First movement to lead these chapters, including:

AFPI-California Chair Larry Elder, Political Commentator and Former California Governor Candidate, and California State Director and Executive Director of State Chapters Melissa Melendez, Former California State Senator

AFPI state chapter teams will work closely with local leaders and lawmakers to develop America First policies in advance of and during their 2024 legislative sessions. AFPI has worked with governors and state legislative leaders since its inception in 2021 on a host of issues, such as: expanding school choice, lowering healthcare costs, enhancing election integrity, protecting agricultural land from being purchased by China, supporting parents against woke school leaders and teachers’ unions, and protecting life, women’s sports, and children from harmful gender altering treatments and surgeries.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Today, the America First Policy Institute (AFPI) released the following statement from Ambassador Carla Sands, AFPI's Vice Chair of the Center for Energy & Environment, on the Biden Administration's final tailpipe emissions rule. The rule,



Please find the section of the PA Election code that makes mention of electronic voting systems. It states that the use of electronic voting systems are to voted on by a majority of qualified registered electors. Has this occurred?

(1101-A added July 11, 1980, P.L.600, No.128)
Section 1102-A. Authorization of Electronic Voting Systems for Use at Polling Places.--Any county or municipality may, by a majority vote of its qualified registered electors voting thereon cast at any primary or election, authorize and direct the use of an electronic voting system for registering or recording and computing the vote at all elections and primaries held at polling places in such county or municipality.

1937 Act 320

ARTICLE XI-A
Electronic Voting Systems
(Art. added July 11, 1980, P.L.600, No.128)

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Section 1102-A. Authorization of Electronic Voting Systems for Use at Polling Places.--Any county or municipality may, by

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(1102-A added July 11, 1980, P.L.600, No.128)

Section 1103-A. Placing the Question on the Ballot; Election Thereon.--(a) The county election board may, upon their own motion, submit to the qualified registered electors of the county or municipality, at any primary or election, the question "Shall an electronic voting system be used at polling places in the (county or municipality) of?"

(b) The county election board, upon receipt of a request from the governing body of a municipality, said request being evidenced by the filing of a copy of a resolution certified by the secretary or clerk of the municipality, or upon the filing of a petition with them signed by qualified registered electors of the county or municipality, equal in number to at least ten (10) per centum of the total number of electors who voted in said county or municipality, at the preceding general or municipal election, but in no case less than fifty, shall, at the next primary or election, occurring at least sixty days thereafter, submit to the qualified registered electors of such county or municipality, the question "Shall an electronic voting system be used at polling places in the (county or municipality) of?"

(c) The county board shall cause the said question to be submitted at the primary or election, in accordance with the provisions of this act relating to elections.

(d) The election on said question shall be held at the places, during the hours, and under the regulations, provided by law for holding primaries and elections, and shall be conducted by the election officers provided by law to conduct such elections. The election officers shall count the votes cast at the elections on said question, and shall make return thereof to the county election board of the county, as required by law. Said returns shall be computed by the county election board, or other return board, and, when so computed, a certificate of the total number of electors voting "Yes" and of the total number of electors voting "No" on such question shall be filed in the office of the county election board, and copies thereof, certified by the county election board, shall forthwith be furnished to the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and to the county commissioners or other appropriating authority of the county or municipality.

(e) If a majority of the electors of any county or municipality, voting on such question, shall vote against the adoption of an electronic voting system the question may again be submitted to the voters of such county or municipality. ((e) amended Dec. 9, 2002, P.L.1246, No.150)

(f) Whenever, under the provisions of this act, the question of the adoption of an electronic voting system is to be submitted to the electors of any county, the county board of elections shall purchase, lease or otherwise procure those parts of the system used by the voter in a quantity sufficient for reasonable demonstration of the system or systems in such county prior to the general or municipal election in question.

