Sheriffs and Staff,

Please see the first link below for CBP's monthly operational update for November 2024. The second link is an updated summary of CBP's publicly available statistics.

The following bullets are of particular note:

- November encounters between ports of entry are now at their lowest level since July 2020.
- DHS has doubled the percentage of noncitizens processed for Expedited Removal, and the number of individuals released by the U.S. Border Patrol pending immigration court proceedings is down 70%.
- From June 5 through the end of November, DHS removed or returned more than **240,000 individuals to over 160 countries while conducting more than 740 international repatriation flights.**
- On the northern border, CBP's expanded enforcement efforts in response to changing migration trends has yielded a reduction in encounters between ports of entry of more than **80%** from June to November.



Frederick County Sheriff Chuck Jenkins, a staunch advocate of immigration enforcement, said his office would wholeheartedly support President-elect Donald Trump's deportation plan.

"I absolutely, positively will support that very much. It's going to be a mass deportation of criminals," Jenkins said. "Every chief, every sheriff in this country should stand up to support this."

Trump has said he plans to target undocumented criminal migrants, including drug dealers, human traffickers and gang members. Trump is also floating a plan to declare a national border emergency and use the military to help execute it.

Jenkins has made headlines for years for his hardline stances on immigration reform. He's in his fifth term as sheriff in the 300,000-person county.

"I look at this as a form of proactive policing," Jenkins said. "Look at what's going on across our country — the brutal crimes, the rapes, the murders in every jurisdiction across this country."

In 2021, his office settled a lawsuit alleging his office violated a woman's constitutional rights after deputies held a woman for ICE, after questioning her immigration status. Jenkins was required to apologize and pay a monetary settlement.

Jenkins said he hopes Trump will also bring back the "Task Force Model" policy of the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) 287 (g) program, a policy that gave law enforcement the authority to question and arrest individuals they encountered if they believe they may be violating federal immigration law.

The Task Force Model, and a hybrid model including it, were discontinued during the Obama administration in 2012 out of concerns of racial profiling, according to the American Immigration Council, an immigration advocacy organization.

CASA, a pro-immigration group with branches in Maryland, Georgia, Pennsylvania and Virginia, condemned Trump's immigration enforcement plans. CASA Executive Director Gustavo Torres called it a "calculated act of cruelty disguised as negotiation."

"We can't have it both ways, and Donald Trump is trying to make it so. He dangles the lie of protecting the highly popular [DACA \(Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals\) program](#) all while simultaneously vowing to end birthright citizenship, dismantle protections, and deport millions of people who are integral to American families and communities," Torres said in a statement. "His words don't match what he has done before and what he

has pledged to do: kick immigrants out; a guise to scapegoat immigrants for the economic suffering caused by the ultra-rich like Trump supporter Elon Musk and others.”

In 2017, then-Attorney General Brian Frosh issued legal guidance warning Maryland’s law enforcement community about another aspect of immigration enforcement — detaining undocumented persons beyond their release date, to comply with ICE requests. Doing so, Frosh said, could violate the U.S. Constitution. As a result, many local jurisdictions do not hold someone past the date courts say they should be released unless an order from an immigration judge accompanies the detainer request.

Currently in Maryland, sheriff’s offices in three counties — Cecil, Frederick, and Harford — participate in one of the two remaining programs in ICE’s 287(g) program – the Jail Enforcement Model. Local law enforcement is trained to access immigration databases, question people’s immigration status, complete immigration forms, and begin deportation proceedings by contacting ICE.

While all three jurisdictions agree on the immigration status process, not all agree on Trump’s proposed deportation plans, which could ramp up the role local law enforcement plays in deporting criminals in the country illegally.

Harford County Sheriff Jeffrey Gahler said he supports working with federal partners to deport criminals and uphold his office’s duties to keep the community safe. He said he is especially adamant about that following the [2023 killing of Rachel Morin](#) in Bel Air by an immigrant in the country illegally. But he said he won’t commit to Trump’s plan yet.

“Our 287 (g) program was approved under the Obama administration and will continue under President Trump,” a spokesperson for Gahler said. “[H]e has not seen or reviewed the plan to comment on it. But, he supports working with federal partners.”

Cecil County Sheriff Scott Adams did not respond to a question about whether he supports Trump’s plans.

Jenkins said not all of his deputies want to participate in ICE’s partnership enforcement program, and he understands that. But his office’s role in 287(g) doesn’t affect whether a person is removed.

“The immigration status of every individual that’s arrested on the street, taken to our jail, booked in our system, they’re asked what their country’s citizenship is, and if the answer is anything other than the United States, we run an immigration check to determine their legal status,” Jenkins said. “That’s simply all it is. If they’re not in the country legally, and they’ve committed a crime, we prepare a detainer, pass that paperwork off to ICE, and ICE determines whether or not they hold that person and eventually deport or remove that person. That’s totally their call.”

Katie, good morning. Thanks for setting up the interview with Sheriff Jenkins yesterday.

From that interview, I need to clear up one item: Sheriff Jenkins said that state law prohibited any law enforcement jurisdiction from participating in the 287(g) program.

He couldn't tell me what or when the law passed, but thought it was two to three years in practice.

I cannot find anything on it, but I feel like I recall something like this happening.

Can your office shed any light on this for me, please?
