Re: Public Records Law Request

Dear Records Custodian:

Pursuant to the Louisiana Public Records Law, La. Rev. Stat. Ann. 44:1 et seq., American Oversight makes the following request for records.

Requested Records

American Oversight requests that your agency produce the following records within three business days:

1. Records sufficient to identify all materials (including, but not limited to, reports, analyses, recommendations, or guidance from internal or external entities) upon which Representative Jack McFarland relied in determining the \$4,000,000 appropriation to the Alternative to Abortion initiative in House Bill 1 (2024).

For part 1 of this request, please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2024, through June 1, 2024.

2. Copies of any impact reports or assessments provided to Representative Jack McFarland by any direct service provider operating under the Louisiana Pregnancy and Baby Initiative and/or Alternatives to Abortion Program.

For part 2 of this request, please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2024, through the date the search is conducted.

3. All email communications (including emails, email attachments, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments) between (a) Representative Jack McFarland, or anyone communicating on his behalf such as a chief of staff or legislative aide, and (b) the external entities and individuals listed below (including, but not limited to, anyone communicating from an email address ending in the listed domain(s)).

Please note that American Oversight does not seek, and that part 3 of this request specifically excludes, the initial mailing of news clips or other mass-distribution emails. However, subsequent communications forwarding such emails are responsive to this request. For example, if Representative McFarland received a mass-distribution news clip email from a listed external entity or individual, that initial email would not be responsive to this request. However, if he forwarded that email with his own commentary, that subsequent message would be responsive to this request and should be produced.

For part 3 of this request, please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2024, through August 1, 2024.

4. All email communications (including emails, email attachments, complete email chains, calendar invitations, and calendar invitation attachments) sent by Representative Jack McFarland, or anyone communicating on his behalf such as a chief of staff or legislative aide, and containing any of the key terms listed below.

In an effort to accommodate your office and reduce the number of potentially responsive records to be processed and produced, American Oversight has

limited part 4 of its request to emails sent by the listed officials. To be clear, however, American Oversight still requests that complete email chains be produced, displaying both sent and received messages. For example, both Senator Blair's response to an email containing a listed key term and the initial received message are responsive to this request and should be produced.

For part 4 of this request, please provide all responsive records from January 1, 2024, through August 1, 2024.

Fee Waiver Request

In accordance with La. Rev. Stat. Ann. 44:32(C)(2), American Oversight requests a waiver of fees associated with processing this request for records. A waiver of fees for this request is appropriate, because American Oversight's use of the requested records "will be limited to a public purpose."

This request is made solely for a public purpose. The public has a significant interest in the use of state funds for alternatives to abortion programs.¹ Records with the potential to shed light on this matter would contribute significantly to public understanding of operations of the government, including how such funding is being used or determined. American Oversight is committed to transparency and makes the responses agencies provide to public records requests publicly available, and the public's understanding of the government's activities would be enhanced through American Oversight's analysis and publication of these records.

Furthermore, this request is fundamentally made for non-commercial purposes. As a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, American Oversight does not have a commercial purpose and the release of the information requested is not in American Oversight's financial interest. American Oversight's mission is to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and X (formerly Twitter).²

American Oversight has also demonstrated its commitment to the public disclosure of documents and creation of editorial content through regular substantive analyses

posted to its website.³ Examples reflecting this commitment to the public disclosure of documents and the creation of editorial content include the posting of records and analysis related to the organization’s investigations into misconduct and corruption in state governments;⁴ posting records and analysis of federal and state governments’ responses to the Coronavirus pandemic;⁵ posting records received as part of American Oversight’s “Audit the Wall” project to gather and analyze information related to the Trump administration’s proposed construction of a barrier along the U.S.-Mexico border, and analyses of what those records reveal;⁶ and the posting of records related to an ethics waiver received by a senior Department of Justice attorney and an analysis of what those records demonstrated regarding the Department’s process for issuing such waivers.⁷

Accordingly, American Oversight qualifies for a fee waiver.

Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

- Please search all locations and systems likely to have responsive records, regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics.
- In conducting your search, please understand the terms “record,” “document,” and “information” in their broadest sense, to include any written, typed, recorded, graphic, printed, or audio material of any kind. We seek records of any kind, including electronic records, audiotapes, videotapes, and photographs, as well as letters, emails, facsimiles, telephone messages, voice mail messages and transcripts, notes, or minutes of any meetings, telephone conversations or discussions.
- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted. To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to the email.
- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages. Public business communications conducted on private email accounts and devices are public records subject to the Public Records Law.⁸
- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.