(1103-A added July 11, 1980, P.L.600, No.128)

Section 1104-A. Installation of Electronic Voting Systems.-

-(a) If a majority of the qualified registered electors voting on the question in any county or municipality vote in favor of the adoption of an electronic voting system, the county board of elections of that county shall purchase, lease, or otherwise procure for each election district of such county or municipality, the components of an electronic voting system of a kind approved, as hereinafter provided, by the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and the board shall thereafter notify the Secretary of the Commonwealth, in writing, that they have done so.

(b) The installation throughout the county or municipality of the electronic voting system adopted by the county board of elections may be accomplished either simultaneously in all election districts or in stages at the discretion of the county board, and the manner of implementation as among election districts shall also be at the discretion of the county board: Provided, however, That the electronic voting system adopted by the county board shall be fully implemented throughout the county or municipality within one hundred and three weeks after the approval of the adoption of an electronic voting system by the electors of the county or municipality. Upon the installation of an electronic voting system in any election district, the use therein of paper ballots and of voting machines shall be discontinued, except as otherwise provided herein.

(c) If the question hereinbefore provided shall have been submitted to the qualified registered electors of the county or municipality and the majority of the electors voting thereon shall have voted favorably thereon, and if the county board of elections shall not, within one year after such vote, have executed a contract or contracts providing for the purchase, lease or other procurement of an electronic voting system for use at the general, municipal, primary or special election occurring at least one year and sixty days after such vote, then the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall forthwith in writing, notify the said county board of elections that, after the expiration of thirty days, he, under the authority of this act, will award, make and execute such contract or contracts on behalf of the said county, unless the said county board of elections shall make and execute the same prior to the expiration of that period and shall notify him, in writing, that they have done so.

(d) If, upon the expiration of said thirty days, the county board of elections still shall not have made and executed a contract or contracts providing for the purchase, lease or other procurement of an electronic voting system as aforesaid, the Secretary of the Commonwealth, on behalf of the said county and upon the approval of the Attorney General as to form, shall thereupon award, make and execute a contract or contracts for the purchase, lease or other procurement of an electronic voting system, approved as required by this act, for each election district within such county or municipality, and the cost of such system, including the preparation and printing of specifications and all other necessary expenses incidental thereto, shall be the debt of the said county, and upon the certificate of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, it shall be the duty of the controller, if any, to allow, and of the treasurer of the county to pay, the sum out of any appropriation available therefore or out of the first unappropriated moneys that come into the treasury of the

county. If the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall find it impracticable to procure an electronic voting system for installation in each election district of the county or municipality for use at the election then next ensuing, he shall provide for the installation of such a system in as many election districts of the county or municipality as shall be practicable and, as soon thereafter as practicable, shall provide for the installation of such system in the remainder of the election districts of the county or municipality.

(e) Any county or municipality may, by a majority vote of its qualified registered electors cast at any general or municipal election held not earlier than one hundred and three weeks after they have voted to adopt an electronic voting system, direct the discontinuance of the use of such a system at all elections held in such county or municipality. Upon the receipt by the county board of elections of a petition signed by qualified registered electors of the county or municipality equal in number to at least ten (10) per centum of the total number of electors who voted in said county or municipality at the last preceding general or municipal election, the question for the discontinuance of the use of such an electronic voting system shall be submitted to the qualified registered electors of that county or municipality, subject to the same requirements as to the conduct of the election as is required for the submission of the question on the authorization of the use of an electronic voting system. The question as to the discontinuance of the use of an electronic voting system shall be submitted in the following form: "Shall the use of an electronic voting system be continued in the (county or municipality) of"?"

