Re: Expedited Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear FOIA Officer:

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552, and the implementing regulations of your agency, American Oversight makes the following request for records.

The Social Security Administration recently announced that the social security numbers of more than 6,000 immigrants were cancelled.¹ American Oversight seeks records with the potential to shed light on this decision to cancel social security numbers for immigrants, including plans to cancel additional social security numbers.

Requested Records

American Oversight seeks expedited review of this request for the reasons identified below and requests that your agency produce the following records as soon as practicable, and at least within twenty business days:

1. A complete copy (including any attachments) of any contract or subcontract, amendment, inter-governmental service agreement, memorandum of understanding, or other written agreement between the Social Security Administration and the Department of Homeland Security, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and/or Customs and Border Patrol.
2. All formal or informal final impact assessments, reports, or analyses (including memoranda and other written products) prepared by or otherwise provided to the Social Security Administration regarding moving immigrants onto the death master file or ineligible master file.

3. All dissent memoranda or complaints, whether official or unofficial, including ethics or whistleblower complaints, submitted to the relevant offices in your agency regarding moving immigrants onto the death master file or ineligible master file.
4. Records reflecting any final legal advice or analysis (including both formal legal analyses or memoranda, as well as informal electronic communications) regarding moving people onto the death master file or ineligible master file because of their immigration status, including, but not limited to, Section 205(r) of the Social Security Act.
5. Records sufficient to identify the number of people moved onto the death master file or ineligible master file because of their immigration or citizenship status, and the number of people whose social security status was reinstated or reversed after being moved to the death master file or ineligible master file because of their immigration or citizenship status.
6. All formal or informal final directives (including informal email communications), guidance, or recommendations created by, issued to, or otherwise provided to the Social Security Administration regarding moving people onto the death master file or ineligible master file because of their immigration or citizenship status.
7. All records reflecting policies, procedures, and practices—both formal and informal—prepared by, received by, or otherwise in the possession of the Social Security Administration regarding moving people onto the death master file or ineligible master file because of their immigration or citizenship status, including, but not limited to, protocol for verifying a person's immigration or citizenship status.
8. Records sufficient to identify any formal or informal criteria used to determine if a person should be moved onto the death master file or ineligible master file because of their immigration or citizenship status, including, but not limited to, any standards regarding determining if a person is a convicted criminal or suspected terrorist.
9. A complete copy of any memoranda issued by Secretary of Homeland Security Kristi Noem regarding immigration enforcement, including, but not limited to, sharing data for immigration enforcement purposes or moving people onto the death master file or ineligible master file because of their immigration or citizenship status.

For parts 1-9 of this request, please provide all responsive records from January 20, 2025, through the date the search is conducted.

10. A complete copy (including any attachments) of any contract or subcontract, amendment, inter-governmental service agreement, memorandum of

understanding, or other written agreement between the Social Security Administration and the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), U.S. DOGE Service (formerly U.S. Digital Service), and/or the U.S. DOGE Service Temporary Organization.

For part 10 of this request, please provide all responsive records from February 25, 2025, through the date the search is conducted.

Fee Waiver Request

In accordance with 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii) and your agency's regulations, American Oversight requests a waiver of fees associated with processing this request for records. The subject of this request concerns the operations of the federal government, and the disclosures will likely contribute to a better understanding of relevant government procedures by the general public in a significant way. Moreover, the request is for non-commercial purposes.

American Oversight requests a waiver of fees because disclosure of the requested information is "in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of operations or activities of the government."² The public has a significant interest in the Social Security Administration's decision to cancel social security numbers for immigrants.³ Records with the potential to shed light on this matter would contribute significantly to public understanding of operations of the federal government, including whether officials sufficiently vetted the individuals whose social security numbers were cancelled, and whether additional social security numbers will be cancelled. American Oversight is committed to transparency and makes the responses agencies provide to FOIA requests publicly available, and the public's understanding of the government's activities would be enhanced through American Oversight's analysis and publication of these records.

This request "is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester."⁴ In fact, as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, American Oversight does not have a commercial purpose, and the release of the information requested is not in American Oversight's commercial interest. American Oversight's mission is to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, or other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and X (formerly Twitter).⁵

American Oversight has also demonstrated its commitment to the public disclosure of documents and creation of editorial content through regular substantive analyses posted to its website.⁶ Examples reflecting this commitment include the posting of records related to the first Trump Administration's contacts with Ukraine and analyses of those contacts;⁷ posting records and editorial content about the federal government's response to the COVID-19 pandemic;⁸ posting records received as part of American Oversight's "Audit the Wall" project to gather and analyze information related to the first Trump administration's proposed construction of a barrier along the U.S.-Mexico border, and analyses of what those records reveal;⁹ the posting of records related to an ethics waiver received by a senior Department of Justice attorney and an analysis of what those records demonstrated regarding the Department's process for issuing such waivers;¹⁰ and posting records and analysis of federal officials' use of taxpayer dollars to charter private aircraft or use government planes for unofficial business.¹¹

Accordingly, American Oversight qualifies for a fee waiver.

Application for Expedited Processing

Pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(E)(1) and 20 C.F.R. § 402.65, American Oversight requests that your agency expedite the processing of this request.