(1104-A added July 11, 1980, P.L.600, No.128)

Section 1105-A. Examination and Approval of Electronic Voting Systems by the Secretary of the Commonwealth.--(a) Any person or corporation owning, manufacturing or selling, or being interested in the manufacture or sale of, any electronic voting system, may request the Secretary of the Commonwealth to examine such system if the voting system has been examined and approved by a federally recognized independent testing authority and if it meets any voting system performance and test standards established by the Federal Government. The costs of the examination shall be paid by the person requesting the examination in an amount set by the Secretary of the Commonwealth. Any ten or more persons, being qualified registered electors of this Commonwealth, may, at any time, request the Secretary of the Commonwealth to reexamine any electronic voting system theretofore examined and approved by him. Before any reexamination, the person, persons, or corporation, requesting such reexamination, shall pay to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth a reexamination fee of four hundred fifty dollars (\$450). The Secretary of the Commonwealth may, at any time, in his discretion, reexamine any such system therefore examined and approved by him. The Secretary of the Commonwealth may issue directives or instructions for implementation of electronic voting procedures and for the operation of electronic voting systems. ((a) amended Dec. 9, 2002, P.L.1246, No.150)

(b) Upon receipt of a request for examination or reexamination of an electronic voting system as herein provided for or in the event he determines to reexamine any such system, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall examine the electronic


voting system and shall make and file in his office his report, attested by his signature and the seal of his office, stating whether, in his opinion, the system so examined can be safely used by voters at elections as provided in this act and meets all of the requirements hereinafter set forth. If his report states that the system can be so used and meets all such requirements, such system shall be deemed approved and may be adopted for use at elections, as herein provided. With respect to any electronic voting system approved for use in this Commonwealth by the secretary, the report of the secretary shall specify the capacity of the components of that system, the number of voters who may reasonably be accommodated by the voting devices and automatic tabulating equipment which comprise such system and the number of clerks and machine inspectors, if any, required based on the number of registered electors in any election district in which the voting system is to be used, such specifications being based upon the secretary's examination of the system. Any county which thereafter may adopt any such approved system shall provide the components of such system in a number no less than that sufficient to accommodate the voters of that county or municipality in accordance with the minimum capacity standards so prescribed by the secretary. The county board shall comply with the requirements for the use of the electronic voting system as set forth in the report by the Secretary of the Commonwealth. ((b) amended Dec. 9, 2002, P.L.1246, No.150)

(c) No electronic voting system not so approved shall be used at any election, and if, upon the reexamination of any such system previously approved, it shall appear that the system so reexamined can no longer be used safely by voters at elections as provided in this act or does not meet the requirements hereinafter set forth, the approval of that system shall forthwith be revoked by the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and that system shall not thereafter be used or purchased for use in this Commonwealth.

(d) When an electronic voting system has been so approved, no improvement or change that does not impair its accuracy, efficiency or capacity or its compliance with the requirements hereinafter set forth, shall render necessary the reexamination or reapproval of such system.

ICYMI: America First Opposes Biden Supplemental Spending Request

WASHINGTON, DC – Today, the America First Policy Institute formally announced its opposition to President Joe Biden’s proposed \$106 billion spending supplemental proposal.

America First Policy Institute believes Ukraine funding should be separated from the supplemental request that includes aid to Israel since the war in Ukraine is now 600 days old and not an emergency. AFPI also opposes the Biden Administration's failed policy and requests for more funding to process more illegal immigrants rather than stopping their entry.

"Throwing more money at the border is not the answer," said Chad Wolf, **Executive Director of the America First Policy Institute and former Acting Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security**. "This supplemental spending bill doubles down on the Biden Administration's failed policy of processing and transporting more illegals into our country rather than stop them from entering in the first place."

As it relates to the other spending proposals sought by President Biden and Senator Schumer, they should only be funded with matching spending cuts.

"America does not have a revenue problem, it has a spending problem," said Michael Faulkender, **Chief Economist at the America First Policy Institute and Former Assistant Secretary for Economic Policy at the U.S. Department of the Treasury**. "Simply by eliminating Joe Biden's wasteful radical left spending on things we don't need, our country can redirect that money to our friends, allies, and the issues that matter most to the security of the American people."

These are dangerous times. The Biden Administration is the first in U.S. history to preside over a \$1.7 trillion budget gap, and support for our economy is just as vital as support for Israel and our allies. The America First Policy Institute suggests Congress offset the non-Ukraine and border supplemental provisions with the following cuts:

- Enact the House-passed Resolution 23, which eliminates funding for 87,000 additional IRS Agents and would save taxpayers \$72 billion,
- Rescind the nearly [\\$22 billion](#) in federal and state subsidies and regulatory credits related to producing electric vehicles,
- Restore work requirements to the Child Tax Credit and close programmatic loopholes that made these funds available to illegal immigrants. Doing so would save taxpayers [\\$2.4 billion](#) annually. (Read more about the CTC [here](#) and [here](#).)
- Block [funding](#) to the Biden Administration's [\\$10 billion](#) Civilian Climate Corps initiative, which creates jobs for illegal aliens, and
- Defund the [\\$27 billion](#) national climate bank for political elites, which is administered by the Environmental Protection Agency.

These offsets alone would save taxpayers more than \$130 billion and help save our country from bankruptcy. Congress is expected to begin consideration of the Administration's spending request in the coming weeks.



**PETITION TO REDIVIDE THE ELECTION DISTRICTS OF

AND NOW comes Petitioner, Township of Upper St. Clair, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania (the "Township"), by and through their undersigned legal counsel, Tucker Arensberg, P.C., Township Attorney, and presents the following Petition as follows:

1. The Township is a Home Rule Municipality located within Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, which is organized pursuant to the Home Rule Charter and Optional Plans Law, 53 P.S. § 2901 *et seq.* and the Township of Upper St. Clair Home Rule Charter, which was made effective January 1, 1976, as amended ("Home Rule Charter").

2. The Township is currently divided into five wards. The Township Board of Commissioners is comprised of seven elected members. Two members of Council are elected at large, and five Commissioners are elected by the qualified voters of each of the five wards.

3. Section 302 of the Home Rule Charter and Section 903 of the Pennsylvania Municipal Reapportionment Act, 53 Pa. C.S.A. §§ 901 *et seq.* provide that the Board of Commissioners has the authority to reapportion wards so that they are "composed of compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population as practicable" in accordance with the most recent Federal census, decennial or special.

4. Based upon the 2020 Federal decennial census, the Board of Commissioners deemed it necessary to reapportion the Township's wards because the population distribution

between the wards had become unequal due to increased development in certain areas in the Township.

5. The Township communicated its intention to reapportion the Township's wards to the Allegheny County Board of Elections ("Board of Elections").

6. Accordingly, on December 5, 2022, the Township passed Ordinance No. 2244 ("Ward Reapportionment Ordinance"), which reapportioned the Township's five wards in order to more equally distribute the Township's population between the wards. A copy of the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

7. Because the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance changed the boundaries to the existing wards, each of which contained multiple election districts, the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance also proposed new election district boundaries to reflect the new ward boundaries. *See* Exhibit A.

8. After its enactment, the Township forwarded the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance to the Board of Elections so that it could complete the reapportionment process.

9. However, the Board of Elections refused to reapportion the wards and election districts in accordance with the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance, claiming that the newly proposed election districts were too large.

10. Accordingly, the Township reconfigured the wards and election districts, and on August 7, 2023, passed Ordinance No. 2252 ("District Reapportionment Ordinance"), which reapportioned the election districts in Ward 3 and Ward 5. There were no alterations or amendments to the Wards. A copy of the District Reapportionment Ordinance is attached hereto as Exhibit B.


11. The Township reconfigured the wards and election districts pursuant to the Board of Election's request. The Board of Elections informed the Township that it would not complete the reapportionment process until it filed a Petition and a court order was issued.

12. As described above, the Township has the obligation to reapportion wards pursuant to Section 302 of the Home Rule Charter and Section 903 of the Pennsylvania Municipal Reapportionment Act, 53 Pa. C.S.A. §§ 901.

13. Additionally, the election districts proposed in the District Reapportionment Ordinance comply with all relevant legal requirements and are in the best interest of the electorate of the Township, as the election districts will provide registered electors with better access to convenient polling places, enable them to avoid long lines on election day, and will increase the degree of public involvement in the election process.