I certify to be true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief that the information requested is urgently needed in order to inform the public concerning actual or alleged government activity. On April 10, 2025, it was reported that the Social Security Administration was actively cancelling the social security numbers of more than 6,300 immigrants by moving them onto the “death master file,” renamed the “ineligible master file.”¹² The Trump administration’s goal with this measure is to encourage people to “self-deport” by cutting them off from access to financial services and government benefits.¹³ Though the administration has claimed that only convicted criminals and “suspected terrorists” will be targeted, no evidence has been provided; the administration has gone on to state that the effort could broaden to include others in the country without authorization and without a criminal record.¹⁴ In fact, the list of people to have social security numbers cancelled included eight minor children.¹⁵ Additionally, the Social Security Administration has also agreed to share personal data with the Department of Homeland Security and Immigration and Customs Enforcement for immigration enforcement purposes. There is an urgent need to obtain records, including communications, criteria, and protocol, regarding the cancelling of social security numbers and sharing of social security data to inform the public about actual or alleged government activity regarding moving immigrants onto the death master file and targeting people for deportation.

Moreover, I certify to be true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief that there is an urgent need to inform the public about the conditions in which immigrants’ social security numbers have been cancelled. Acting Social Security Commissioner Leland Dudek has stated that the decision to move immigrants onto the death master file is intended to “terminate” the “financial lives” of more than 6,300 people.¹⁶ These

actions will have a significant negative impact on immigrant communities, including citizens or other people with legal status, ranging from ineligibility to receive government benefits to the inability to open bank accounts or register in public schools.¹⁷ The public requires the requested information to understand how individuals are selected to have their social security number cancelled or data shared with immigration enforcement authorities, and to confirm whether any citizens have mistakenly had their social security numbers cancelled as part of this effort.

I further certify that American Oversight is primarily engaged in disseminating information to the public. American Oversight's mission is to promote transparency in government, to educate the public about government activities, and to ensure the accountability of government officials. Similar to other organizations that have been found to satisfy the criteria necessary to qualify for expedition,¹⁸ American Oversight "gathers information of potential interest to a segment of the public, uses its editorial skills to turn the raw material into a distinct work, and distributes that work to an audience."¹⁹ American Oversight uses the information gathered, and its analysis of it, to educate the public through reports, press releases, and other media. American Oversight also makes materials it gathers available on its public website and promotes their availability on social media platforms, such as Facebook and Twitter.com.²⁰ As discussed previously, American Oversight has demonstrated its commitment to the public disclosure of documents and creation of editorial content.²¹

Accordingly, American Oversight's request satisfies the criteria for expedition.

Guidance Regarding the Search & Processing of Requested Records

In connection with its request for records, American Oversight provides the following guidance regarding the scope of the records sought and the search and processing of records:

- Please search all locations and systems likely to have responsive records, regardless of format, medium, or physical characteristics.
- In conducting your search, please understand the terms “record,” “document,” and “information” in their broadest sense, to include any written, typed, recorded, graphic, printed, or audio material of any kind.
- Our request for records includes any attachments to those records or other materials enclosed with those records when they were previously transmitted. To the extent that an email is responsive to our request, our request includes all prior messages sent or received in that email chain, as well as any attachments to the email.
- Please search all relevant records or systems containing records regarding agency business. Do not exclude records regarding agency business contained in files, email accounts, or devices in the personal custody of your officials, such as personal email accounts or text messages. Records of official business conducted using unofficial systems or stored outside of official files are subject to the Federal Records Act and FOIA.²² It is not adequate to rely on policies and procedures that require officials to move such information to official systems within a certain period of time; American Oversight has a right to records contained in those files even if material has not yet been moved to official systems or if officials have, by intent or through negligence, failed to meet their obligations.²³
- Please use all tools available to your agency to conduct a complete and efficient search for potentially responsive records. Agencies are subject to government-

wide requirements to manage agency information electronically,²⁴ and many agencies have adopted the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) Capstone program, or similar policies. These systems provide options for searching emails and other electronic records in a manner that is reasonably likely to be more complete than just searching individual custodian files. For example, a custodian may have deleted a responsive email from his or her email program, but your agency's archiving tools may capture that email under Capstone. At the same time, custodian searches are still necessary; agencies may not have direct access to files stored in .PST files, outside of network drives, in paper format, or in personal email accounts.

- In the event some portions of the requested records are properly exempt from disclosure, please disclose any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the requested records. If a request is denied in whole, please state specifically why it is not reasonable to segregate portions of the record for release.
- Please take appropriate steps to ensure that records responsive to this request are not deleted by the agency before the completion of processing for this request. If records potentially responsive to this request are likely to be located on systems where they are subject to potential deletion, including on a scheduled basis, please take steps to prevent that deletion, including, as appropriate, by instituting a litigation hold on those records.

Conclusion

If you have any questions regarding how to construe this request for records or believe that further discussions regarding search and processing would facilitate a more efficient production of records of interest to American Oversight, please do not hesitate to contact American Oversight. American Oversight welcomes an opportunity to discuss its request with you before you undertake your search or incur search or duplication costs. By working together at the outset, American Oversight and your agency can decrease the likelihood of costly and time-consuming litigation in the future.