WHEREFORE, the Petitioners respectfully request that this Honorable Court enter an order scheduling a hearing on this Petition, referring this Petition to the Allegheny County Board of Elections, which shall promptly make and report its findings and recommendations to the Court, directing the Allegheny County Division of Elections to provide notice as required by the Pennsylvania Election Code, and require the Allegheny County Board of Elections to complete the reapportionment process as required by law.





From Ward 1 District 1 to Ward 3 District 3**




I recently received a return communication from Gina Pollice regarding her interaction with you to investigate my daughter Michelle's voting status for November 2022.

She informed me that while the voting records indicated that Michelle had voted in person in November 2022, in reality that notation was a result of human error within the Allegheny County Division of Elections. In the scanning of the poll books subsequent to the November 2022 election someone had erroneously scanned Michelle's voter roll entry barcode - thereby registering an in-person vote by Michelle.

I am glad that this concerning situation has been resolved in a timely and satisfactory manner. Both my daughter and I thank you for your involvement in effectively and efficiently handling the question.

Going forward can you assure both Michelle and I that her name will be removed from the PA voter rolls so that no further questions or issues arise?

As I'm sure Ms. Pollice informed you, Michelle permanently moved to VA in 2018. She lives in Alexandria and works in Arlington and has a VA driver's license, VA automobile plates, VA voter registration. She voted absentee in PA in Nov. 2018 because she was in the process of changing over all of her licenses and registrations, but she has voted consistently in VA since January 2019 - that is well over 4 years, and 4 federal elections. She should no longer be on the PA voter rolls, and she should certainly not have been listed as ACTIVE. My understanding is that the ERIC system, which is utilized by both PA and VA would have listed her on their reports to both Commonwealths every year for the past 4 years, prompting action by government officials.

Please respond with a confirmation that she will be permanently removed from the PA Voter Rolls in District 9 - Robinson Township.

**PETITION TO REDIVIDE THE ELECTION DISTRICTS OF

AND NOW comes Petitioner, Township of Upper St. Clair, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania (the “Township”), by and through their undersigned legal counsel, Tucker Arensberg, P.C., Township Attorney, and presents the following Petition as follows:

1. The Township is a Home Rule Municipality located within Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, which is organized pursuant to the Home Rule Charter and Optional Plans Law, 53 P.S. § 2901 *et seq.* and the Township of Upper St. Clair Home Rule Charter, which was made effective January 1, 1976, as amended (“Home Rule Charter”).

2. The Township is currently divided into five wards. The Township Board of Commissioners is comprised of seven elected members. Two members of Council are elected at large, and five Commissioners are elected by the qualified voters of each of the five wards.

3. Section 302 of the Home Rule Charter and Section 903 of the Pennsylvania Municipal Reapportionment Act, 53 Pa. C.S.A. §§ 901 *et seq.* provide that the Board of Commissioners has the authority to reapportion wards so that they are “composed of compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population as practicable” in accordance with the most recent Federal census, decennial or special.

4. Based upon the 2020 Federal decennial census, the Board of Commissioners deemed it necessary to reapportion the Township’s wards because the population distribution

between the wards had become unequal due to increased development in certain areas in the Township.

5. The Township communicated its intention to reapportion the Township's wards to the Allegheny County Board of Elections ("Board of Elections").

6. Accordingly, on December 5, 2022, the Township passed Ordinance No. 2244 ("Ward Reapportionment Ordinance"), which reapportioned the Township's five wards in order to more equally distribute the Township's population between the wards. A copy of the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

7. Because the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance changed the boundaries to the existing wards, each of which contained multiple election districts, the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance also proposed new election district boundaries to reflect the new ward boundaries. *See* Exhibit A.

8. After its enactment, the Township forwarded the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance to the Board of Elections so that it could complete the reapportionment process.

9. However, the Board of Elections refused to reapportion the wards and election districts in accordance with the Ward Reapportionment Ordinance, claiming that the newly proposed election districts were too large.

10. Accordingly, the Township reconfigured the wards and election districts, and on August 7, 2023, passed Ordinance No. 2252 ("District Reapportionment Ordinance"), which reapportioned the election districts in Ward 3 and Ward 5. There were no alterations or amendments to the Wards. A copy of the District Reapportionment Ordinance is attached hereto as Exhibit B.


11. The Township reconfigured the wards and election districts pursuant to the Board of Election's request. The Board of Elections informed the Township that it would not complete the reapportionment process until it filed a Petition and a court order was issued.

12. As described above, the Township has the obligation to reapportion wards pursuant to Section 302 of the Home Rule Charter and Section 903 of the Pennsylvania Municipal Reapportionment Act, 53 Pa. C.S.A. §§ 901.

13. Additionally, the election districts proposed in the District Reapportionment Ordinance comply with all relevant legal requirements and are in the best interest of the electorate of the Township, as the election districts will provide registered electors with better access to convenient polling places, enable them to avoid long lines on election day, and will increase the degree of public involvement in the election process.

WHEREFORE, the Petitioners respectfully request that this Honorable Court enter an order scheduling a hearing on this Petition, referring this Petition to the Allegheny County Board of Elections, which shall promptly make and report its findings and recommendations to the Court, directing the Allegheny County Division of Elections to provide notice as required by the Pennsylvania Election Code, and require the Allegheny County Board of Elections to complete the reapportionment process as required by law.



WHEREAS, the Constitution of the United States provides that a demographic count of the nation be conducted every ten years; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania prescribes reapportionment regulations for the state and local municipalities pursuant to the demographic count; and

WHEREAS, the Charter of the Township of Upper St. Clair sets forth that wards shall be established by Ordinance by dividing the Township into five (5) compact and contiguous geographic areas as nearly equal in population as practicable; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Census was conducted by the federal government and figures were made available to the state and local municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that it is necessary to realign the municipal ward boundaries pursuant to the 2020 Census figures for the Township of Upper St. Clair in accordance with guidelines and requirements set forth by federal and state statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER ST. CLAIR, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same that:

SECTION 1. THAT the boundaries of the first, third, fourth and fifth wards are hereby revised and adopted in accordance with the address list and maps attached hereto as Exhibit A, Exhibit B, and Exhibit C.

SECTION 2. THAT the Township Engineer is hereby directed to revise the ward descriptions and official ward map to conform to those documents provided for within Section 1.

SECTION 3. ALL ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.




- WHEREAS, the Charter of the Township of Upper St. Clair sets forth that wards shall be established by Ordinance by dividing the Township into five (5) compact and contiguous geographic areas as nearly equal in population as practicable; and
- WHEREAS, the 2020 Census was conducted by the federal government and figures were made available to the state and local municipalities; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that it is necessary to realign the municipal ward boundaries pursuant to the 2020 Census figures for the Township of Upper St. Clair in accordance with guidelines and requirements set forth by federal and state statutes; and
- WHEREAS, On December 5, 2022, the Board of Commissioners enacted Ordinance 2244 and reapportioned the wards of the Township; and
- WHEREAS, Allegheny County has advised the Township, that two of the election districts exceed the 1200 registered electors threshold set forth in the Pennsylvania Elections Code; and
- WHEREAS, The Township has determined that reapportioning certain election districts within existing wards will make participation in the election process more convenient and accessible to the public.

Exhibit B

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER ST. CLAIR, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same that:

- SECTION 1. THAT the boundaries of the election districts within the third and fifth wards are hereby revised and adopted in accordance with the address list and maps attached hereto as Exhibit A, Exhibit B, and Exhibit C.
- SECTION 2. THAT the Township Engineer is hereby directed to revise the official ward map to conform to those documents provided for within Section 1.
- SECTION 3. ALL ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.



